




Julia & Brian Finn win first place in their class at the Concours at Pindar in their 2005 Porsche Carrera GT.

Skid reMarks

DAN FISHKIND - AUTOCROSS CHAIRMAN



I hate to always be talking about the weather, but it plays such a significant part in the autocross program. I'm beginning to learn that lately, autocross is synonymous with bad weather. One of the nice things about moving away from Tobay Beach onto the mainland is the weather is much nicer, you would think. This brings me to our last event, the April Showers Autocross, at the

Nassau Coliseum. As I got up that morning, I faced my usual, decision...shorts or no shorts? For you wise guys out there, no shorts implies I am putting on long pants. I checked the weather as I usually do and found it will be in the high 50's. With sun, that temperature and no wind it could be pretty comfortable. However, due to my older age and being more mature I decided to err on the side of caution and put on long pants, slapped on a t-shirt, grabbed a sweatshirt, just in case, and headed to the Nassau Coliseum ready to enjoy the non-Tobay Beach warm weather. On the way out I looked at my Tobay Weather backpack which has various sets of hats, gloves, neck warmers, earmuffs and glove warmers and said to myself, "Naaaah, I'm going to the Nassau Coliseum!" Big mistake. The day started out cold and got windier and colder. I was plagued with the task of doing timing and froze the whole day. Lesson learned; you can never have too much clothing. Weather wise the day was miserable but Autocross wise is another story.

Rich Wayne came through again and set up an amazing course the morning of the event. He managed the impossible and avoided most of the bad terrain that is inherent in the Nassau Coliseum lot. Forty-seven drivers came to test their skill against others while striving for their personal best. Everyone had a good time and improved as the day went on. Here are the results of the "April Showers Autocross".

Class S3, found John D in first place in his Macan with a time of 71.136. This was John's first autocross, and he did a great job. Hope to see you come back John. S4 was taken by veteran autocrosser John M in his Boxster with a time of 53.331 seconds. Tom P was the dominant force in five-driver S5 with a 59.107 second run around

the lot in his Cayman with Manny G a close second with a 59.954 second run in his Boxster S. Richard E drove his 911 Carrera for the win in 58.728 seconds in S7. S8, with 5 drivers was taken by yours truly, Dan F, with a time of 52.826 seconds to beat out Tom Q who drove the course in 53.961 seconds in his Cayman. Vaino N came in a close third with a time of 54.247 seconds in his Boxster Spyder.

Michael K drove his 911SC for the win in 52.660 seconds in P3 while Anthony R took the P5 win in his 64.011 second Cayman. Mark H drove his Cayman S for the win in P6 with a time of 55.391 seconds and Brandon T took the win in P8 with a time of 50.801 seconds in his 911GTS. P8 found Jonathan S in first with a time of 57.946 seconds in his 996 C4S while Randy T took the win in P9 with a time of 58.878 seconds driving his GT4. In our improved classes Andre C drove the course in 53.561 in his 914 for the first-place spot while Jack M's 911SC drove the course in 57.745 in I2 for the win. And yes, Jack was in the car. Tom P took first place in I3 with a time of 54.933 seconds in his Cayman S.

Graham M took the win in seven driver deep X1 in his Miata with a time of 50.543 seconds. Course designer Rich W took the second-place spot, also in a Miata with a time of 51.458 seconds and Matthew R took the third-place spot, also in a Miata with a time of 51.645 seconds. "Me ought a" (Miata) get me one of those. A BRZ took the first-place spot in X2 with seven drivers, driven by Michael M. Anthony H and his M3 drove the course in 52.208 seconds for the second-place spot and Eric C came in third in 53.945 seconds. Lastly, X3 with nine drivers was dominated by Jose A who drove the course in his STi in 50.412 seconds for the win. Second place went to Ron F in his M235i with a time of 54.095 seconds and Barrington H took the third-place spot in his M3 with a time of 54.516 seconds.

Our next event will be on a Saturday, May 21st which will have happened by the time you get this issue. After that will be June 5th, July 17th, and August 7th. Please see the flyer in this issue for the rest of the 2022 season autocross dates. We also have the Zone 1 autocross which will be in Ayer Massachusetts on August 27th and 28th. This is a fun two-day event on a high-speed autocross course designed on a decommissioned air force base. It is loads of fun with great competition and has a great social component. More to come in future issues. Stay tuned.


BILL RIEHL - TREK CHAIR

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Track Ramblings

FRED PACK - DE INSTRUCTOR



As I write this, I am just back from a two-day non-PCA event at Watkins Glen. I made some observations that I would like to share with my readers.

