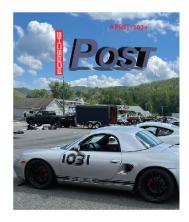

Skid reMarks DAN FISHKIND - AUTOCROSS CHAIR



So, let's start at the beginning. The Autocross Seminar and School were a big success. Eighteen people signed up for the classroom session where information about autocross was disseminated by yours truly and John Mingst. I was pretty much just the opening act whose job it was to get the boring stuff out of the way so John could take it all home with the interesting important

stuff. Each student received a booklet that contained a voucher for a free autocross event.

After the classroom session, we all went to Tobay for the driving portion of the day. Although, upon arriving at the beach it seemed as if it would be the swimming portion of the event. The afternoon started out with the instructors taking the students on a slow ride through the course in their cars. After a few slow laps, they all braved the rain as Don Hochheiser took mostly everyone on a course walk where he imported knowledge of what to look for on the course as well as the suggested driving line. The rain was horrible at this time, and I would have felt better if everyone had on PFDs (Personal Flotation Devices). Anyway, after the course walk, everyone was able to wait in their cars and stay out of the rain. The students were divided into two groups and each student had their own dedicated instructor. Each group got about 45 minutes of driving with their instructor. Despite what you might think, the rain was beneficial for the class as it forced the drivers to be smooth with their inputs as the rain limits traction which increases the chance of losing control of the car. If you can be smooth in the rain, you will be faster when it is dry. Those from the school who attended the autocross the next day know what I am talking about because they were treated to beautiful dry weather which made for better grip and less slip for the cars.

Season Opener Autocross:

As I just mentioned, the weather the next day, for the Season Opener Autocross, was dry and even sunny at times. Rich Wayne designed the course for the autocross school and the plan was to use the same course for the first event but due to flooding on the lot and some surface problems some of the course had to be altered. Forty-five

drivers came out for the opening event and were treated to nine runs. I was happy to see that around five students from the school made it out the next day. The course was challenging as usual but good for the beginners. Due to some dredging going on at the beach, we used a truncated course compared to what we usually use. This made for faster times.

Here are the results:

In class S4 with three drivers, Andre C took the win with a time of 35.105 seconds and Corrine L came in second place driving the course in 38.974 seconds. Manny G took the win in S5 with a time of 39.417 seconds and three driver deep S6 found Jo Anne F dominating with a time of 36.062 seconds to beat out Steve B who drove the course in 39.628 seconds and Michael T took the win in S9 in 34.060 seconds.

In our Production Class, Adam M took the win in P2 with a time of 38.053 seconds and Michal K took the win in P3 with a time of 34.541 seconds. John M dominated two driver P4 with a time of 34.268. P5 with three drivers found course designer Rich W in first with a time of 35.163 seconds to beat out first-time autocrosser Louie A who drove the course in a blinding 373420 seconds. Great job Louie. Dan F took the win in P6 with a time of 34.090 seconds in his two-car class. P7, with three drivers, was dominated by Anthony H who took his car around the course in 35.755 seconds to beat out Jack M who drove the course in 36.982 seconds. Tom P took the win in our Improved class with a time of 36.808 seconds. Our largest Porsche class, the Modified class with four drivers found Russell K in first place with a time of 33,738 seconds. Noah H took the second-place spot with a 34.386 second run and Ben O came in third place in 34.841 seconds

Mikey A dominated the X1 class with five drivers with a time of 34.319 seconds to beat out Daniel S whose 37.758 second run was good enough for second place. Kyle H took the third-place spot in 38.172 seconds. Erick C took the win in eight deriver X2 with a time of 37.938 seconds. Michael M found the second-place spot in 32.493 seconds and Danny G came in third with a 32.763 second trip around the lot. X3 with seven drivers was dominated by Jose A who drove the course in 31.744 seconds.

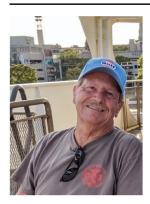

Sure enough, it was on the low end of the scale. I bought a gallon of Porsche-specific pink coolant and added almost a half gallon. I ran the car, checked for leaks, etc. There were none. There was a small amount of scale around the coolant cap (white stuff, technically). I cleaned that up. I should be more prudent about checking the level in the future. Also, tires can lose pressure in cold weather, so in addition to checking your tread depth, check the pressures. Common sense really, but a little diligence goes a long way.

