

The downside, thirty-one cars. The upside, twelve runs and a lunch break! I am sitting here at the Nassau Coliseum after the Midst of Summer Autocross, and everyone has left. To the west, there are dark clouds an occasional thunderbolt and a clap or two of faint thunder. To the east beautiful blue skies and white fluffy clouds. Weather can make or break an event and we got lucky today.

As far as course designers I was not so lucky. I am what you call the bottom of the barrel. When there are no competent course designers available to design the course, I scrape the bottom of the barrel and I give it a shot. Being at all the course setups you would think setting up a course would be an easy undertaking, well, it is not. I do my best to channel some of the more successful course designers but that does not always work. Anyway, I think I got lucky this month and designed a not so horrible course. I am sure some people liked it, and some did not. It is mentionable that I did have some major help and it is always beneficial to get suggestions from others when you are flying by the seat of your pants. So, a big thank you to Mitch Hackett, Michael Kane, Mark Hill (who didn't even participate in the event the next day), Mark Valera and John R Mingst.

As far as the event, as I mentioned before, thirty-one drivers, twelve runs and a smooth day. Here are the results:

In S2 with one driver, Manny G took the win in 53.750 seconds. Andre C took the win in S4 with a time of 46.424 seconds and Robert N took the win in two-driver S5 with a time of 47.936 seconds. Mitch H took the win in two-driver S6 with a time of 45.398 seconds. Patrick S came in first with a time of 48.530 seconds in S8. Peiter L took the win in S9 with a 50.001 second trip around the course.

Now to our production classes. Yours truly took the win in P6 with a time of 45.162. Newcomer Marko D drove the course in 51.225 seconds to take the win in P7. Now to autocross this season, Brandon T drove the course in 44.818 seconds for the first-place spot in P8 and returning

veteran autocrosser Henry H took the first-place spot in P9 along with Fastest Time of the Day and Fastest Pax Time of the Day. Congratulations Henry. Tom P took the first-place spot in I1 with a time of 49.714 seconds and David P took the first-place spot in M3 with a time of 47.775 seconds.

Graham M took the win over his son Mieles in X1 with a time of 44.895 seconds in the two-car class. Eight driver class of X2 found John M in first with a time of 44.349 seconds to beat out second place Bryan W who drive the course in 43.363 seconds.

So when you read this the Zone 1 autocross will be in the books. I would like to thank all those who attended the event I am sure we had a great time. Our next local event will be on September 25th at the Nassau Coliseum. This will be the last points earning event before the runoff. In October we will be back at Tobay Beach. It feels like the season is almost over but there is still time to get out and have some fun with your car. Hope to see you all out there.


BILL RIEHL - TREK CHAIR

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Track Ramblings

FRED PACK - DE INSTRUCTOR



I spend my summers at Vail Coloradoin the Rocky Mountains. We hike, bike, spend time with friends and it's a wonderful place to be, except for one serious problem: it takes me away from Metro NY PCA and all the track events I love so much. But — no surprise, Colorado has PCA chapters — Alpine Mountain (AMR) and Rocky Mountain (RMR), and there are several racetracks in

the state, including Pueblo, La Junta, and High Plains Raceway. A Vail friend of mine has an '18 911 GTS, and a few years ago I talked him into attending an RMR DE event with me instructing at High Plains Raceway, which is about an hour east of Denver. The deal included me driving the car as well as instructing him.

High Plains Raceway, known as HPR, is fascinating. It has fifteen turns in 2 ½ miles, with more than 300 feet of steep uphills and plunging downhills. (By contrast, Watkins Glen only has 141.) The track has numerous decreasing-radius turns and blind apexes. Add it all up, and HPR is extremely challenging. Unfortunately for me, my friend stopped extending the opportunity to share the 911 with me, so this year I rented a track car for the event. The "track car" was a 2004 Mazda 6 and was absolutely the slowest car at the event. Cars were zooming by me on even the shortest of straights, and although I made up some ground in the turns, I spent a lot of time giving passing signals. I don't know what I'll do next year.

The high point of the experience was the time I spent instructing another Vail friend in his BMW M3. He had never been on a track before, although he does motorcycle off-roading. He had such a great time and intuitively understood the concepts I was teaching. He fell in love with being on-track, which made the experience beyond worthwhile for me. You can see the happiness on our faces on the podium, after we "won" the DE.

When I arrived at the track the first morning I saw Vicki Earnshaw, whom I have known for years. She is from the RMR region and used to be the National Club Racing Chair. She pretty much begged me to instruct at a special beginners-only event two weeks later near Denver at

the Colorado State Patrol Track. They were very short of instructors, so I agreed to do it.

The track is mostly used to teach police and other government people how to drive fast safely, but they also rent it out to car clubs. It is a 1.4 mile long more-orless triangle with a bus-stop chicane. My two students both had Boxsters – one was a 2000 Boxster S, and the other was a 2015 GTS. I did a few laps in each of them and both were excellent, but the 15 years of additional development were very evident.

