# From the Editor

I

The Metro NY Autocross program has returned home from the Zone1 Autocross and we held our last local Nassau Coliseum event on September 17. Despite the low attendance, only thirty-five drivers, the event was perfect. Rich Wayne, who has turned into our regular course designer, sorry Rich, designed another amazing course, which as I have stated in previous articles, is not easy to do in

lot 6 at the Nassau Coliseum due to the many bumps that plague the lot. Rich keeps coming up with better and better courses. The weather was amazing and everyone got 11 runs. The event ended much earlier than most and everyone was on the way home by 2:00.

As far as the results are concerned, the competition was close

Andre C took the win in S01 with a time of 40.287 seconds. Newcomer Massimiliano V took the win in S3 with a time of 48.001 seconds. Corinne L, also new this season, took the win in S4 with a time of 46.369 seconds. S5/P2 with two drivers found Todd Roth in first place with a time of 40.372 seconds. And S6/P3/P4 with four drivers found Mitch H in first place with a time of 40.777 seconds. Second place went to Michael K who drove the course in 40.769 seconds and third place went to JoAnn F who drove the course in 42.614 seconds. JoAnn is also pretty new to the sport and has improved greatly this year. S7/ P5 with 2 drivers found Rich W in the first place spot with a time of 43.656 seconds. Six car S8/P6, our largest class this event found Dan F in first place with a time of 40.093 seconds to beat out P's time of 40.734 seconds. Third place went to Vaino N who drove the course in 40.140 seconds. Anthony H took the win in S9/P7 with a 41.734 second run. In our improved class, Brandon T took the win in a blinding 39.102 second run. This was also good enough to earn him the Fastest Time of the Day. Tom P came in second place with a time of 42.415 seconds.

Now for the X-Class. Christine P took the win in X1 with a time of 40.916 seconds. X2 was dominated by Anthony C who drove the course in 39.587 seconds to beat out


second place Danny G who ran the course in 40.595 seconds. Ian R took the third place spot with a time of 41.567 seconds. Don H's time of 420.28 seconds was good enough for the win in six driver X3. Demetrious S found the second place spot in 42.520 seconds to beat out Paul C's third place time of 45.466 seconds.

Our next event will be the Back to Tobay Autocross on October 15th; yes you guessed it, Tobay Beach. This will be a great event for everyone as the Tobay Beach parking lot is bigger than what we use at the coliseum, so the course is longer.

This event will also be the 2023 Metro NY Autocross Runoff where the top ten drivers for the season will compete against each other for the title of Autocrosser of the Year. The ten finalists in point order are, Michael Kane (698), Dan Fishkind (697), Andre Cerquiera (691), Anthony Howell (632), Mitch Hackett (565), Bandon Tasso (552), Todd Roth (485), Vaino Narma(468), Derek McKane (452) and Mark Hill (362).

Our last two events are October 22 and November 5th, both at Tobay Beach. As for next season, we are hoping to start the season off as usual with an Autocross and Mini School which will take place on March 2nd, 2024. This is an Autocross seminar at the Bethpage Community Park, community room, and then an autocross which takes place at Tobay Beach.



## **Track Ramblings**

#### FRED PACK - CO-CHIEF INSTRUCTOR



The 2023 Metro NY PCA track season has ended As Co-Chief Instructor for Metro PCA, my primary responsibility giving is classroom instruction for the Novice and Intermediatelevel drivers. The bad part of this is that I miss quite a few track sessions of my own, but I truly do not mind the loss because I am so glad that I have the opportunity to talk about track driving to groups of people who are

so engaged with the activity.

Everyone who has had their car out on the track can appreciate this sentiment: It is such a thrilling and transformative experience. Interest levels and enthusiasm in the classroom sessions run very high – the students ask many questions and they share their observations and feelings. The experience is nothing like a boring school class, trust me.

The 2023 Metro NY PCA track season will have ended by the time you read this, but it's never too soon to be thinking about the 2024 season. Winter is the best time of the year to have your car worked on because it is the off-season and the shops aren't over-booked already. My feeling is that any car whose driver has graduated from the Green (beginner) group should have track brake fluid and pads installed, and that upgrade is perfectly okay for Green drivers too. (The only downside is that track pads usually squeal – a lot.) If you are a do-it-yourselfer these are easy things to do and you can save a lot of money in the process; otherwise, your shop or Porsche dealer can do the work for you.

If you are planning to attend DE events, you must have a helmet. Metro does have a few loaner helmets, but if you plan to make this a regular activity you should buy a helmet. It must have a SNELL sticker on the inside and be dated 2015 or 2020. The 2015 versions will have been marked down considerably, but they won't be permitted on track after 2024.

An unspoken part of my responsibility is to stimulate participants' natural enthusiasm and I am very happy to do this – after all, I got hooked myself more than 40 years

ago, and each year as winter starts turning to spring I feel the urge to get back on track. It's a natural feeling. Here's an example as detailed by Metro PCA President Bill Rudtner in last month's Metro POST magazine: His daughter Lindsey attended her first HPDE (High Performance Driver Education) event. It was held at Lime Rock in Connecticut. She had a great time and is eager to get on track again. The photos of her beaming in the POST make it clear how excited she is.