Stay safe out there, and have a great driving season. Take advantage of all the Metro has to offer. It can't hurt, right?

Track Ramblings

FRED PACK - CO-CHIEF INSTRUCTOR



Try it, You'll like it (This article appeared in Panorama June 2023, reprinted with Permission)

Many PCA members participate in the club's Driver Education (DE) track events, but there is a larger portion who don't. Please join the fun at a PCA Driver Education event at a track near you.

Mia Walsh, PCA National Driver Education Chair, and I have been involved in the DE program for five decades, and we tend to focus mostly on the drivers and volunteers at the events. That means we have overlooked the neglected, much larger group—those who have never taken their Porsche to a DE day. If you haven't brought your Porsche to a racetrack, you have been missing one of life's great joys—the fun, excitement of the day, the thrill of driving your wonderful Porsche in this environment, learning about the vehicle dynamics of your car on course, and starting to learn the craft of track driving. Porsche engineers spent years designing these very capable cars; your car was built for track use. Your car wants to be on track. Your car needs to be on track. You need to be on track.

All types of people can enjoy track driving and have a great time. It's understandable that you're nervous when considering taking your precious Porsche (and yourself) onto the track. The DE program is designed to make you comfortable, safe, and happy.

Because it's the off-season for most of North America, now is the time to get yourself and your Porsche ready. Here are some guidelines and advice to create an excellent experience.

DE events are non-competitive You go at your own pace; no one will pass you unless you give them a signal that you are comfortable being passed at that moment. You will be on the track with novices like yourself, some with zero experience, and some with a few more days.

On-track driving is enhanced with in-classroom instruction. You will attend classroom sessions that will

educate you on the basics of track driving. The mantra of every Driver Education event is: "Be Safe. Have Fun. And Learn Something New." We make sure that each of these three areas is fulfilled—you can't do two without the other.

You will not be alone At all times, you will have a trained instructor in the car with you to guide you throughout the event. The instructor will be equipped with a two-way communicator, giving you guidance and verbal cues, and listening to any questions you may have. Yes, you can talk to one another while the roar of the engine reverberates down the track. The instructor also will engage with you off-track in a more relaxed setting to help build your skill set and provide feedback and explanations of the track and your driving skills.

When are DE events and how do you sign up? Each PCA region maintains its own track schedule on its website with information on how to register. You also can find many events listed on the PCA.org website on the Events page as well as in each issue of Pan- orama (see page 116). In all regions, you must register in advance to participate; note that some regions have a prerequisite for participating in a DE event, like a one-day driving clinic or experience in autocrosses or other motorsport education events. Each event has a registration closing day. Events often sell out, so don't wait too long to register.

Metro uses ClubRegistration.Net (https://clubregistration.net/) for their registration platforms. You will need to create an account, including your car information, to register. You also can search these sites for available PCA DE events across North America. Once you have attended PCA track events, when you register for out-of-region events, your track experience will be available for officials to review so they can assign you to an appropriate run group.

Your car Your Porsche is ready to hit the track if it has been properly main- tained. Convertibles have additional rules, which are outlined below.

PCA requires that all DE entrants get their cars "teched" within 30 days of the event. This is a minimal-cost technical inspection provided by local Porsche dealers, or you can have it done by your region's approved independent mechanics. Some regions even hold a free inspection day at a local shop and make a social event out of it.