The first point is about cold tires. At the driver's meeting it was stressed - as it almost always is - to not drive the first laps too fast, particularly if the temperature is low. The tires won't have warmed up fully

and there won't be full grip yet. Everybody heeded that advice in the morning, and all was well. Unfortunately, one driver forgot the lesson after lunch and crashed head-on into a barrier on his out-lap. His tires had been sitting for almost 2 hours since his last session and had cooled off. He didn't break any bones but was seriously bruised and was briefly hospitalized. Always give your tires at least a lap to warm up!!

On a related note, you should get track-day insurance for your car. Accidents do happen, and your regular insurance will not pay a claim based on a track incident. There are a number of companies selling these policies and they advertise in the Panorama. Another thought: don't eat a big lunch. The high G-forces can lead to unpleasantness.

A guy in the intermediate group with a 2018 GT3, asked me if I would coach him, and I said that I'd be happy to do that. We went out together for one session. He drove confidently and competently and of course, the car was very fast. I sat silently for a few laps just observing and then I started giving him suggestions. The first thing I pointed out to him was that he generally didn't use the entire width of the track. His track-out was good but typically he was not at the edge of the track for the turnin. When I explained that to him, he was really surprised — he thought he was at the edge, but in reality, he was quite far from the edge. The next thing I commented on is that he seemed to wait until arriving at the apex before applying any throttle. My final observation was that in many of the turns I felt a significant G-force, but on some of them -specifically the outer loop and the toe of the boot -my butt-meter was telling me the G-force was much less. He had data acquisition in the car, so I asked him to review it and tell me what it said. I saw him later

in the day and he told me that on many of the turns he was exceeding 1.3G, but in the two turns I had mentioned earlier he was less than .9G. He was very surprised at those findings and said he would work on improving in those areas.

So, what are the lessons here? One of them is that you can't rely on yourself to be your own judge. Another one is that data acquisition is very valuable. Personally, I bought a Garmin Catalyst as soon as it came out. It seemed like the perfect tool to put in your car, and it provides you with lots of usable information, Plus, the lady who's inside it even talks to you while you're driving - she tells your lap time when you cross start-finish, and other things like "push" or "Apex later "or "nice job" while you're driving. (When she tells me to "push", I usually reply "I'm pushing, I'm pushing.") Back in the pits there's a great deal of data presented to you in a clear visual manner. Over the years in these articles I've mentioned an absolutely nocost data tool that is already in your car: the tachometer or speedometer. Simply find a landmark at the exit of important turns and note your revs or speed when you cross it. Use that as a benchmark and try to improve it. (I often use the end of the painted curbing at track-out, or the start-finish line.)

As for my own driving, I was in my 2019 182 horsepower Mazda Miata. It was only my second event for the season and I felt rusty but I put together a number of 2:24 laps the first day, and I felt good.

On the second day to my dismay my lap times in the first session were mostly around 2:30, which was very depressing. Six seconds is a lot of time to find. Back in the pits I studied my data and I thought deeply about what was I not doing on Day two that I clearly had been doing successfully on Day one. I focused on two aspects. Priority number one was to brake later and harder, coupled with less or no coasting. Priority number two would be making a conscious effort to get on the throttle earlier in the turn. Each of these is psychologically very difficult for me, so I would have to fight my own instincts, but I did what I could. To my very pleased astonishment, the lady told me I did 2:25, 2:24 and finally 2:23.

There are lessons in these stories. It's very hard to improve if you don't know what your weaknesses are.

While setting up the rally I was very concerned I made



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

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






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North Region Update



The Driver Education season is in full bloom with two events down and six more events ahead. Metro NY PCA has one of the most extensive offerings of DE events in all of PCA. We hold more events and at a greater variety of tracks than any other PCA region. I hope you already joined us at NJMP or Pocono earlier this year. At those events our new DE registrar, Adam Fox, did an

excellent job getting everyone signed up and checked in for our events. Marc Miller once again stepped up to help our DE program by volunteering as our chief instructor at the NJMP event. And Ray Bayh did the same at our Pocono event to help lead our instructor corp. Big thanks to Adam, Marc, Ray and the whole DE team for two excellent, fun events!

Coming up next on our DE calendar in mid June is our first of two events planned at Watkins Glen International, located in the beautiful, Finger Lakes region of New York. WGI has one of the best track layouts in the country, if not the world, with its multiple bind corners and endless elevation changes. Add in a quaint town nestled at the base of a gorgeous mountain lake and you have the makings of a great destination event. Later in June following on the heels of our WGI event, we'll return to the NJMP Thunderbolt track for our second visit of the season. T-bolt is a modern track design with good safety margins and a challenging, 5-turn octopus complex that takes a ton of practice to master. Rumor has it that a 2-time, Metro NY region president and a past Zone 1 rep will both be joining us at NJMP, so please come out to play with us as we welcome back some of our old Porsche club friends. Also a reminder that you are not limited to only drive Porsches at our DE events. Any (lesser) car in good mechanical condition can run with us at a Metro DE event.