THINGS YOU MUST UNDERSTAND BEFORE GOING ON TRACK: FLAGS: Once you are on the track, the only way the world outside your car can communicate with you is by the colored flags which are displayed at the Flag Stations by the corner workers. I won't explain them here since a review of the flags is part of the Green Group classroom schedule.

THE LINE: Unlike in normal street driving, where we stick to our lane (unless we are passing another car), in track driving we intentionally use up the entire width of the road on a path called "the line." This technique makes the turns less sharp and thus permits a higher speed in the corners, which of course we want since the whole idea of driving on a race track is to go as fast as (safely) possible. This concept of 'the line' is thoroughly explained in the classroom sessions.

#### **EVERY TURN HAS THREE KEY POINTS:**

The first one is the "Turn-in" point, where you start steering away from straight ahead. The second point is the "Apex" of the turn, which is on the opposite side of the track from the Turn-in point. The third point is the "track out" point, which is on the same side of the track as the turn-in point. GRIP: Grip is a measure of the tires' ability to keep a car on its intended course through a turn. You may have seen references to a car cornering at ".95g", as an example. That 'g' figure is a measure of the car tire's ability to change direction and still hold onto the pavement. If you exceed the maximum available grip, the car will start sliding or spinning off the pavement.

I'm going to close out this article with a recommendation. Please read Ross Bentley's e-book called "The HPDE First-Timer's Guide." Ross has devoted his career to racing, coaching, and writing books, articles, seminars, and more on the subject of track driving. He really knows his stuff. You can get the book for free from his website.






This is Hawk's Next Road, just west of Pt. Jervis, NY. Most of the route follows a shoreline path along the Delaware River at roughly water level. The most famous part of the drive is this short curvy section with 9 turns known as Hawk's Nest. 



## **Porsche Market Update**

Overall, the Porsche market rebounded from a poor August to the levels we saw in July with a 71% sell-through producing rate. \$31,018,453 off 595 vehicles offered for sale. However, some markets did better than others, as the 992 market continued to soften.

Of the five 992 GT3s to cross the block, three found homes, and not a single unit was bid over \$300,000, including a lone GT3 Touring 6-speed. Winged cars struggled as we saw the lowest bid on record of \$218,000 for a 2022 GT3 6-Speed finished in Paint to Sample Linden Green with a host of CXX options, and only 1,000 miles failed to sell. On the non-GT front, we saw a well-optioned 2022 91 Carrera S Coupe with a 7-speed and sticker of \$167,000 sell for \$151,000, showing that 911s are starting to trade below MSRP more regularly.

Another market that has continued to soften this month is the Boxster Spyder market, with the biggest surprise being a 900-mile 2022 718 Boxster Spyder that sold for \$115,000, making it the lowest sub-1,000-mile Spyder we've seen to date. Following that trend, we saw another sub-1k 718 Spyder fail to sell at a high bid of \$114,500.

964 Carrera RS also had a rough go of it, with a rare Rubystone N/GT example failing to sell at a high bid of \$282,000. Earlier this year, we saw a five-year high for a Rubystone N/GT at \$401,000, so to see this example fall so short was rather disappointing. Adding to the disappointment was another 964 Carrera RS that failed to sell at a high bid of only \$153,000. These no sales were more affected by the quality of the cars offered than an overall market decline, as one had paintwork and no records, and the other had an accident history and was located in Germany.

But it wasn't all doom and gloom as several cars reached twelve-month and five-year highs. At \$127,000, we had a Guards Red 1990 911 Carrera 2 Targa 5-speed achieve a twelve-month high due to its remarkable condition and

only 16,963 miles. We also had another superb Targa reach a five-year high with a 1970 911E Targa with all original paint, original interior, matching numbers, and fully documented mileage hit \$153,000.

The two most surprising sales of the month came from models we don't typically see on these pages. The first was a 1979 928 5-speed refinished in Minerva Blue Metallic over Black leather with Pasha-style seat inserts. The stunning color combination and a recent refurbishment by a marque expert produced a \$100,000 sale, a far cry from the \$30,000 928s we see on our typical auction day. The other was a 1974 914 2.0 in Signal Orange over Brown equipped with the Appearance Group Package, 15" Fuchs alloy wheels, and a Stoddard muffler. This example finished in an interesting color combination and in original condition, brought a new twelve-month high of \$64,000.

While not a terrible month, many markets were still far from their spring numbers. I believe we'll see the new cars continue to soften through the fall and into next year while some of our classic models, like the 356 and 993, start to even out and most likely pop back up come Spring. Only time will tell. Happy bidding.




The Correct Path around the track is called The <u>Racing Line</u>

GRIP:Grip is a measure of the tires' ability to keep a car on its intended course through a turn. You may have seen references to a car cornering at ".95g", as example. That 'g' figure is a measure of the car-tire's ability to change direction and still hold onto the pavement. If you exceed the maximum available grip, the car will start sliding or spinning off the pavement.

## INTRO TO GRIP

- Grip is the ability of the tires to stick to the road and not lose traction
- · The race car driver wants to use all the available grip at all times
- Physics proves that the maximum speed in a corner is proportional to the square root of its radius. [Trust me!] <u>Increase the radius to increase the speed potential</u>.






MAX SPEED (at 1g cornering speed.)

R1 (inside [36']) = 23 mph

R2 (outside) [79']= 34 mph


