

First off, I would like to thank Jack Minot, and Rich Wayne for volunteering their time to help run the 2022 Parade Autocross at the Pocono Raceway. As with all local events, Jack does and did more than you can imagine. For the parade autocross, he had to haul all our equipment to Pocono Raceway, set it up, take it down, set it up, take it down again and haul it home. Nobody knows what Jack does until he is

not around and then you realize because things are not done. This is definitely not a dig at the other volunteers that help at our local events, as everybody pitches in and does an incredible job, but Jack seems to take on so much by himself that when he is not there he's missed. He is really the backbone of the Metro New York autocross program, and I am sure everyone will agree. Rich Wayne also came and did what he does best; he designed the Parade Autocross course on one of the infield tracks of the Pocono Raceway. The course was fast, challenging for the experts, but straightforward enough for the novices. We even had some first-timers. I would like to mention and thank the following Metro NY Members for taking the trek and participating in the Parade Autocross. Don and Barbara Coburn both trophied, Don came in third in his class and Barbara won her single car class, Charles Mekeel who came in Seventh in his class and John Dunne, who came in third in his class. Thanks for coming.

Now back to our local events. It is nice to finally report some warm weather at a Metro New York Autocross. The event was met with clear skies and warm weather. It was finally necessary to use our Metro New York PCA tent to protect us from the sun. Rich Wayne once again designed a beautiful course using more of the lot than our previous event. Rich has a knack for avoiding all the bad terrain on the surface.

Forty-four drivers showed up for the pleasant weather and great course and this is how they fared. S4 found John M in first place with a time of 55.974 seconds. This time was good enough for Fastest Pax of the Day congratulations! S5 with two drivers found Robert Nixon in first place with a time of 57.006 seconds. Mitch H took the first place win

in S6, a solo driver class. Dan F dominated the P6 class, with three drivers, with a time of 57.417 seconds and Marc H took the second place spot with a time of 57.944 seconds. Returning autocrosser are Adam R took the first place spot in P8 with a time of 59.795 seconds while Jack M took the win in I2 with a time of 60.881 seconds. Tom P took the win in I3 with a time of 58.747 seconds.

In our non-Porsche classes, X1, with nine drivers, found Rich W at the helm with a time of 54.724 seconds with Graham M a close second with a time of 54.943 seconds. Heidi E took the third place spot with a 55.845 second run around the lot. Our largest class of X2, with fifteen drivers, found John M in first place with a time of 54.386 seconds while Mike M took the second place spot with a 54.449 second run. Simon Y took the third place spot with a time of 54.919 seconds.X3 found Jose A in first place with a 53.80 second run around the lot. This was fast enough for the fastest time of the day award. Congratulations Jose. Jonathan W took the second place spot with a time of 54.890 seconds while Theodore C took the third place spot with a time of 56.231 seconds.

That's it for our June events. Our next event will be July 17thalso at the Nassau Coliseum. August finds us at the Nassau Coliseum on the 7thand then you can find us at the Zone One Autocross in Ayer Massachusetts on August 27thand 28th. The Zone One Autocross is open to all members. For those of you who are not aware, the Metro NY Region is part of another region, Zone One, which spans from New York to Northern Canada. Autocrosserscome from all of Zone 1 to compete for two days. Each day is a different high speed course. This is the best event of the season as the surface is amazing and the courses are quite different than our local course as they are set up on a decommissioned Air Force runway. It is loads of fun, competitive and social, as when we are not autocrossing, we all hang out and have a great time together. This is also a metro points event, so it does count toward the runoff however, it is fun for everyone. Alongside of the competition there is also a team competition where all participants are broken up into teams and in addition to trophies being awarded per each class, and trophies are also awarded for the team that comes in first. 

Brakes are part of the Steering system???

It turns out that, yes, the brakes can be used to help steer the car.

In 1964 Jimmy Clark, the Scottish Formula 1 ace, wrote in Jim Clark at the Wheel, "most people run deep into a corner before turning the wheels to go round. In this way you can complete all your braking

in a straight line, as everyone recommends you do, before setting the car for the corner; but I prefer to cut into the corner early and even with my brakes still on to set up the car earlier." This was decades before anyone was using data to analyze track driving. His brilliance intuited concepts which nobody else could. Years later Mario Andretti also figured out the concept and said, "It is amazing how many drivers, even at the Formula One level, think that the brakes are for slowing the car down." They were referring to **Trail Braking.**

We are all familiar with the word "trail," as in a path in the forest, but it has another meaning, as in to lessen. "The sound trailed off as I walked further away."

Most of us were taught to brake in a straight line, then turn and apply throttle as we exit the turn. The trouble with this method is that there is a period when we are not using the maximum grip that our tires can provide – these moments occur between our end of braking and getting the car up to maximum cornering ability. During those moments we are not at the fastest speed our car can deliver, and this affects our minimum speed in the corner, which in turn affects our maximum speed down the next straight.

