

So the Autocross Seminar and Season Opener are both in the record books and I must say they were both very successful. We had twenty-nine students show up for the seminar given by Graham Mingst and myself, who stepped in for John Mingst this year and were treated to all there is to know about autocross and a few bad jokes. The students were eager to soak up all the knowledge and

were interactive, asking questions about anything from what an autocross day was like to car setup. As an added surprise, Barry Lenoble, a Metro NY PCA Past President showed up with his two kids who took the class as well. Barry was also very helpful as he is an experienced driver with the club and was able to impart firsthand knowledge to the students. After the seminar, we all migrated down to Tobay Beach for the driving portion of the day. Each student was greeted by their personal instructor and was taken on a walk around a real autocross course. On this walk, all the elements of the course were explained along with how to spot the driving line. After the course walk the students got to drive the course several times with their own instructor. It was great to watch the students gain confidence and improve with each trip around the course. I'd like to thank the following people for coming down to instruct or help in other ways: Graham Mingst, Jack Minot, Rich Wayne, Todd Roth, Derek McKane, Michael Kane, Spencer Martin, Heidi Ellison, Mitch Hackett, Mark Hill, Thom Moehringer, Don Hocchesier, and guest instructor Barry Lenoble.

The second part of the busy weekend was the Season Opener Autocross. Fifty-nine drivers showed up to enjoy the course used the previous day at the Autocross Mini School. I am happy to say five drivers from the school showed up and I am hoping more will attend in the future. The course was designed by our in-house course designer, Rich Wayne, who masterfully designed a course simple enough for the beginners but challenging enough for those with some experience. The weather, as you would expect at Tobay Beach, was frigid all day, although the sun was out at times so it could have been a lot worse. Each driver got eight runs which is pretty good for a season opener and the day ran smoothly despite

one car breaking down on the course. It took us a while to figure out how to get it off the course but once that was accomplished, we continued along smoothly.

Here are the results:


Tom P started the season off with a win in Class S1 with a time of 48.263 seconds. Class S4 with two drivers found Andre C in first place with a time of 44.475 seconds. Class S5/P2, with two drivers, found Robert Nixon in first place with a time of 45.827 seconds. Three driver deep S3/P3/P4 was taken by Michael K with a time of 42.690 seconds. Mitch H came in a close second with a 43.546 second trip around the course. Class SW8/P65 with three drivers saw Tom Q in first with a time of 42.2440 seconds to beat out the second-place driver, Vaino N. who drove the course in 42.691 seconds. Two-driver S9/P7, was dominated, if you can call winning by .09 seconds dominating, by Anthony H, who took the win with a time of 42.891 seconds.

Class P08, populated with two drivers, both from the Autocross school the day before, was won by Jonathan P with a time of 44.379 seconds. S9, with four drivers and our most competitive class, found Pat S in first place with a time of 38.293 seconds. This was good enough for the FTD (Fastest Time of the Day) and Fastest Pad of the Day. Rick N followed closely and took the second-place spot being .06 seconds slower with a time of 38.954 seconds. Third place went to Alex S with a 41.343 second trip around the course.

Now to our Improved class with four drivers. First place went to Brandon T who drove the course in 40.227 seconds. Second place went to Todd R who drove the course in 41.992 seconds. The third-place spot went to yours truly with a time of 44.827 seconds. In our M class, one driver scared all the others away and Christian S took the win with a time of 43.001 seconds.

Last but certainly not least we have our X-Classes. Seven driver deep X1 was dominated by Richard W who drove the course in 40.616 seconds to beat out co-driver, in her car, Heidi E who took her car around the course in 41.366 seconds. Third place went to Sandro B who drive the course in 42.214 seconds. X2, with fourteen drivers, found Michal M in first with a time of 40.335 seconds. Second place went to Matt C with a time of 41.786 seconds and third went to Erik C with a time of 42.109 seconds.