The tricky aspect of the track is that most of the turns are decreasing radius with blind apexes, which requires the driver to be on-line religiously, as well as keeping the instructor on his toes.

There are two human-interest elements regarding my student with the 2000 Boxster: I had contacted him before the event and we had a 15-minute telephone chat. He had never been on track but had done one autocross. He revealed to me that he had tried his best at the autocross but was very slow – this left him in a down mood going into the track event. I tried to cheer him up, but he did seem depressed in anticipation of the track event. By the end of our day together at the track, he was upbeat because with my help he knew he was beginning to master track driving. The second element is about his car. He is a contractor and a few years ago did a big job at someone's house. He noticed that the owner had a lovely 2000 Boxster S. The owner proposed a barter deal - he would pay for all the work by giving the car to my student. My guy was thrilled with that offer and loves his Boxster dearly.

As PCA says, "It's not just the cars, it's the people"

I will be returning East in mid-September and plan to be at the Metro NJMP and Summit Point events. I look forward to seeing my Metro friends. You can always contact me at fhp911@gmail.com.










Driven for Speed

What a fantastic weekend of racing Paul Devany and I just had at New Jersey Motorsport Park.

I originally registered for the race when registration first opened. I usually register early to try to secure my car number 2. A week or so later after chatting with Brian McGrath about the usual unbearably hot conditions at this particular race I decided to bail. On top of it all,

we've been extremely busy at the shop so we both felt that taking an extra day or two off during the week wasn't the best thing to do.

Just a week before the race Paul Devany stopped by at the shop. We had a chat about the race. Paul told me he wanted to race! I told Paul that if he wanted to race I'd re-register and race as well. Well, he did. So, I did. The next thing I knew we were prepping my #2 SPB for the race. On Thursday the 11th we were loaded up. Brian was heading to NJMP. I planned to follow up later with Otis Holman (second crewman).

Friday morning we were all set. At 9:30 in the morning we were on track for our first "warm-up" session. All things went well. During practice sessions, while getting in some much-needed practice, you are also learning about the other drivers on the track. Which ones are predictable (trustable) and which ones are unpredictable. Some drivers will leave "racing room" when you go into a turn "Two- by-two" which is great. Others will shut the door on you (not good). If you're not aware a collision may be the outcome. Second session, another warm-up (practice) and all was still going well. The third practice session of the day is usually called the qualifying session. Your best time in this session will set your place on the starting grid for the first race. I qualified 20th overall. Not too bad considering but you always wish (and think) that you could have and should have done better. In the fourth session of the first day of the race weekend, there is what the PCA calls a "Fun Race". This race is really to acclimate all new drivers (Rookies). It's to get them used to "taking the Green flag" in a race situation. I usually sit

this race out but... Paul felt like racing it so I figured why not.

I grid 4th to start this race. The three cars ahead of me were faster-classed. An F stock 911, and two SP-3 944s. I had fun racing this race and actually wound up taking first place. During the race, I heard Brian on the radio. He told me that Paul had been hit. The first thing that goes through your mind is, is your friend ok? Then, how bad is it? Will we be able to repair it? Thank God it wasn't bad. Paul was fine and the car was very repairable. Turns out that I took the apex away from a racer going through turn one. That car got a little out of control (a tank slapper they call it). The cars behind the out-of-control car all checked up. Paul was in that mix. When Paul checked up the car behind him hit him. Whenever there is car-to-car contact the Scrutineers check out the cars involved. As soon as the National scrutineers were finished looking at Paul's car the guys got the car back into our garage and got right to work. They borrowed a tire heat gun so they could heat Paul's rear bumper to get it back into shape. They stitched the torn section with nylon ties. Before dinner time Paul was race ready.

Saturday was another beautiful day. We had a morning warm-up and two races scheduled for the day. The competition is always pretty fierce in SPB. Alex Au is always fast as is Ryan Farragut, Hoyt Ammidon, John Beidler, and Kevin Aberant. But the new sheriff in town is a guy by the name of Robbie Wilson. Robbie is just fast. Robbie was running about 2 seconds quicker than the rest of us in SPB. Robbie won all three races hands down leaving the rest of us battling very closely for the remaining positions. No matter if you're batting for 1st or last racing is just the best. The intensity, the awareness needed, the intestinal fortitude...it's the best.

In the first race, I managed to take second place in class however going into turn one mid-race I was battling against Kevin Aberant. I was braking very late; so late and hard at one point that I could not stop the car. I thought I was going to collect Kevin and collect him hard. We went into the turn-side-by-side. I could not get the car slowed. I thought I was going to collect Kevin and collect him hard. Somehow Kevin was able to give me just enough room to get through the turn. We did have some slight contact but nothing to care about. We both continued to race to the checkered flag. Since we had contact we were supposed to go to the "Black Flag" station and report the incident.

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

I followed him through but that backmarker car moved over we collided. The contact was my left rear quarter and his front right fender. This contact sent me off track on into the grass, drivers left. I managed to keep her straight

(classroom training). I gently got her track on track just as the car in position 3 came up behind me :-0. I managed to hold him off and take the checkered flag in 2nd position. What a race.
