

I am happy to say events at the Nassau Coliseum have gone surprisingly well. Although the turnout was low for the Fun in the Sun Autocross, everyone was able to get thirteen runs in. This might be record for us. Despite the poor surface, John Mingst designed an amazing course which flowed smoothly (as smoothly as the surface would allow anyway) and was challenging for the

advanced drivers, but straightforward enough for the newer drivers. I think everyone enjoyed it. Thanks John. The weather held out with some threatening sprinkles as the event was starting however, they quickly stopped, and Mother Nature provided a cool and comfortable day for the duration of the event. The sun came out in force toward the end of the event, but we were done and cleaning up which led to a nice award ceremony.

The Fun in the Sun Autocross was attended by 35 drivers and this is how they fared:

Robert N in two driver S2 took the win with a run of 46.865 seconds. In three driver S3, Mitch H came in first with a time of 44.859 seconds to beat out second place Stephen B with a 51.013 second run. Two driver P2, found Nolan M in first place with a time of 48.548 seconds while Andre C took the win in two driver P3 with a time of 44.917 seconds. This time was good enough to earn Andre the Fastest Pax of the Day. Nice job!!! Two driver P6 found Derek M in first place with a time of 44.668 seconds while Spencer M took the win in P8 with a 43.027 second trip around the lot. I2, with two drivers, found Jack M in first place with a time of 46.641 seconds and in I3, also with two drivers, Ioannis K took the first place spot with a 42.504 second run. This was also good enough to earn him the Fastest Time of the Day. Congratulation Ioannis!!!

In our X classes, Graham M took the win in X1 with the time of 44.772 seconds. Dennis G came in a close second with a 45.075 second trip around the lot while Matthew R came in third with a 45.564 second run. Seven driver X2 was dominated by Paul B with a 44.314 second run with John M Jr. coming in a close second with a 44.932 second run. Anthony C took the third place slot with a 45.218 second

run. Our largest class X3, with eight drivers, found Jose Arroyo in first place with a time of 42.935 seconds. Matt K came in a close second with a 43.626 second run and Jonathan W came in third in 44.225 seconds.

We have one more event at the Nassau Coliseum on August 8th and then we head to Massachusetts for the Zone 1 autocross on September 11 and 12. This is an event you do not want to miss. It is a two day event with high speed courses each day on a decommissioned Air Force base. In addition to individual competitions, there will also be a team competition and teams will be set up randomly. Besides the fierce competition it is a great social time as we hang out when we're not driving. There will be a barbeque on Saturday night that everybody attends. Sign up now. 



Track Ramblings

FRED PACK - DE INSTRUCTOR



I loved my Boxster S which I bought new in 2011. Over the years I greatly modified it, making it an excellent track car and quite a good daily driver also. It was just perfect for me. Unfortunately, it had an end-of-life moment at NJMP in late 2019. So, I needed a new Porsche. This new car would be a street-only car because I had decided to get a Miata for the track. During 2019

there were lots of favorable magazine articles about the forthcoming 718 GT4 which stressed what a superb dualuse car the GT4 is, not that I was planning to get one since my Boxster seemed to have a many happy years ahead of it. I accepted the magazines opinions, since in 2004 I had bought a GT3, and it combined quite acceptable street manners with plenty track mojo. (I ultimately sold it to a friend.) After the Boxster was in the graveyard my mind turned back to the new 718 GT4. As I said, the reviews on this new GT4 were uniformly ecstatic, and they complimented its very good street manners. Most importantly to me, it had a 4.0 liter 6-cylinder non-turbo engine. All the non-GT Porsche cars came with turbo engines, which were of less appeal to me and many other enthusiasts.