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

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
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### **Track Ramblings**

#### FRED PACK - CO-CHIEF INSTRUCTOR



I got a very big surprise and a truly great honor when Metro President Bill Rudtner asked me this winter if I would take the position of Metro's Co-Chief DE Instructor. I told Bill that if he could accept that I spend much of my year in Colorado, and so can't attend many of Metro's DE events, then I would be more than thrilled to help him and Metro. He said he could accept that, and so I

have very happily accepted the new position. Bill remains Chief Instructor, as well as Metro President. Being a part of the Metro management means more to me than I can express.

I've been a Metro member for 39 years. I got interested in sports cars when I was about 15 years old and the Porsche 356 seemed to be the car to have. I still remember lusting after one I saw in a parking lot. By the time I was in the position to buy a Porsche, the 944 fit my needs and pocketbook, so I got a new 1985.1 model. It was much faster with its 145hp engine compared to my '79 BMW 320i which had only 95hp, so the P-car was a big improvement. I joined PCA and started doing as many DE events as I could fit into my life, which also included owning and running a business, being married, and having a 4-year old. I remember being stuck in the Blue run group for what seemed like an eternity of years, but I did finally get moved up to White, then to Black.

I used to spend a lot of my time reading books about cars and racing – to the disadvantage of my school work, but to the improvement of my understanding of track driving. I also went to Sebring, Bridgehampton for the USRRC series – those Chaparrals and McLarens were loud and fast but ultimately put in their place by the 1000hp Porsche 917 driven by Mark Donohue, and F1 races in at Watkins Glen, Indy, Canada, and a few in Europe.

Around 1995 I felt that I knew enough to become a PCA DE instructor and Metro agreed. (I got my PCA National Instructor certification in 2007.) In the early 2000s, I approached the Metro POST people about writing a monthly column and they were happy to have me. I've written more than 100 columns since then.

Instructing is a lot of work, and it sure does cut into the free time at a DE event, but it is definitely worthwhile – it is so satisfying to see the joy on the student's face as s/he improves and gets more comfortable on the track. Also, there is a "life cycle" element to the DE program. You start as a novice in the Green run group. You are guided by a series of instructors who years earlier were themselves in the Green Group. If you keep up your involvement with DE, you progress over the years into Yellow, Blue, White, and perhaps even Black. Then, you may get an invitation to become an Instructor, and perhaps you accept this honor. The cycle goes on.

I'm now on my 10th Porsche – '85 944, '89 944S2, '73 914, '84 911, '98 Boxster, '00 Boxster S, '04 GT3, '11 Boxster S, '21 Boxster GTS, '21 Macan S. These cars are so wonderful, and we PCA members are so fortunate to have these superb cars and the comradery of PCA. Absolutely so fortunate.





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






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### More Ramblings from a Mediocre Autocrosser

The 2022 Autocross season is over, and as the 2023 season starts, I want to get out to the members that they need to participate in an autocross at least once. I am 70 years old and autocross as often as I can. If you say that AX is for kids, especially if you are younger than me, then you are missing out on not trying it. The other excuse I always hear is I do not want to hurt my car. I autocross a 43-year-old 911, that I rebuilt, for 13 years and never broke it. I now have a 2002 996 and it is a great autocross car, I love it! Your Porsche was made to be driven. I am a proponent of "Driven not Polished." So, get out and try Autocross and Drivers Ed at least once, I want to caution you, you may get hooked!

I started autocrossing at age 57 and I wish I had started earlier. My first autocross was in 2009 driving my daughter's 1991 Miata with all-season tires, my times were not great, but I was hooked. I was able to get my 1979 911SC running for the 2010 season. My times were better than in the Miata, still not great, but I was having an adrenaline rush after every run. I say I autocross because it is so much fun, but I am just like the next guy, I am competitive. My competition, in the beginning, was from a fellow autocrosser driving a 1984 911 Turbo-look Carrera, Jeff Goldberg. Over the years we joked about the J&J trophy series and would silently check each other's time to see who won each autocross. Jeff sold his Carrera and purchased a 2009 Cayman. He put 100 treadwear tires on his car so we would be in the same class (IO2) and our competition continued.