In successful trail braking, we brake later than usual – already giving us a better possible lap time because we've been on the throttle longer. The reason we can brake later is that we will still be on the brakes well into the turn. Towards the end of our braking zone, we begin to turn, even though we still need to slow down some more. This braking puts more weight on the front wheels, giving them more grip and allowing a faster speed at corner entry. It also puts less weight on the rear wheels

which gives them less grip. A good driver can use that less grip to provoke some oversteer and "set up the car earlier," as Jimmy Clark said, getting the car pointed to the apex earlier and allowing throttle application sooner. Even the less skilled driver can use that extra front-end grip to be faster approaching the apex than he could in the "brake straight" method.

Learning how to do this is not easy. I have become comfortable braking well past corner entry, but I am not good yet at moving my brake initiation point much later, so I am not yet getting full advantage of the method. In fact, if you continue to start braking at the same point you are accustomed to and also trail brake, you will no doubt overbrake and go through the comer more slowly than before, making your lap times even worse.

This is not an easy technique to master, but worth the effort to learn.



Be On Time

JEFF GOLDBERG - RALLY CHAIR



History tells us that in the early 1950's car clubs were formed to provide enthusiasts venues to enjoy their cars with likeminded people. Rallies, Gymkhanas/ Autocross and events at race tracks were very popular activities.

The most common type of rally was a Time-Speed-Distance (or TSD). The Rally Master would create a route.

Hidden along the route he would set a checkpoint and determine the exact time participants needed to pass this location.

A rally team must consist of a Driver and a Navigator. The Driver's job is to drive and help the Navigator look for landmarks and clues. The Navigator must read the route instruction while looking for clues and calculating their speed to determine the time to the next checkpoint.

In the simplest terms the formula is:
60 x Distance to Travel = # of minutes to checkpoint
Designated Speed

Example: Distance to Travel = 3.767 miles
Designated Speed = 30 mph
60 x 3.67 = 226.02
226.02 / 30 = 7.534 minutes

It should take 7.534 minutes to arrive at the checkpoint for this example.

Route Instruction will not be a simple start and instructions to the checkpoint. Rather the rally consists of a number of sections of various distances within the rally. Each section can be treated as a separate rally with a specified start time and finish time. Within the section there will be route directions, speed changes and often a photo clue where the team must change their speed a certain number of miles after passing the item in the photo. Careful attention must be paid to the directions, speed, distance traveled and landmarks. The Rally Master will provide the mileage from the section start to most instructions. This helps the team know if they are on route or lost. It also helps the Navigator in their calculations.

There are many websites available to obtain more

detailed explanations.


TSD Rallies are extremely challenging if done competitively. Often first timers will not attempt to calculate times but rather get a feel for rallying by following the route and enjoying the drive.

Metro NY PCA offers the Snowflake Rally in January/ February as our only TSD rally. The Snowflake has been run every year since 1957 and has attracted Rally experts from all over the Northeast. In year's past the Snowflake was approximately 150 miles consisting of a lunch break and finish for dinner. Current Snowflake Rallies are much shorter, usually ending in time for a late lunch.

All types of cars are invited so if you do not want to expose your Porsche to winter roads feel free to bring your SUV or other car. Other rallies hosted by Metro during the year will be gimmick rallies. Calculations and checkpoints are not part of those rallies. Gimmick rallies focus more on the team's ability to follow instructions and their ability to find landmarks and clues while driving.

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
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










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North Region Update



Concours at the Parade

I had the opportunity to enter the concours program at the annual Porsche Parade in the Poconos last month. I entered my recently restored 1986 Carrera which I felt could be a "contender" with fresh paint, new interior, rebuilt motor and trans, and all original in restoration. Aside from Metro concours events (Old Westbury Gardens, Vanderbilt, Pindar) as well as some local events in Westchester for which I have a handful of trophies, I assumed I would be up against some formidable competition. With nearly 2,000 Parade registrants, I assumed that a few hundred cars of varying vintages and conditions would be registered for the concours. I was blown away by the quality of the cars at last year's Parade in French Lick, so I assumed it would be equally competitive this year as well. I entered the Restoration Full class, of "G" body 911's which were SC's and Carrera's from the '80s.

The day before I left, I detailed the car aggressively and relentlessly, using every rag, cleaning tool and chemical in my arsenal that covered the engine compartment, frunk, interior leather and the tires and wheels. The car was pristine, however, when I left my garage early Sunday morning, it was raining on and off through the route from New York to the Poconos. Fortunately I brought enough towels and cleaning supplies to clean the car upon arrival. I spent much of the 2 1/2 hour drive to the Kalahari Resort planning my approach to cleaning the car (top to bottom, outside then inside, wheel wells and undercarriage, engine comparment). Upon arrival, I was assigned a parking space and I wiped down the car only to experience more drizzle and rain. I postponed the cleaning to the next morning, the day of the concours. I covered the car and planned to get up early to start the process all over again.