At that time lots of other people were also interested in the GT4, and my local P-car dealer couldn't get any allocations, nor could others. I finally found a dealer near Chicago who had an allocation, so I ordered from him in November 2019 and paid my deposit, expecting delivery in early spring 2020. Then Covid struck and the factory shut down for months. At about that time Porsche announced that they would shortly be introducing GTS versions of the Cayman and Boxster, and these would a utilize slightly detuned 394hp version of the non-turbo 6-cylinder 414hp engine in the GT4 (and Spyder) rather than the 4-cylinder turbos which were in all the other Caymans/Boxsters. I certainly would have gotten the Boxster GTS instead of the GT4 if it had been available when I ordered my GT4. For one thing, it is a convertible and I love a convertible. For another, it wouldn't be as track-oriented as the GT4, and I wasn't going to be tracking my new P-car anyway.

But I had ordered the GT4 and paid the deposit.

I got my GT4 in late August of 2020. It looked great and it sure had lots of power, as in LOTS of power. And it hugged the road as the saying goes - truly astonishing road handling. But I found that it had downsides: As a Cayman, the engine is in the cabin, and while it is in an enclosed area behind the seats, the GT4 engine makes lots of intrusive noise; The combination of lowered ride height and quite stiff suspension makes for an oftentimes unsettled ride experience; on rough roads the suspension bottoms and emits loud banging noises. To put it plainly, I was getting some uncomfortable vibes about the car. I did keep these mostly to myself, but I was feeling them. And I have heavily modified many of my previous cars and used them as daily drivers - none of them gave me those vibes. The GT4, at least in my opinion, is not suitable as a daily driver. (I should mention that my car came equipped with the Dunlop Sport Maxx Race 2 tires, which ride much rougher than the more standard Michelins.) As a 'drive it to the track for DE events' car, it is beyond excellent.

By late November 2020, my wife and I went to our winter place in Colorado, leaving the GT4 behind in NJ, and to some extent leaving my concerns about the GT4 behind also, although I did often wish that the GTS models had been announced earlier.

We returned to New Jersey in April 2021, and I started driving the GT4 again. It did have very much to recommend it - good looks, incredible handling, tremendous power. But it also had those negatives – always loud engine noise in the cabin, very rough ride, and it wasn't a convertible. The straw that broke my back was when my wife said she wouldn't ride in it ever again, which meant that my ability to drive it would pretty much be limited to picking up the dry cleaning. I phoned the local Porsche dealer. He happened to have a new 6-speed Boxster GTS on hand because its buyer didn't have the money to complete his purchase. This GTS wasn't spec-ed exactly as I would have wanted, but it was near enough, and regular delivery dates for GTS models were months out. They offered me a very good price for the GT4, so I swapped it for a Boxster GTS which I picked up immediately.

and each one did his/her job superbly.



Four Ramblings from a Mediocre Autocrosser

Don't get me wrong I love autocross, but I am probably four seconds slower than my car wants to be. I want to impart in this article not only my love of autocross but that no matter what your level of expertise, if you give it a try you will be hooked, I swear! I urge each and every one of you to partake of the events that Metro NY PCA offers. They are all a learning experience and will help you develop skills and experience the joy of Porsche ownership. Your car is made for our events, don't baby it use if

I joined Metro NY PCA in March 2007 but it took me until 2009 to get involved. I realized I had to go to the club because I couldn't expect them to come to me. I attended the autocross school in 2009, but thought I could only do it in a Porsche. A gentleman across the table at the class said I could do it in any car. I started the 2009 season in my daughter's 1992 Miata on all season tires. I finally got my 1979 911 running towards the end of 2010, and have been running it ever since. Maybe I'll do my next article on my cheap Singer back dated 911 build, it is almost finished!

I met Dan Fishkind in the rain at Tobay at the first autocross of 2009. I told him I wanted three things: to stay on course, to get a time without penalty and that my subsequent times were faster than my first. I wasn't a fast autocrosser (even now) but boy was this fun! The best part was that I had never experienced an adrenaline rush as I did from completing a run and getting back on line at staging. My hands were shaking the whole time I tried to check my tire pressures, it was Nirvana!!! I was hooked, and have been so ever since.