Jeff took on the Presidency of Metro and then became the Metro Rally Chair and soon he was not a regular autocrosser, but my competition continued. Tom Patrizio driving a Cayman and I started a new competition. Most of the time Tom would win, usually a second to two seconds faster than me. Occasionally I would beat him. Regardless, the fun continued, and I was having a ball!

This last summer a couple of my AX amigos who ran classic air-cooled Porsches, Andre Cerquiera and Michael Kane, announced they were looking for a "Rainy Day Car." A car that they could compete in and not worry if the car got wet in the rain. It got me thinking, I had been working on my 911 for 15 years restoring and backdating it, and it was basically finished. Then came the 2022 Porsche Parade in the Poconos and I was wondering if I would be able to attend in my 911. Would it make it to Pennsylvania, heck would it make it through the Cross Bronx Expressway!!!

The PCA Parade Committee had asked the Metro NY PCA Autocross Chairman to run the timing at the Parade Autocross. The decision on whether to drive my 911 to the Parade was made when I volunteered to transport the timing equipment and assist Dan and Rich in setting up the course and timing equipment. I had to bring my wife's SUV since the equipment would not fit in a 1979 911SC. This was the first Porsche Parade for my wife and me. We arrived Sunday with our small SUV filled with the timing equipment. I had almost forgotten to leave room for our luggage, but we endured. We attended each of the banquets, meeting other Porsche enthusiasts from across the country. Many of them had driven their Porsches to the Parade, I was jealous. Kalahari has a big water park and being a water rat, I had to spend a day on the water slides. I was taken aback when one of the young lifeguards stopped me and asked if I knew how to swim before he would let me on one of the slides. On Tuesday, I left my wife by the side of a pool and went to Pocono Raceway to set up for the autocross. We stayed all day so that after the set up the competitors had time to walk the course. The autocross classes were split and ran on Wednesday and Thursday. The autocross went off smoothly and finished by early afternoon. The Metro NY PCA group was applauded for how well our timing system worked. Road trip to California in 2023?

Porsche had several beautiful cars displayed throughout the convention center. One attracted my attention. It was the 996 that PCA had sent to the Porsche Classic Division to restore. I fell in love with it and my decision was made. My "Rainy Day Car" was going to be a 2002-2004 996.2 6-speed; it was the last of the granny-free cars that Porsche made.

I am not a proponent of owning multiple cars, I feel that if you own multiple cars then some of them get neglected. When I got back to Long Island, I put my backdated 1979 911SC on Craigslist that Wednesday night. A gentleman from Philadelphia called, and we settled on a price. He arrived the next afternoon with cash and picked up the car on Friday morning. I had been monitoring "Bring a Trailer" and saw a 2002 996.2 with 19,000 miles that had just had \$5,000 of preventative maintenance performed at a Pittsburg, Pa Porsche dealer. I woke up at 3:30 am Saturday morning to make sure I was an approved bidder; I submitted a bid and it worked. The auction was scheduled to end at 4:06 pm and at 4:06 I was outbid by \$250, I countered with a \$250 higher bid.


Metro PCA is a wonderful way to get in your car and drive. # Let's Get Technical MATTHEW KAMMET - TECH CHAIR



Last month I gave you all some tips about your Porsches at AutoX events so it's only right I talk about Drivers Education this month. We have a good lineup of events this year and the season is approaching rapidly. It might not be a bad idea to pull those track cars out of hibernation now and bring them to your mechanic to have them inspected.

