



Finally, after a long winter, the 2022 Metro New York Autocross season has begun. We started the season with the annual Autocross Seminar and Mini School which was followed the next day by the 2022 Season Opener Autocross. It was so great to finally start the season after a long winter.

The 2022 Autocross Seminar and Mini School

took place at the Bethpage Community Park ice skating rink. Twenty-four people signed up and attended for a full house. John and Graham Mingst lead the class skillfully, imparting all their autocross knowledge to the new-toautocross members. Everybody was eager to learn and soaked up all the information provided to them. After the classroom session, everybody met down at Tobay Beach to take part in the driving session. Rich Wayne designed a course for the newcomers that was easy to get around and contained all the elements that were spoken about in the classroom session. When they arrived at the beach Don Hochheiser took them on a course walk pointing out all of the elements the course contained as well as discussing the proper driving line. The class was then divided into three groups and everyone got the opportunity to drive the course with their own personal instructor (Thank you to all those that instructed). It was so nice to see everybody improve as they gained confidence and learned the course. Initially, their runs were slow but gradually they got faster and faster as they became more comfortable driving their cars the way they were meant to be driven. The weather was good, fortunately, giving everybody optimal grip, something which would not be present for the autocross the next day. Read on!

The next day, Sunday, was the 2022 Metro New York Season Opener Autocross. Unfortunately, the weather was not ideal however, we did manage to get the event off. Drivers started to show up about 7:30 and prepare their cars for the upcoming competition. The morning ran smoothly as the rain stayed away. Everybody walked the course many times, registered and brought their cars through the tech inspection line. After the drivers meeting, as participants were headed to their cars and workstations, it started to rain. It pretty much rained for

the duration of the event. We used the course from the autocross school the previous day as an incentive for the students to participate on Sunday. It also made the day less intimidating as they would not have to deal with the pressure of learning a new course. Unfortunately, only two students came back to participate however, I am hoping that we will see other students show up in the near future. Although it is a lot of fun to drive in the rain, it is difficult to put down a good time as traction is reduced. Despite the bad weather, the day was fun and we were able to complete the event. Here is how everybody fared.

In S2 with two drivers, Robert N took the win with a time of 56.076 seconds. S3, also with two drivers found Mitch H in first place with a time of 49.927 seconds. This time was also fast enough to earn Mitch the Fastest Pax of the Day Award. Congratulations Mitch! Zach R took the win in S9 in 51.350 seconds and Bob E took the win in P5 with a time of 55.343 seconds. P6 found Dan F at the helm with a time of 53.762 seconds and Ben O took the win in P7 with a time of 51.521 SEC. P8 found Michia R in first place with a 55.801 second run around the parking lot and P9 sawVictor S on top with a 52.526 second run. Jack M took first place in I2 with a time of 56.723 seconds In our X classes, 8 driver X1 was dominated by Graham M who drove his Miata to a 49.627 second victory. Matthew R also in a Miata came in a close second with a 51.254 second run and Rich W took the third place spot with a 51.546 second run, also in a Miata. X2, with twelve drivers, found Anthony H in first place with a time of 48.812 seconds. Brother Barrington H came in right behind him with a 49.794 second run. Eric C found the 3rd place spot with a time of 51.044 seconds. X3, with six drivers was dominated by Jose A with a time of 46.897 seconds. This was the fastest time of the day. Dimetrios S took the second place spot with a 51.962 second run and Evan T found the third place spot with a time of 53.010 seconds.





TRACK RAMBLINGS

FRED PACK - DE INSTRUCTOR



Try A Track Day – Part 3 More about your First Track Day

I want every Metro member who has not participated in a Driver Education (DE) day to do so at least once. If you have never gotten your Porsche onto a race track you are missing out on a great joy, you have no idea of the superb capabilities of your car,

and you will learn skills which are very useful for your everyday driving.

There are some essential points you must know about Your First Track Day which are covered in this series. Please read the earlier partsof this seriesin the last 2 issues of the POST if you haven't already.

This article focuses on passing other cars and being passed. It is very important that you have a good understanding of the passing rulesin advance of the event.

But before we get started, there is a critical step to getting on the track: You must register for the event if you want to participate! The procedure is very simple – Go to https://Clubregistration.net, then login or register, and do an event search on "Metro" to see a listing of all Metro's track events for the year.

<u>Passing</u>

The main reason DE events are so safe is that there are strict passing rules which prevent car-to-car contact. The Prime Directive is that a slower car must let an approaching car pass it — you must not hold up faster traffic. Here are the rules:

1. No passing is permitted unless the car being passed gives a passing signal.

No passing is ever permitted in corners, except for instructors in instructor-only run groups and only if this 'extended passing' has been put into effect at the Drivers' Meeting. This means **you own the turns**. Drivers are often very nervous about "where is that car that was just behind me? Maybe he's going to bang into me during the turn." This is **not** going to happen during a DE event. **You own the turns**.