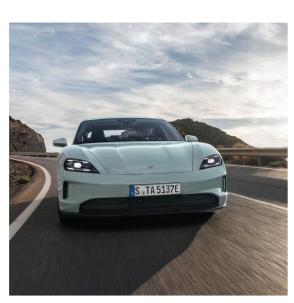

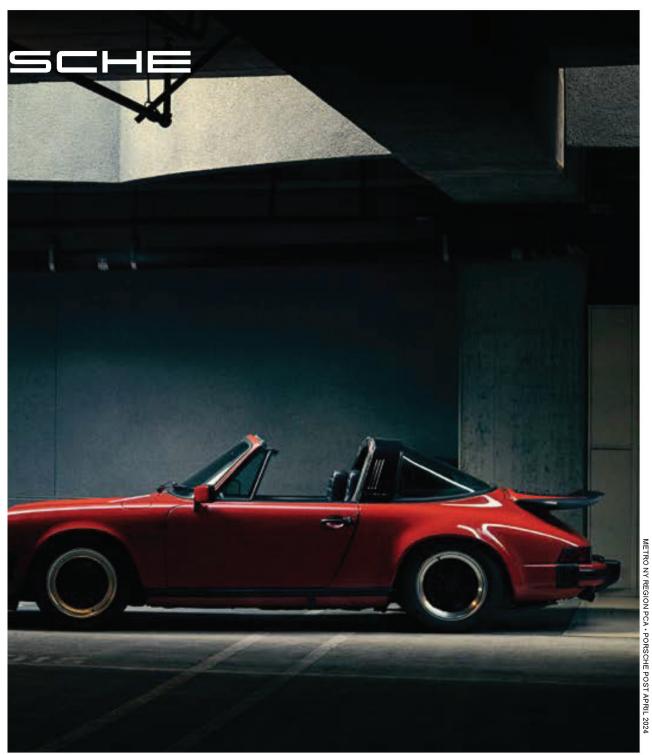

Going to School...Porsche style

The driving season in New York officially started the first weekend in March with Metro NY PCA's AutoX school. I can safely say I have never enjoyed school as much as I did that weekend. AutoX is precision driving. Cones are laid out over a patch of empty asphalt, creating a course of obstacles like slaloms and hairpin turns. The best part is, driving as fast as you and your car can while maintaining control.

Let me tell you what you missed if you could not make it on March 3rd. I want to start by mentioning that Dan Fishkind (AutoX Chair) and his team of volunteers put on a superb program. It was not only informative but entertaining. During the morning classroom session, Dan and fellow enthusiast, John Mingst went through a detailed presentation on everything you would ever need to know, from rules and regulations, safety requirements, course layout, and driver and volunteer expectations. This was my second AutoX school (I auto-crossed in Florida), and I can safely say that I learned more about the sport than I had previously (the handout booklet is a great reference tool).

Now for the driving...the afternoon session at Tobay was WET! A hard-driving rain soaked both the course and the participants (regulars were decked out in rain gear...lesson learned). After slogging around the track to memorize the best lines and my plan of attack, I buckled up, and my instructor, Mark Valera, jumped in the car with sage wisdom... "how lucky you are to learn to AutoX in the rain" (this is a rain or shine sport). Mark and I drove around the track about six times so that I could put into practice all that I had learned that morning. Mark was an excellent teacher: "Faster into this turn, smooth out your steering in the slalom, and widen your angle into that turn." I came away from AutoX School ready to register for the season opener on Sunday, March 4th,

Sunday was dry and sunny... a beautiful and thrilling day it was. That is me in the upper photo, right.

My takeaway is this: they say AutoX is a competitive sport, and it is, but my experience has been that all involved are so supportive and interested in helping grow and develop the sport and that the feeling of camaraderie far exceeds the need to be first. Shaving time off my previous runs

and driving my car to the best of my ability (no cones were killed, but a few went flying) while having fun with a great group of people is what holds the appeal.

Lastly, I would like to thank Dan, the instructors, and the many volunteers for putting on a well-run and inviting program. To anyone sitting on the fence...don't let not knowing anyone or never having done AutoX stop you from trying it; plenty of people want to bring you into the sport and will help you learn the ropes.

Driven for Speed - Novice Perspective

Bills article will resume next month. For this issue, Editor Ed Reiner reflects on his participation in the DE Seminar held on March 10th at South Shore Performance in Freeport.

