Another great event. This has been a great season so far. If you were ever thinking about autocrossing then this would be the season to start. The "Summer is Here Autocross" took place in the smaller, Lot 2, at the Nassau Coliseum. Although it is smaller than the other lot we use, the surface is much better. Rich Wayne designed the course the morning of the event and what an

incredible track it was. He added a loop element, which was intimidating at first, but then turned into the most fun part of the course. As for the weather, it was perfect if you were sitting under the timing tent. Outside the tent, it was sunny and hot! Fifty-two drivers signed up and this is how they did.

S3, found Justin Y in the lead with a time of 44.500 seconds. S4, with two drivers found Andre C in first place with a time of of 41.245 seconds. S5/P2 was dominated by Robert N whose last run of 40.369 seconds was good enough to win his class and earned him the Fastest Pax of the Day. Congratulations Robert. Vince R came in second with a time of 42.668 seconds. S6/P3/P4 with four drivers found Mitch H in the lead spot with a time of 40.803 seconds. Michael K took the second place spot with a time of 41.023 seconds and JoAnn F came in third with a 43.092 second trip around the course. Our largest Porsche class of S8/P6, with eight drivers, was dominated by Derek M who took the win with a 39.462 second run, while Dan F found the second place spot, only .09 seconds slower, with a time of 39.561 seconds. Tom Q placed third in 40.640 seconds. Anthony H took the win in two-driver S9P7 with a time of 40.574 seconds. Brandon T took the win in P8 in 39.436 seconds and Paul O took the win in P9 in 48.161 seconds. Our three-car Improved class found Todd R at the helm with a 38.659 second run to beat out Tom P who drove the course in 43.683 seconds.

X1, with eight drivers, found Graham M in the first place spot with a time of 39.804 seconds. Christine P came in a close second with a 39.830 second run and course designer Rich W found the third place spot with a time of 40.462 seconds. Eleven driver X2 was dominated by Josh L with a 37.808 second trip while Bryan W took

the second place spot with a time of 38.861 seconds. Anthony C came in third with a 39.167 second run. It is notable that Josh L's time earned him the Fastest Time of the Day Award. Eight driver X3 was dominated by Jose A who drove the course in 38.493 seconds to beat out Thomas C's second place time of 39.510 seconds. Third place went to Gio L who drove the course in 40.806 seconds

So now, on to the future. For those of you who are not aware, the August 20th event has been cancelled. The next event will be the Zone 1 Autocross in Ayer, Massachusetts on August 26th and 27th. The Zone 1Autocross is open to all PCA members. The Metro NY Region is part of a larger region, Zone 1, which spans from New York to Northern Canada. Autocrossers come from all over Zone 1 to compete for two days. Each day is a different high-speed course on an amazingly smooth surface. The courses are set up on a decommissioned Army airfield runway so there is plenty of room to open up your cars and see what they can do. It is loads of fun, competitive and social, as when we are not autocrossing, we all hang out and have a great time together. This is also a Metro NY PCA points event, so it does count toward the runoff however, it is fun for everyone. Alongside the competition, there is also a team challenge where all participants are broken up into teams. Trophies will be awarded to the team that wins in addition to the regular event awards.

Stand with us to fight domestic violence on Long Island

Domestic violence is, in many ways, a silent epidemic.

It occurs often: 1 in 4 U.S. women will experience it in her lifetime; 1 in 3 adolescent girls is a victim of physical, emotional and verbal abuse from a dating partner.

Track Ramblings

FRED PACK - CO-CHIEF INSTRUCTOR



I'm going to start this column on a light note and then get to some more serious stuff later on.

In the 1950-1960s, Stirling Moss was one of the most famous people in the world, and why not? He won 212 of the 529 races he entered in a racing career lasting 14 years, including Le Mans, the Mille Miglia, 16 Formula 1 races, and 2 Sebring, and he was a bit of a playboy

who was often in the news. He was very famous. He was actually so famous in England that a standard line when the police would pull drivers over for speeding was, "Who do you think you are, Stirling Moss?"

One time Moss himself got a speeding ticket and the cop asked, "Who do you think you are, Stirling Moss?" Moss replied, "Sir Stirling." He didn't get the ticket. Stirling Moss was knighted in 2000 and died in 2020 at age 90.

There are four car racing movies that are MUST SEES. Two of them are about Formula 1 – "Grand Prix" from 1966 (I am actually in it, kinda maybe, sorta... I was at the British Grand Prix depicted in the film held at Brands Hatch and am probably in one of the crowd scenes.) The other is "Rush" from 2013. These are both serious films. "Grand Prix" is a fictionalized story, but very well presented and many of the F1 drivers of the era such as Phil Hill, Dan Gurney, Jimmy Clark, and Graham Hill have bit roles. "Rush" is about the life and racing career of the great Nicki Lauda and his rivalry with James Hunt.

