



Track Ramblings

FRED PACK - CO-CHIEF INSTRUCTOR



For this month I have a scattershot of subjects on my mind.

The DE season

The track season is winding down, but Metro still has 2 events this year.

* Lime Rock Connecticut, October 10 has a special ingredient – it is a rare day that loud racecars are permitted on that track.

* Summit Point West Virginia, November 3-4.

West Virginia seems to be very far from our Metro NY region, but from Times Square to Summit Point is just about the same driving time as to Watkins Glen $-4\,\%$ hours. And the Summit Point Main track (there are 2 others in the facility) combines a very long straight – longer even than at Watkins Glen – with some very unusual turns and a particularly twisty section. It is a fascinating track - you should give it a try. Metro goes cold until next Spring, so this is your last chance in 2023 to be on track with Metro. Novices are absolutely welcome. We have a great training program.

In a Spin, both Feet in

I've mentioned this important piece of wisdom a bit recently – the concept that if you spin in a manual transmission car you should engage both the brake and clutch pedals in order to slow the car and to avoid damage to the engine, but I've confessed that I don't understand what happens to the engine in an automatic transmission car (both traditional fluid-coupling and PDK-type) in a spin. I've reached out to a number of automotive experts and have not received any answers. It appears to be a non-trivial question, so I remain puzzled about this. I'll keep digging and will share what I learn.

Formula 1

I feel compelled to say it: Formula 1 has become boring. The combination of Red Bull's technical dominance and Max Verstappen's once-in-a-generation driving excellence has taken the excitement out of the racing. I've been an F1 addict since the 1960s but have mostly stopped watching even though the TV coverage is superb. Near the top of the thrills of my life have been meeting Jimmy Clark, Graham Hill, and Colin Chapman, but I hardly care any more.

I haven't heard much talk about this, but I know that the F1 authorities care – the cost ceilings which were introduced a few years ago were an effort to level the playing field, but so far they haven't had much effect; the tightening and further tightening of the technical rules are an effort to restrict engineering creativity, which should tend to even out the cars' performance, but Red Bull (and a few years back, Mercedes) completely dominate the field. And of course, we do want technical creativity.

Interestingly, F1 is more popular now than ever, largely due to the Drive to Survive show. There are more countries with races than ever, and ticket prices have reached astronomical levels. (How about \$2500+ for a grandstand seat at the Miami F1 event May 2024?) I paid the equivalent of \$6 for my seat at the 1966 British Grand Prix at Brands Hatch.

A book I'm reading

Nazi Billionaires, a just-published book, traces the fortunes made by German industrialists during the Nazi period, and how they were permitted to keep their staggering amounts of ill-gotten money after the war ended. The reason I'm reading it and mention it here is that the Porsche and Piech families are 2nd-tier financial beneficiaries of the Nazi period. We celebrate the marvelous cars they manufacture, but there is a dark side which shouldn't be ignored.



A Beautiful Day at Monticello Motor Club

As a small child living in the small Canadian town of Thorold, my friends and I would race down the street that I grew up on. We paralleled the Welland canal between lock 7 and lock 6 (a 30-foot drop in two blocks). Each of us would line up at the top of the street in our red wagons and to a ready, set go we careened down the hill with no thought to the safety of life or limb. All I remember was feeling the wind in my hair, the pavement racing past, the adrenaline pumping through my system, and the sweet, sweet feeling of victory! A day at Monticello Motor Club felt just like that.

A handful of Metro Members were invited to Monticello by Sean Johnson from Porsche of Brooklyn and Eric Breitman from Porsche Huntington. Monticello Motor Club is a private track in the Catskill Mountains. It's 1.4 miles of 20 unique terms, a mile, 1/2 of straightaway, and 100% smile-inducing fun. We started with a boxed lunch and were introduced to the Porsche Driving Experience instructors. We were off after being paired up with another driver, fitted with a helmet, and advised of the track rules. Our first stop was the 911 grouping (GTS, C4S, and 2 different colors of the 911S-I do think the yellow one was faster). As a Boxster driver, I was thrilled to drive the flagship of Porsche...now I get it! The only way I can truly describe the experience is to say that I felt like the Peter Sellers character in Dr. Strangelove. With a 4.0L flat-six engine, the 911 GT3 achieves up to 500 ps with 338 lb-ft of torque and a top speed of 197 mph, I felt the power of the machine as we warmed up to the first

corner. All I could think about was turning on the apex... breaking at the right moment and hitting that invisible mark with peddle to the medal/need for speed mantra that overrides caution. What surprised me was the quiet in my head that enveloped me. I got into the grove... watched for the cones, picked the line, raced up to the break zone (at 115 mph), turned into the hairpin, felt the quick transfer of weight in the S turn, and listened to the instructor. Nothing else existed.