I have limited track experience. About 25 years ago, I attended the Skip Barber Racing School at Lime Rock

in anticipation of buying a Porsche. It was my intention to understand how to properly drive it and understand the dynamics of high speed driving. The program consisted of some classroom time to discuss the basics (finding the apex, braking zone, smoothing the turns, etc). Then the instructors took us out onto the track in a van and explained "the line" we should try to follow and where is the apex of each turn on the track. After a couple of slow speed laps, we were put into the open wheel cars and led around the track at a slightly faster speed, and then the pace car pulled off the track and we were allowed to drive as fast as we could manage. We were told not to lap each other but to follow the leader and then we would shift positions after each lap to maintain a safe environment. After a couple of hours with a few breaks to rest, I returned home in my (then) Saab 900S. My arms were exhausted and my feet were swollen. Yes, I had a smile on my face the entire ride home. The experience did help my driving.

Five years ago, I had business in Atlanta and took an extra day to run a 911 GTS at the Porsche Experience Center adjacent to the airport. The multifunctional track was a challenge to squeeze in so many activities in 2 hours but I did resurrect some of the skills learned at Skip Barber and it managed to raise the desire to learn more about driving a Porsche. This is truly a "sampler" program and the PEC does a great job (with top notch instructors) to direct and instruct without the expected yelling. My skills were between novice and barely respectable and I had some minor motion sickeness as I settled into the Admirals Club on the way home that afternoon.

Three years ago, Porsche of Larchmont invited me to a track day at Monticello. I had no idea what to expect but I arrived early to study the track, and to acclimate to the hot August weather. I was in a new 911 C4S, following the instructor, with three cars behind me. There was no classroom, but a quick

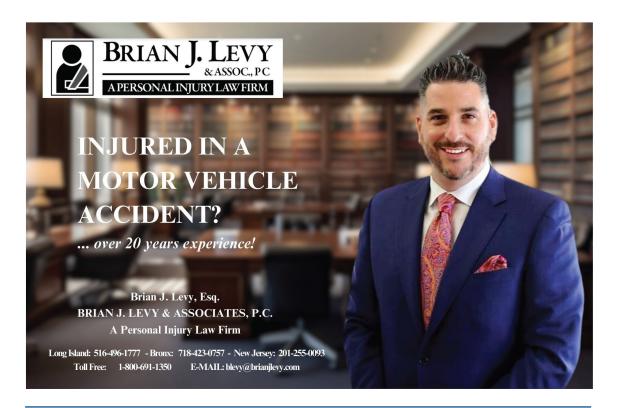
orientation and the walk to the pit area. I jumped into the car behind the instructor and I was instructed to follow CLOSELY. Well, I did quickly glance at the speedo on the straightway and reached 118 mph but the hard braking, sharp curves, "S" turns and elevation changes were new to me. The adreniline was pumping as I navigated the track and tailgating the instructor who was clearly making sure he did not leave me in the dust.

In the pits, I moved to a Macan GTS and drove a few more laps behind the instructor. I thought I did pretty well since the two cars behind me were lagging behind a bit and unable to keep pace in the turns, but could somewhat catch up on the straights.

Fortunately, i was invited back to Monticello by Porsche of Brooklyn this past summer and bumped into quite a few Metroites where we could test our skills (in someone else's car) and have some fun on a beautiful summer day. I think I did pretty well in the 911 and Macan.

Now, Metro decided to fuel the interest in DE by hosting this seminar to introduce members to the DE program. With four experiences under my belt, I thought it was time to look seriously at DE. The seminar was well organized, highly informative and also reduced the anxiety of what to expect. What the seminar turned out to be was actually a training program, learning car control and speed under well-controlled and safe conditions. It is both physics and geometry, understanding curves, angles and momentum. What it is NOT is actually racing. That is a different experience altogether. This seminar taught us how to drive fast, safely and in an environment designed for each skill level. I recall when I described my limited track experience to someone I worked with, she said, "Well, I have a heavy foot!". It is not the same. With sharp turns, long straights, elevation changes and changing radius curves, it is not a trip to the mall. We learned about the physics behind car control, the geometry of angles of turn in, track out, and the ability to smooth out turns so the angles are "softer" for more speed.

The seminar also explained how to make sure your car is safe (brake fluid flush, brake pads, tires) and that we need to get our cars tech inspected by a shop or dealer (see page 50) before you can get on the track. Helmets are required and gloves are a good idea. The most important aspect of the seminar was the fact that our cars are built for this and they are designed and engineered specifically for this purpose. Nothing will happen to the car heading around the track at (what I like to call) ludicrious speed. That is why we bought these cars in the first place, correct? - Editor

PCA National hosted a Tech Tactics Live called "Driving Your Porsche on a Racetrack with PCA." It's available on YouTube and is full of great information.