- 2. All drivers are obligated to look in their rear-view mirrors often, and to give a passing signal to cars which have caught up with them. If a corner is approaching soon, it is ok to delay giving the passing signal until just after the corner. As a courtesy, the car being passed should make it easy for the passing car by lifting off the throttle momentarily and not crowding it as the next corner approaches. This 'courtesy rule' is **very** important.
- 3. The driver of the car being passed gives the passing signal by extending the left arm fully out the window and points with the second finger to the left, meaning "pass me on the left," or bending the left arm and pointing over the roof to the right, meaning "pass me on the right." (Do not rest the arm on the roof; rather it should be a few inches above the roof so that the passing driver sees it clearly).
- 4. The car being passed stays on the racing line. Accordingly, the passing car goes off-line. (Restating this, the car being passed stays on the racing line and does not move to the right or the left do not do that; it is very dangerous: You might collide with the passing car, who quite appropriately expected you to stay on the racing line).
- 5. The driver of the passing car is not obligated to accept a pass invitation if he does not feel comfortable making the pass at that moment. At any given event there may be minor deviations from the above they will be explained at the Drivers Meeting. Pay Attention! It could your car (or you) which gets damaged by failure to heed the rules.

A few notes about safety equipment. After a 1 year extension due to lack of availability, we are finally retiring 2010 spec helmets for DE events. Only 2015 and 2020 spec helmets are allowed for 2022 and beyond. As always we do have some loaner helmets available for first timers and those having trouble finding a newer helmet. And remember other than a helmet; you do not need any other special equipment to participate in Driver Education events. Your car does not need to be modified to participant in our events. It just needs to be in good working order with fresher brakes and no leaks. For those folks who have made upgrades to their car, please remember to follow the PCA national guidelines for safety equipment installation and upkeep. Due to availability issues, PCA is allowing an extra 6 months on the expiration date of aftermarket harnesses. If your harnesses are expiring in the first 6 months of 2022, you have a little time to source replacements. If you have any questionsabout safety equipment or DE in general, please feel free to reach out to me or any other member of the DE team for assistances.

Paul was a big fan of Ted Ohland's and learned the skill it takes to be a good rallyist and rallymaster. Over the years we have been able to attend a few Parade's together but I'll always remember that chance meeting that has led to a long term relationship! Like he said...It's not the car's... It's the people! I couldn't agree more! (Story below).

"I don't know why I have always been attracted to the Porsche marque. No one in my family was a "car person," and I did not grow up around cars. My dad had a '53 Buick and later a few Chevys, but there were no foreign cars to be seen in my neighborhood in Queens, New York when I was a kid. Sometimes, I half-jokingly hypothesize that the allure is due to a genetic mutation!

After I got my driver's license and while I was still in school, German cars creeped into my being when my parents bought me a '69 VW beetle, and later on a VW Golf. The first time I began to receive a regular pay check was at age 27 after I finished medical school, when I started a residency program in a hospital on Long Island. With a steady income and low overhead living at the hospital, I set my sights on my dream car. Every Saturday night I would go to the newsstand, buy the Sunday edition of the New York Times without the news section, and scour the classified ads for Porsches. I put together a notebook with a separate page for each model year, called and inquired about details of the cars listed, and arranged for $\frac{1}{2}$ test drives. I followed the progress of the cars over time and sometimes called to find out how much they sold for when the ad no longer appeared in order to increase my knowledge base.

In early 1982 I found a red painted-to-sample 1979 911SC with 20,000 miles that appeared to have been well maintained. I had the car checked out, negotiated a price of \$25,000, and became a proud Porsche owner! I bought a green steel shed that was erected in my backyard to protect my new purchase from inclement weather; my "rain car" was a 1974 BMW 2002 tii.

I joined the Porsche Club of America in February, 1982,

became a member of the Metro New York Region, and participated in many club events including time trials at Lime Rock Park, as well as time-speed-distance rallyes. The Porsche tag line "it's not just the cars, it's the people" is so true- I have been to a dozen national Porsche Parades and lifelong friends I've made through PCA have loaned me their cars to compete at three of those Parades.


As an intern I had an entire month for vacation, so later that year I jumped into the 911 and drove cross country visiting friends and family, stopping in major cities and national parks; it was an unforgettable trip! In 1984, I drove cross country again, but this time it was a one-way trip as I was continuing my medical training in Los Angeles.

Southern California afforded many opportunities to drive race tracks and over the years my garage queen morphed into a track-only race car. I got my club racing license through PCA as well as other clubs, and have driven "the red car" on over 20 tracks around the country including the grand prix track at the Circuit of the Americas in Austin, Texas. I have tried several different engine sizes including a 3.6 liter version, but I have ultimately settled on the 3.2 liter motor that is in the car now; the odometer shows over 360,000 miles. After my last event at Auto Club Speedway in Fontana, I decided to retire the red car from track driving and I bought 2004 911 Cup car with power steering which will be a bit easier to manage. However, the red car and I have been together for almost 40 years through thick and thin, and I cannot part with her. I will therefore find the windows, the turn signals, and the exhaust system and convert her back to a street car...watch for her at upcoming PCA events and give us a thumbs up!"

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

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




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