Next up was a stop at the AutoX track where we were treated to a few laps around the course in the new Taycan S. With 750 hp and 774 pound-feet of torque, the Turbo S. can hit 60 miles per hour in 2.6 seconds flat. A quartermile run for the Turbo S is 10.8 seconds. I can proudly say no cones were sacrificed to the AutoX gods but a few stomachs didn't make it.

We rounded out the day driving the Macan and Cayenne Turbo which were a lot of fun but nothing like their more powerful brothers the 911s.

Thank you again to both Huntington and Brooklyn Porsche and all of you out there... make friends with your dealers; go to their events and next time it might be you writing for the Post with the biggest grin on your face. The little girl who raced against the neighborhood will tell you it was an opportunity not to be missed.

Turn in and have some fun. We are coming to the last few HPDE events for the 2023 season. We have 3 events left: one at NJMP on the lighting track, the second an unmuffled day at Lime Rock, and the final event at Summit Point. The Lime Rock event is closed to green, yellow, and blue run groups. If you have advanced to White, Black, or Red roll out of bed and take

a lazy ride to Lime Rock for 1:00 PM start time. Our other two events are open to all drivers and offer a great time to run in cool weather, on great tracks. These two events offer instructors first-come assignments by registration. If you are planning to go and have any questions on where to stay contact any of the HPDE team for answers.

I like going to NJMP for its closeness to New York and the track is a hoot to drive. It is fast in the turns, has changes in elevation and a decreasing radius turn called the bulb which has a very high bank that will make you smile when you head out onto the front straight. Having 2 days of driving on this track will allow a lot of track time which will also make you smile. Every time you miss a chance to drive on a track is time lost. Seat time is the only way you advance your driving skills.

The last event of this season is Summit Point, which I always have a soft spot in my heart because it was my first track as an instructor. I went to the track after Hurricane Sandy which made everybody unable to get gasoline. I checked New Jersey and they also could not pump gas. In Pennsylvania, you could get all the gas you needed. On my way home from work, my phone was ringing. It was my exwife "I can't believe you're going to teach our daughter how to race!" "I'm not teaching her how to race," I answered. "She's going to participate in a Driver Education event. Don't you remember when the girls were only three months old? We were driving along with

the girls secured in their car seats and I avoided a lifethreatening incident on the highway. You turned to me and said, it's all the Drivers Ed, isn't it? And I said yes it is." Well, she remembered.

I was so excited for Lindsey to be doing her very first Drivers Education. This one was held at Lime Rock Park back in August. Even though I had taught both our daughters Lindsey and Taylor to drive a stick when they first learned to drive neither of the girls drove a stick shift car enough to become proficient at it. Lindsey had driven down from where she now lives in Boston and met me at the Days Inn motel in Great Barrington, Massachusetts. We met up with a few more DE drivers that night and had a fabulous dinner at Industry in Canaan, CT. The ride from Great Barrington to Lime Rock is about 20 minutes. I figured Lindsey would pick up clutching and shifting again in short order on the ride from the motel to the track and she did. She was driving a 2001 Porsche Boxster and couldn't be happier on our way to the track.

Once there Lindsey did everything she was supposed to. After all, you know who was watching. First, she signed in with Adam at the registration table. Then Lindsey cleaned out the car of any loose items as I applied the numbers. She took the car through tech herself (I made sure there was no special treatment). Shortly after that Lindsey was attending the morning driver's meeting.

A short while after the general driver meeting ended the green group drivers (the beginners) attended a Green group classroom. In this green group, there are drivers with no track experience at all to drivers with up to 6-8 days of track experience. Here they learned the basic fundamentals of driving a car on a race track. At any DE

event beginners are always assigned an instructor. This brave person sits in the right seat whenever the Green group driver is on the racetrack. The instructor has a communication system that is used while on track. Paul Devany, Lindsey's assigned instructor, introduced himself to Lindsey and their day together began.

It rained that first day but that was a good thing as it sort of slowed things up a bit. Paul drove the car for the first two laps to show Lindsey the flag station locations and the basic "Drivers line" around the track. He pulled into the hot pit after two laps and they traded places. It was then Lindsey's turn to drive. Like any Green group driver, Lindsey got better and better with each lap and each session. There were 14 green group divers that day. I'm certain they all had a great time. I surely had so much fun just watching Lindsey drive.

The weather was much better that second day. The sun was out and the temperature was just perfect. There were other women driving at the event. Lindsey met Julie Reimann and they immediately bonded. Julie and Lindsey also befriended Danielle Corrao (also a first-time driver). When the event ended Lindsey was figuring when she could do it again. Planning for the next Lime Rock event next year. They say a picture speaks a thousand words. Check it out. We're both looking forward to our next DE together. We, Metro NY region PCA have three DE's remaining for the season. If you've not participated in one yet you owe it to yourself to get out and try it. Drive that Porsche the way it was designed to be driven!