Bring a blank printed copy of your region's Tech Form (available on the region's website or in its confirmation email) to the inspection and be sure to have the shop fill it out and put its stamp on it. If you haven't had your car recently serviced, items that may require attention include a brake-fluid flush (required at least annually), replacement of brake pads, and possibly an oil change. The shop also will check the wheel bearings and tire tread depth, identify rotor cracks, and inspect various

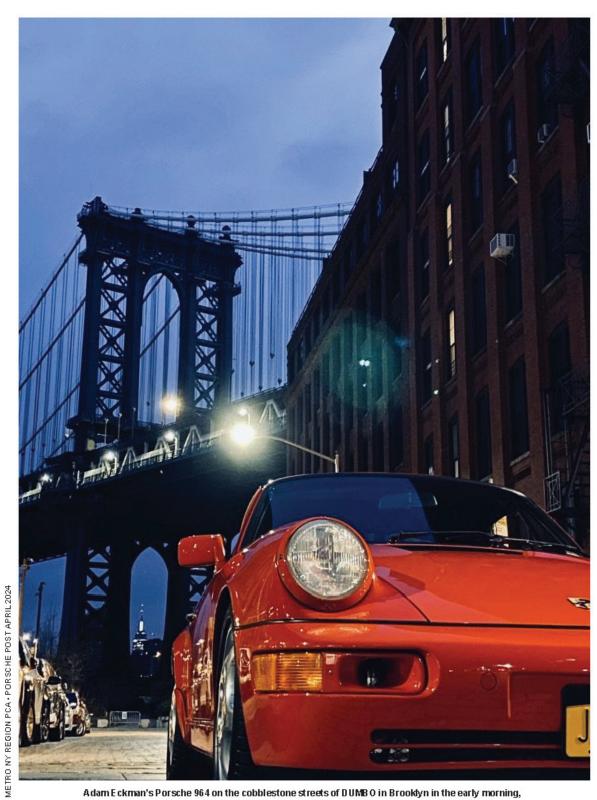
other items detailed specifically for each region. Your Porsche does not need any special parts or alignment or anything else to give you a wonderful track experience. If it's in good shape, it is ready to go.

The exception to your Porsche being track-ready relates to convertibles: Cabrios of 993 or earlier vintage must have a rollbar installed. The 996 and later models have acceptable rollbars, but tall drivers must apply the "broomstick" test to see if their heads stick out above the height of the rollbar. All cabrio drivers must check the rules of the track they are planning to drive on—some

tracks don't allow convertibles. (This article continues next month).