If you're a DE fan and a Porsche owner, you're likely a race fan as well. Learning the intricacies of performance driving at DE events will give you a deeper appreciation for the challenges of road racing. As a racing fanatic, the 2022 pro racing season has seen a bunch of changes to the rules for some of the sanctioning bodies that have produced some great early season battles around the

world. Both Formula 1 and NASCAR had significant rules changes for their cars in 2022 with both series adopting 18" wheels and ground effect aerodynamics (i.e., rear diffusers) to allow cars to follow more closely together. And these rules changes have shaken up the running order in both organizations. Who knew F1 and NASCAR have so much in common? NASCAR took things a step further in the rules change department adding an independent rear suspension, sequential gear box, composite bodies, and center lock wheels to their car specification. So basically, stock cars have finally moved their technology forward to about the year 2000? And new for F1 after an amazing spectator turnout at Circuit of the Americas last year, F1 is adding Miami Beach to the race calendar this year and a 3rd race in the states for 2023 at Las Vegas.

Road racing in the US (i.e., IMSA) saw a major change with the elimination of the GT Le Mans class cars in favor of the standardized FIA GT3 spec cars, albeit with differing driver line-ups. For this season, we have the GTD Pro class featuring all professional drivers in the cars, while the GTD class includes a mix of pro and gentleman drivers, the latter who make their living outside of the race track. With the cars being identical across both classes, race fans have enjoyed larger fields and extremely closer racing in the young season.

Lastly, the month of May means one thing for true race fans, the triple header Sunday of Memorial Day weekend with F1 Monaco in the morning, the Indy 500 in the afternoon and the Coca-Cola 600 at night. If you follow the Indy car series, you'll know that Jimmy Johnson of NASCAR fame was a rookie driver in Indy car last year. But he only ran in the road course events, skipping the oval tracks, which turned out to be a real challenge. The 7-time NASCAR champ struggled to get up to speed in a completely different type of car while simultaneously having to learn many new tracks where he had little to no prior experience. But this year with some experience under his belt, JJ will be running a full season including all the familiar oval tracks where he has a wealth of experience albeit in a stock car chassis. Watch for Jimmy to have a strong showing at the brickyard this year and eniov the triple header day!

Driven for Speed

BILL RUDTNER - CHIEF DE INSTRUCTOR



Well, you know what they say? You make your plans and God, while laughing, throws you a curveball.

I think any racer entering a race plans to win the race as I planned to do at the last Lime Rock PCA club race. We all try our hardest. Sometimes thoughts get in our heads that either hamper or help us in our efforts to be first across

the finish line. Prior to this year's Lime RockPCA club race a friend of mine crashed coming through turn seven (the downhill turn onto the front straight-away). I didn't see it happen but I heard third hand. The car was totaled. Luckily my friend was not hurt. He was coming down the hill going through turn seven and onto the front straightway when it occurred. The thought of my friend's crash occupied way too much space in my head during that first practice day to start the weekend of the PCA Lime Rock club race.

My new to me Wienckowski SPB #2 car was doing great at Lime Rock. She was handling just fine. She had the power of any other SPB. That is all of 205 HP :- 0. But It did take me a little bit of time to get back in the rhythm. Racing an SPB car is all about carrying the speed and not braking. Or...braking as little as possible. If you over slow the car all is lost. In racing, we know that you cannot make up with the throttle what you take away with the brake. In a low-powered car like an SPB classed Boxster this is exacerbated. Coming down the hill in a Spec (SPB) tap the brake pedal and you might keep up with the Spec in front of you. Brake too much and you'll lose ground. Hold your breath, breeze over the brake pedal with your foot but don't touch it. Get back on the throttle before the apex and you might just get a run on the car ahead of you and pass the car before Big Bend.

Also working against me at the LR race this year was the fact that this race was my first race of the season. Usually by the April Lime Rock race I have two or three early season races under my belt already but not this year. I took me a bit longer than usual to get up to speed. I gradually moved up the grid race after race. During the third race I was in forth position gaining 2 seconds a lap on the car in front

of me. The race was black flagged due to a car stuck directly in front of the flag station entering "no name". This was the place of a few crashes over the racing weekend so I guess they weren't taking any chances. The race ended under that black flag. I finished 7th in the first race, 4th in the third race and 5th in the third race.



Crewmen consisted of Brian McGrath, Otis Holman, Eduardo Galan, Nilsen "Tito' Turcios and Rosaly Agosto.



Both Artimus "Art" Tsang and Eric Liu both competed in their very first PCA club race. Art and Eric are best of friends and both raced in the very competitive GTB1 class.