I rose at 5:30 am and quickly dressed and ran outside to find the parking lot about half-filled with other lunatics cleaning their cars in the dawn sunlight. I removed the cover and unpacked the car, setting up my own cleaning station. Across from me was Publicity Chair Bob DeMotta working on his 964 and I received periodic visits from North Region Director Stew Teichman who had his Boxster inside where his car was already ready for show. So at 6:00 am, I started with the wipe down, then the polishing from top to bottom. Then I cleaned the wheels and tires, and then I attacked the interior. I re-treated the leather and then used my lint roller on the carpeting, mats, and seats. My last effort was to polish up the engine compartment and retrieve my new tool kit I just acquired at the Carlisle Swap Meet back in April and place it prominently in the frunk. I learned that there were four of us in the class and the other three were reported to be spectacular examples of air-cooled restorations.

With an 8:30 start, I was hoping for more time despite being at it for nearly 2 ½ hours, but I was approached by a team of guys in matching shirts and funny hats at precisely 9:00 am to inspect my car. I was asked to provide a few minutes of history about the car (22 years of ownership), the extent of my restoration effort (full metal restoration, repaint, rebuilt engine/trans, and new interior), and whether I drive it or just show it (I drive it about 2000 miles per year and it has just over 200,000 miles on the clock).

To be both generous and funny, I put out a blanket for the gentleman who was going to inspect under the car. He was carrying a flattened cardboard box to lie down on since we parked on asphalt but he clearly appreciated a padded surface I provided, and they attacked the car like a swarm of locusts, 6 people inspecting their area of expertise. The guy in the frunk counted out the tools in my new toolkit, saying, "all here", plus he rolled back the carpeting and I heard him exclaim that the spare tire wheel needed to be repainted (yikes, I did not know that was a "thing"!). They inspected every square inch of the interior, including the roof liner (new), leather seats (new), carpeting (new), and mats (new). I could hear the gentleman inspecting the engine compartment (pretty clean) now move to look underneath the engine compartment (he clearly appreciated my blanket over his cardboard) and rubbed his hands over the bottom of the engine. He found some dirt and I realized that I may have missed some spots.

The dog days of summer are here and along with that are some marquee driver education events coming up on the Metro NY PCA calendar.

Looking back to last month, we had a June doubleheader of DE events at Watkins Glen and New Jersey Motorsport Park. Our first event of the season at WGI had our typical huge turnout of

around 200 cars and drivers. Some extremely exotic and unusual rides showed up to participate including a few vintage Alfa Romeos, a brand-new Alfa TCR car, an uncountable number of Porsche Cup cars as well as an IMSA LMP3 prototype just to name a few. Since this event immediately precedes the Zone 1 PCA club race event, we regularly attract a lot of PCA club racers from around the country looking for some extra practice. I know everyone is feeling the pain at the gas pumps these days particularly when you fill your street Porsche with premium fuel. If your Porsche race car has an extremely hot engine that requires 100+ octane race gas to make it sing, you were paying \$13.50 a gallon at the gas pumps at The Glen! Fuel prices aside, we were blessed with two perfect days of weather which provided tons of quality (dry) track time.

Later in the month of June, we had our 2nd of three events planned at NJMP, this one being held on the Thunderbolt circuit again this year. Since this event happens early in the work week (Monday -Tuesday), the turnout is usually on the lighter side for this DE. But a lower turnout is a blessing in disguise for those who attend because lower turnouts equate to longer run sessions on track and less traffic to contend with resulting in a lot of high-quality practice time. In the future, if you can manage to get away from home (and/or work) on a Monday and Tuesday, this event in late June at NJMP is your best bang for the buck. Now looking forward to our big 3-day, weekend event at Watkins Glen which is scheduled for July 29, 30 and 31 (Friday-Sunday). As I reported in prior months, this DE event is a particularly popular family excursion. The track is located in the scenic Finger Lakes region of New York where there are plenty of things for family members to see and do other than watch cars go around a racetrack. The vineyards in the area are in full bloom and the

activities on the lake and the surrounding hills are in full gear. This DE event is by far the most popular one on our calendar and is not to be missed. Everyone from total beginners to veteran drivers is always welcome. And for the second year in a row, the event is sponsored by FinishLine Collision which will provide all entrants with a custom event t-shirt.

Next month, we return to the rolling, clay-covered hills of northwest Connecticut at historic Lime Rock Park on August 26th and 27th. This short track packs a big punch with a collection of challenging turns that is unequaled by any track of its size. It is an excellent place for firsttimers to learn the basics of performance driving, as well as a challenging place for more advanced DE participants looking to hone their skills. One note, this track has a restriction on sound level, so you will need a nearly stock exhaust on most Porsches to be within the limits. Check with your tech site or ask for a sound measurement at a prior event to be sure.

Looking further out on the DE calendar to our last two events of the season, our last trip to NJMP will be held on September 30 to October 1st, this time on the Lightning Circuit. We are working hard behind the scenes to try to offer a special all-female run group for this event, so keep a watch for announcements and details. And finally on the calendar, our traditional end-of-season DE event on the main circuit at Summit Point in West Virginia is on November 5th and 6th. We moved this event from Friday/ Saturday to Saturday/Sunday to provide more weekend dates for our members. This old-school track design offers great diversity and many performance-driving challenges and is one of my personal favorites.