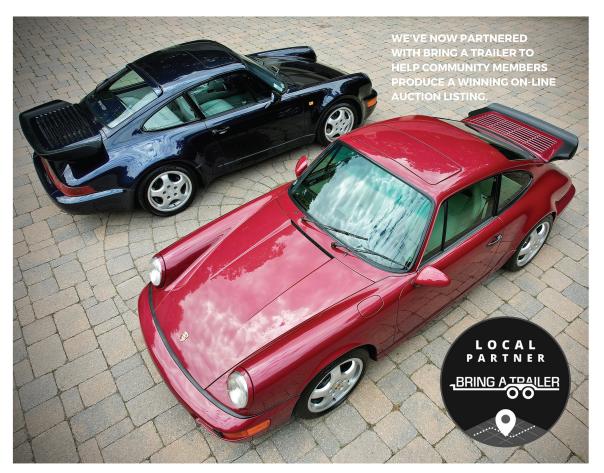

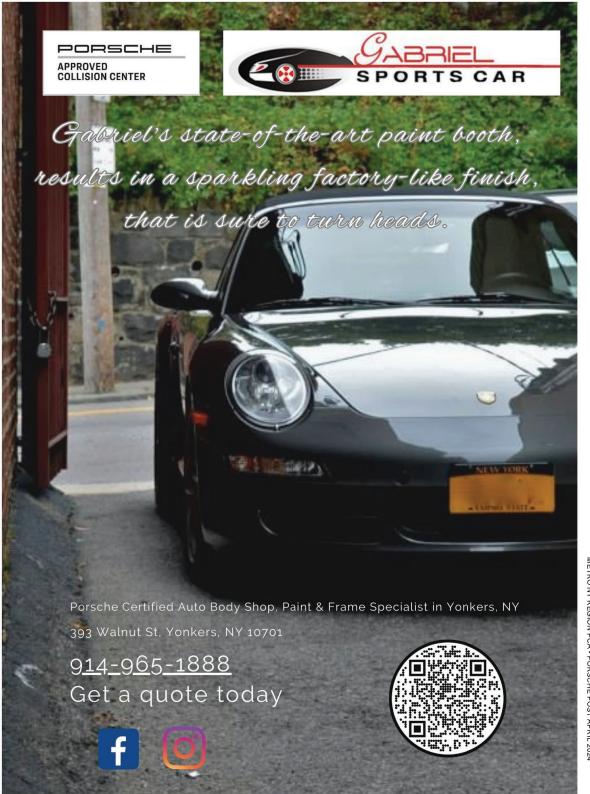

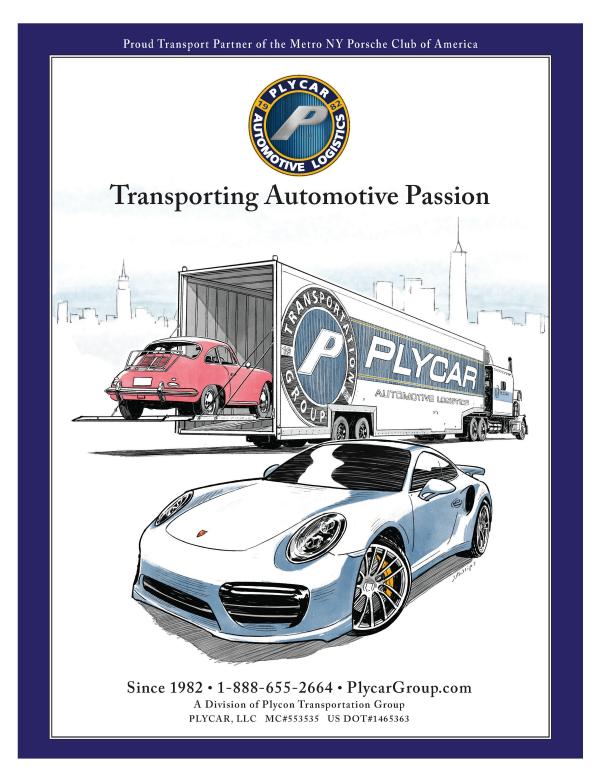

Porsche Market Update

February's Porsche market appeared in line with last month as our sell-through rate stayed at 68% for the second month in a row, but with both unit volume and dollar volume topping last February thanks in part to day one of the Amelia auctions falling on the 29th of the month. Take out the Amelia sales, though, and our dollar volume

fell significantly from the previous year to a total of \$27,750,297 compared to \$33,572,283 in 2023 with unit volume staying relatively the same. That large gap was influenced by the lack of \$500k+ cars offered last month.

Our only million-dollar sale was a 2005 Carrera GT finished in GT Silver Metallic over an Ascot Brown leather interior with 7,000 miles on the odometer. Recent comps have sold in the \$1.3-1.4m range, so why did this one appear to be below market? The fact that this car was missing its luggage set and showed no sign of a recent major service are most likely what kept bidders at bay. The only other car that had the potential to cross the \$1m mark was a 1994 911 Turbo S 3.6 'Package' car that failed to sell at a final bid of \$990,000. With only seventeen units produced, 'Package' cars sport the normal 911 front end as opposed to the Slant Nose that the rest of the world Turbo S' received. Questions about paintwork and lack of service history kept bids below \$1m, where they should have been.