By the way, Porsche did win one Formula 1 race long ago in 1962 at Rouen France with the American Dan Gurney driving. While that was Porsche's only F1 win as a car constructor, they had major success in the 1980s with their 1.5-liter twin-turbo TAG-Porsche F1 900hp engine which powered the dominant McLarens of the era.

The third great racing movie is Steve McQueen's 1971 "Le Mans", a fictionalized story with great cinematography and lots of Porsches; the fourth is the 2019 "Ford v Ferrari" which depicts the rivalry between these two racing giants at the 1966 Le Mans. The storyline is quite accurate, but there is some nonsense with drivers yelling at each other while going down the Mulsanne straight at 200+ mph.

And a new F1 movie is being created right now. Brad Pitt will star in it, and some filming was done at the recent British Grand Prix. Pitt's fictional F1 team was given a spot in the pit lane alongside the real F1 cars, and this will be represented in the film. The idea for the film, which is unnamed so far, grew out of a meeting that Tom Cruise arranged between Lewis Hamilton and Joseph Kosinski (director of "Top Gun: Maverick") at the premiere of last year's Top Gun film. Lewis will be an Executive Producer, so we can expect serious realism. The film is expected to be released next year.

The more serious stuff:

We have all heard the adage, "In a Spin, Both Feet In," but what does it mean? It means that once your car is out of control in a spin, you should immediately push on the brake and clutch pedals and keep pressing them. The reason for pressing the brake pedal is obvious: the sooner you can slow and stop the car the better; the reason for pressing the clutch pedal is two-fold: by de-clutching, you are uncoupling the engine from the rear wheels. If you don't do that you will force the engine to spin in reverse – which may damage it. Also, an engaged engine adds some braking force, but this force would have bizarre effects as the car's orientation changes during the spin. I don't understand what happens during a spin situation with fluid coupling or PDK-like transmissions. I will do research on this and write it up in a future column.

During a Metro event 6 or 7 years ago I was approaching Lightning's "Light bulb" turn when I encountered a massive oil spill that had been dumped by the car just ahead of me. In a split-second, the car was pointing backward hurtling towards the edge of the track and the tall cement wall. I remembered the adage and I pressed both pedals as hard as I could and hoped/waited for the outcome. The car stopped about four feet from the wall, still pointed backward. I could see other cars spinning due to the oil as they approached me – fortunately, none of them hit me or anything else.

Remember "In a Spin, Both Feet In". A time may come when you need it, and this leads to a final point – the difference between Reacting and Responding. A Reaction is an involuntary action caused by an external stimulus. Responding is different – it is an action that triggers a learned set of behaviors triggered by something. Tmake the situation worse.)





The "in a Spin" adage is a learned set of behaviors; so is "unwind the wheel a bit when your car starts to oversteer" and "don't lift off the gas in an oversteer situation." (Doing so may provoke the dreaded Trailing Throttle Oversteer and make the situation worse.)

Spend some mental time thinking of unfortunate possible track situations, such as for each turn on each track you

visit deciding what you should do if you have brake failure or other mishaps. Try to build up a library of Responses and visualize (daydream) them from time to time. I'll see you at the track.

My Autocross Experience

A common characteristic that readers of The Post share is an enthusiasm for their Porsche's in the Club's various activities. Whether your interest is in Concours, Performance Driving, Road Rally, Social activities, or Treks to various venues, The Metro New York chapter of the Porsche Club of America (PCA) can fulfill them.

Among the performance driving activities, we have members who challenge and enhance their driving skill levels at different events. Driver's Education (DE) track events bring the closed track experience to drivers at speeds beyond our everyday existence without timing, awards, or prizes. A typical lap of Lime Rock Park in Connecticut will see drivers facing twelve to fifteen turns and can be thrilling to try to complete in a minute's time. The events tend to be highly social as well.

What if you have that desire to add some competitive spice to your performance driving pursuits? Does it require significant alterations to your street driven Porsche? What about the costs of equipment and time involved? Our club, as well as others in the area, can add that spice with the Autocross program.

Autocross, or Solo as it's known among other clubs, are precision driving events that are intended to attract those who want to enhance their driving skills at speeds commonly found on our local roads. For each event, a unique course approximately two-thirds to one mile in length is defined by pylons within an open paved area. Vehicles are divided into published classes. The cones are soft and pliable; reducing the chance of body damage should one happen to be in your way. Leaving the starting line triggers a timer with thirty turns or more to navigate. Crossing the finish line roughly a minute later ends the time, defining your "lap".

If you displace a cone, your lap times incur an additional two seconds of time per cone. Participants have three to ten attempts at driving the 'track' with their best lap times determining standings within their class.

The preparation level for an Autocross from a mechanical standpoint has been covered in past issues. Basically, you could drive your routinely maintained Porsche to an event and compete.

Derek McKane, a local member has been doing just that with his 2014 Cayman S. Derek's car is a PDK equipped coupe with the standard equipment for the year

and significantly without options having "Sport" in their definitions.