Yes, there were excellent autocrossers but there was also a bunch of us who were just competing against ourselves, trying to have each run a little faster than our last. One of the unique things about autocross is that every course is different from the last one. You may have a course where you feel you did great (relative) and then another where you just can't connect. The trick is to find what parts you did well and which ones you messed up. One trick I developed was to watch the good autocrossers and see where they applied their brakes (by watching their brake lights). Don Hochheiser attempted to assist by jumping in my car and giving me instruction, but I didn't always retain all he imparted. The years went by and I continued to enjoy each and every autocross. I was once asked to design a course because my times were so high that I spent more time on the course than anyone else. I have

designed a Tobay course and a Nassau Coliseum since. The basics are to walk the course and make decisions as you walk, if there is a slalom that has a choice of going left or right make the decision which way to go, decide where you want to brake, where to go fast. When on a run always look ahead at the next feature, not at the one you are in. Your hands (on the steering wheel) will follow your eyes. My lines, how I turn around each cone, aren't that bad, so I am not going to talk about complex items like apexes

My aha moment on improving my times came in 2017 when setting up a course the day before the autocross at Tobay with Henry Hoeh. Henry was the designer of the course and after it was all set up and the cones placed, he took me on a run on the course in my 2000 Tacoma pickup. He went full speed from cone to cone, braked, changed direction, and then floored it! These were lessons that I realized would get me better times.

Please note I am not a top runner so if you are good do your thing, but these items have helped me become less mediocre. The first one is simple, floor the gas pedal when you can, don't just press it, be aggressive go to the floor. The second one is when changing direction tap the brakes, turn and floor the gas. Tap the breaks don't stay on them or slow down too much, and don't coast, get back on the gas, be aggressive. The object of breaking is to move the weight of the car to the front steering wheels, once you have done that and turned, jump on the gas. Another thing I have to keep reminding myself is not to let the car steer where it wants to go, be aggressive with your steering and be aware of where you want to go' hug the cones, just don't go for a Sunday drive. If you hear your tires squealing or you are sliding, you are going too fast. Be critical of your run, check to see if maybe you were too fast in a turn and lost speed. The basic tenant is slow in fast out. At times instead of braking, a lift off the gas before a change in direction transfers the weight of the car to the front tires. Try it both ways to see which works best.

I don't have to be the fastest to enjoy autocrossing but I do try to have my times get lower as the day progresses. I want to show you how my concepts have helped me improve my times during the July 2021 Autocross at Nassau Coliseum. My first four runs were in the 52 second range. ere in the 52 second range.



I was consistent but I needed to break out of that consistency and do better. Another 911SC was running 46 seconds. I thought of what I was doing that needed improvement and then I realized I was staying on the brakes too long. I made a concerted effort to jab my brakes, turn and then gas. My next three times were 50's, but again, I had plateaued, and had to figure out what to change. This is when I recalled an article by Bill Rudtner, in the Porsche Post, where he said he had to remind himself to apply full throttle not just some throttle. I then became aggressive, trying to remember to floor it, when I could, tap breaking and then floor it again. I

hit 49!!!! In the next run my aggression got the better of me when I almost did a 360 but throttled out and saved it with a final time of 52.132. On my last run, I knew that I messed up the start, but I stayed the course and ended up with a 50.052; it could have been another 49, or &#*\$%!

There is a song "I want my dog to live longer" that I love and any dog lover will agree with the context, but I sometimes feel that I want to live longer so I can autocross forever, and spend time with my loving wife.

I haven't had too much opportunity yet to drive the Boxster GTS, but I can say that it is a delight. It has none of the negatives of the GT4 as a daily driver – the noise in the cabin is quite acceptable for a sports car, the ride quality is

infinitely more pleasant than in the GT4. I do miss the GT4's auto-blip feature, but its omission is really minor. I strongly recommend the Boxster and Cayman GTS cars for Porsche fans who want an excellent street or dual-use car.