I like to start the season off assuming I have to completely refresh the car (assuming you're attending more than 5 or 6 events per year). That means an oil change, and a brake fluid flush without question. Many people don't realize brake fluid is hygroscopic meaning it absorbs moisture from the air. Your brake system appears closed but there always remains a little bit of air at the top of the reservoir. Water boils more easily than the brake fluid it's suspended in so when you go to brake hard it will vaporize and give you a squishy pedal. You certainly don't want that at the end of a straight. Yearly maintenance also usually included new transmission gear oil as well. This is particularly important in the newer PDK vehicles as these transmissions run very hot at the track. It's sometimes recommended to even add an additional cooler. You should also bring your PDK Porsche to someone with a certified scanner to have the clutches recalibrated.

The yearly maintenance continues with checking every suspension point in the vehicle. Raise it up, shake the wheels up and down and side to side. If you feel any play or hear any funny noises something needs to be fixed. Often on tracked vehicles people forget if they had any issues while the cars are in storage. Wheel bearings and tie rod ends are notorious for "suddenly being bad" at the beginning of a season when in reality they were stored that way because they weren't looked over prior to being tucked away

Next it's on to the brakes themselves. If my brake pads are near the halfway mark they go in the spares/ emergency box. Less than that, the garbage. Check the rotors. If there's any cracks near the edges they are trash

too. A fresh set of brakes means you can go further into the season with less risk of an issue while at the track.

Next is the wheels and a look inside the fenders. The last few years have been rather convenient for me as I've managed to spend just enough time on the track to go through 1 set of tires. Those get thrown away and new rubber is mounted. Speaking of rubber make sure all the goobers from last season get pulled off your wheels and out of all crevices of the fenders. You'd be surprised where you find that stuff and it adds up fast. Extra weight is time lost. Once all of this stuff is taken care of it gets its alignment touched up. Extreme stresses make things move and on the track small changes can have large effects. If nothing else it gives you the confidence that your car is mechanically its best.

Finally the inspection is completed by checking all the smaller boxes. I have to make sure my harnesses and helmet are not expired. Since mine is a race car, I make sure my kill switch operates properly and put a fresh battery in the fire suppression controller. I also check to make sure all the door and hood latches hold.

Just remember, if you go into the season assuming all of this will need to be done, both you and your wallet will be pleasantly surprised when some of it does not. Have a great season ahead!

Finally, after a back and forth with increases of \$250 I won the auction.

The car arrived and I was in love, it had real heat, air conditioning, and a radio. As I write this, I realize I am older and creature comforts have become a necessity. Jumping into a 1979 911 on a Cold morning to go to autocross was acceptable when I was younger.

The new car is a Base 996.2, 6-speed manual with leather interior and a CD player, no electronic assists. My wife's first comment was "You aren't going to change anything on this car, are you?" I had the exhaust replaced with a sport system, where I can switch between loud and not-so-loud. I found a set of 996 4S BBS wheels and added Michelin Pilot Cup 2 connect tires, a set of 18-inch Fuchs with Conte's for street use, and a Duck Tail like the Porsche Classic 996. Change anything, of course not honey!

I was worried when the first autocross in my new car approached. Was I going to be slower than my old 911? Much to my surprise, I did well and ended up beating my competitor by 6/10th of a second. The car was faster and handled great! I was asked if I missed my 1979 911,

and I said without reservation "No."I guess, if I could not autocross the new car then I would not be enjoying it as much. My second autocross in the 996 was just as good. In the new car, I believe I have overall decreased my times by 2 seconds. But all good things will come to an end. At the last autocross of the year, I lost to my competitor by 39/100s of a second! You done good Tom.

I have already put 1,200 miles on my 996, taking it out east to the wineries and the Lime Rock Historic races over Labor Day weekend. I do not think I did more than 500 miles a year in my older 911. The 996 is not just an autocross car, but it is the autocross that gives me the greatest joy in it.

Please do yourself a favor and come down and try autocrossing. From my previous article, some of the things to remember at an autocross are: look ahead not at the feature you are in, be aggressive when steering the car, braking at a turn will help instead of overdriving a turn, slow in fast out and remember to apply full throttle, not just some throttle. Think how cool it would feel when you tell people you have a Porsche and that you drive it in a sport called Autocross!