The only enhancement to the car is a wheel alignment within factory parameters and slightly wider 200 tread wear Bridgestone tires that could easily be purchased at a big box retailer on the factory 19-inch wheels. While not eligible for our club's Showroom Stock class, his car routinely competes in the Production class.

The Sports Car Club of America (SCCA) recently held a two-day competitive "ProSolo" autocross at MetLife Stadium in New Jersey within viewing distance of the Metro NY PCA coverage area. Nearly two hundred (200) drivers from the Northeast and beyond competed in the event with their cars.

The format of the event is described as: "Drivers...[drive] a course by themselves, but start off side-by-side drag racing style and attack mirror-image courses to see who gets back to their respective finish lines first.

In contrast to a standard 3-run autocross, ProSolo class competition takes 1.5 days where each driver gets three sets of runs to put together the best run from each side. Class winners are determined by putting the best right and left side runs together.

After class competition, it's time for challenge rounds. The first is a bragging-rights Bonus Challenge drawn at random, a Ladies' Challenge for the top-performing ladies class drivers, and the big one - the Super Challenge, which pits the top 32 drivers from regular competition into challenge bracket competition at its finest!"

As part of the competitive playing field, when an insufficient number of cars and drivers are not competing in a given class, those entrants are grouped together with other classes of similar performance potential where attendance is also low. This allows for a greater depth of competition. Derek's original entry class had a total of three (3) entrants but subsequently became part of an eight (8) driver group.

The class competition started Saturday morning with each driver having taken a total of four (4) continuous laps of the left and right side courses.

Any quick adjustments such as tire pressure changes will need to be handled by enlisted help outside of the vehicle. Within his class, the morning session times placed Derek in the second position (P2). Saturday late day competition found the other class drivers learning the course secrets, placing Derek in P3 among his class drivers. Sunday morning competition saw an improvement in lap times and some "personal bests" for Derek, but also punctuated by a "Red Light" lap which is not scored.

When a Driver is directed to the starting line, the car is placed in a very defined starting line for each side of the course. A light tree is activated with several yellow lights leading to a green light to indicate to the Driver to start their competitive lap. Your reaction time to when you are directed to go is a factor in your lap time. In Derek's case, one lap was not scored due to leaving prior to the green light being active, commonly referred to as a "red light" run.

As such, our protagonist finished the class competition laps with a serving of humble pie from the other eight drivers of the group. For most, the story of the weekend's competition would end here.

Recall that as part of the event format, there is a class competition and the Challenge Rounds to complete a full weekend of racing.

Among these is the "Bonus Challenge". Any competitor can enter into the drawing to take another attempt at the two (2) courses which may have perplexed them over the weekend. Eight (8) drivers are randomly selected among those who entered their names into the drawing. Selected drivers may elect to compete or withdraw should they choose. The order in which the drivers will compete against other drivers in the challenge is based on the selection order as well. It's somewhat redemptive to be able to drive the courses again in search of the improved lap time we all desire.

It turns out that redemption came knocking at Derek's feet. Just like the various sports where there are competitors eliminated, so too are the ProSolo challenge rounds. Among the drivers selected was the pilot of a 2019 Porsche 911 Carrera S Coupe in a stunning Miami Blue. Derek followed the advice of some of the other local autocrossers, some of whom happen to be Metro NY PCA members as well, and entered the drawing. The potential of a Porsche versus Porsche race was there! Unfortunately for the pilot of the 911, early elimination from the Challenge came knocking. Eight competitors suddenly became four which narrowed down to the final

two to determine the Challenge winner. The variety of vehicles in the Challenge ran the gamut from the class competition pool.

One moment you're at the starting line potentially against another of Stuttgart's wonders. Next, you may be there against a purpose-built go-kart. Your time to formulate strategy is minimal, as are any adjustments you can make to your car within the small time frame between timed laps.

To balance out the obvious disparity between a purposebuilt go-kart and a mass-produced street-driven automobile, the starting lights for the Challenge drivers are staggered in such a way as to produce close racing. So not only are you concentrating on leaving the starting line when your light turns green, but you also have to ignore the green light of your competitor, for they may be very different.


In a stunning bit of drama that could not be planned, both Derek and his challenger line up for their final round of competition. Engines are waiting to go upon their Driver's command. The lights start to count down. The engine revolutions increase as the lights drop. When can we go? We want to race! Waiting for the green light seems to be an eternity!

All of that anticipation results in red light runs for BOTH Derek and the go-kart driver! The drivers switch sides of the course and find themselves with one final attempt at the course to crown the winner of the Bonus Challenge. Ultimately, Derek took to the course with a vigor that can be described as "determined". Navigating the turns and accelerating out of corners as early as possible to get to the finish lights before the go-kart was the only priority. Don't make mistakes, don't hit cones, and don't forget the techniques!