The GT market had a strong month with forty-two cars on offer selling at a 69% sell-through rate and bringing in an impressive \$5.8m. 992 GT3s have settled at an average of \$260,000 while we saw one 992 GT3 RS bring \$400,000, which is the lowest price paid at auction so far here in the US. Every 718 Cayman GT4 found a new home with an average price of \$117,000, right in line with the six-month average.

When it comes to Turbos, the 993 Turbo market has kept on climbing with an average price last month of \$258,000 thanks to a Polar Silver example with only 2,300 miles hammering at a very impressive \$471,050. 964 Turbos

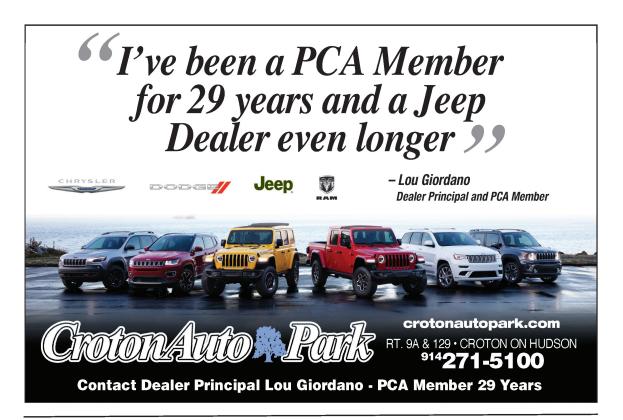
didn't see much action last month with only one out of the two examples on offer finding a home. But the biggest surprise in the Turbo market was the 14% sell-through rate for 992 Turbos. It looks like it's time for sellers to start adjusting their expectations and let these cars go for what they are actually worth.

Mixed results were had at the 356 end of the market as we saw a very impressive result for a 1958 Emory Special Roadster that sold for an eye-watering \$802,000. Starting life as a Coupe, this 356 was converted into a Speedster-look by an earlier owner before Rod Emory, of Emory Motorsports, got ahold of it and added a 550 Spyder-inspired nose and a 2.6-liter flat-four designed by Jeff Gamroth of Rothsport Racing. There are plenty of custom 356s that hit the auction block with average prices just shy of \$250,000. But an Emory build is not your average build, with the top two custom 356 sales of the last five years being Emory Outlaws. Aside from the Emory car, most other 356s seemed to be soft with a sell-through rate below 50% and prices below averages other than a 1955 Pre-A Speedster that hit right on the average at a final bid of \$365,000.

My biggest question leading into March is: will we finally see the return of a seasonal market as we've lacked the swings post the 2020 run-up? March is also the month of Amelia Island, but this year we also have RM Sotheby's down in Miami for their Moda event. For Florida auction coverage, take a look at the Porsche Club of America's YouTube channel where I covered some of the most impressive sales, and no sales, with Vu. Until next month.

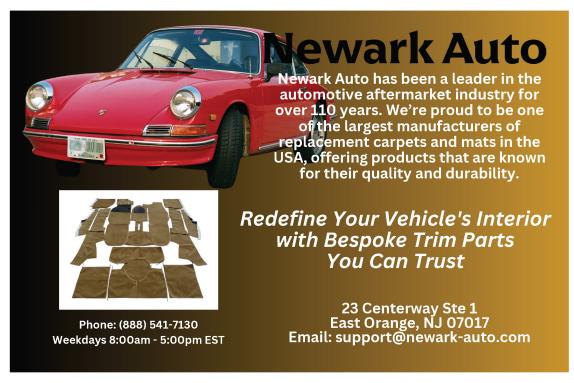

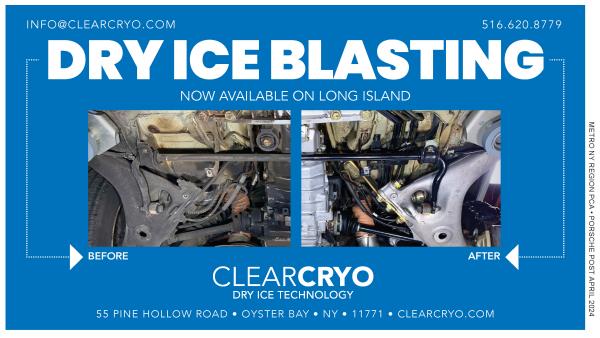
