

I originally bought it to resell however on second thought I figured I'd keep it for a few years as it would make the perfect car for either of our daughters, Lindsey or Taylor to Autocross or DE so...I kept it. At the end of last year, our daughter Lindsey participated in her first DE in the Boxster. Lindsey totally enjoyed the experience and at the same time she was learning. Lindsey actually told me that her awareness had changed for the better in normal driving circumstances. At the end of the month, Lindsey will be participating in her second DE. This time she'll be driving my 2005 997. We both cannot wait.

As a club, we offer many fun venues. Concours events, Rallies, family barbecues, our Holiday party, and Trek drives. There's no doubt that these are all fun. I really enjoy participating in these events. However, Autocross and Drivers Education are the events where you really get to drive your Porsche how it was designed to be driven.

## Skid reMarks DAN FISHKIND - AUTOCROSS CHAIR



in Kansas We're not That's anymore! what thought after this Saturday's, April 13th, Tax Season Autocross that took place at Tobay Beach. We had all four seasons in one day. It was nice and sunny when we arrived, but then it got colder and turned cloudy, windy, and rainy. The wind was so strong that it moved the cones on the course, which made it hard for the workers. Sand

was flying around the parking lot, which made it hard to face the wind. I found sand in my car, helmet bag, hair, and all over my car's exterior when I got home. Despite the terrible weather, 55 drivers came to have fun on a course that Tim Mehta designed. Tim used to design courses a long time ago but he got busy with work and life. He just retired (congratulations Tim) and has found the time to come back to autocross. Welcome back, Tim! Many new people showed up for the event and I'm quite pleased with the number of Porsche that are getting involved. Although attendance would be on the low side, we could actually run a Porsche-only event if we wanted to. Don't worry X-Classers, that won't be happening, you are always welcome.

#### Now for the results:

Our Stock classes saw some great performance from our drivers. Newcomer Yasaman D finished the course in 68.034 seconds and won the S1 class, while Pan C was the fastest in S3 with a time of 51.701 seconds. In the three-driver S4 class, Andre C took the top spot with a time of 46.002 seconds, ahead of Domonick T's time of 49.179 seconds. Louie A, another new driver who was bitten by the autocross bug, won the S5 class with two drivers with a time of 48.555 seconds. Mark V dominated the S6 class, our biggest Porsche class with five drivers, with a time of 46.062 seconds. He beat Mitch H's second-place time of 46.116 seconds, and JoAnne F was third with a time of 46.564 seconds. Joe C won the S7 class with a 49.544 second run, and Vaino N was the first in S8 with a time of 45.157 seconds.

In our production classes, Michael K took the win in P3 with a time of 44.602 seconds. In the four car class of P5, Richard W took the win with a 44.683 second run

around the lot to beat out Heidi H's second place time of 44.822 seconds. Third place went to Ryan W who drove the course in 44.942 seconds. Three driver P6 was taken by yours truly with a 45.282 second run. Many of the cones on the course didn't like me much. Mark H came in a close second, only .322 seconds away as he drove the course in 45.604 seconds. Jack M took the win in P7 with a time of 49.498 seconds and Andre V took the win in P8 with a 48.162 second run. To finish off the production classes, Brandon T took first place in P6 with a time of 43.263 seconds. Brandon was the fastest Porsche at the event


Course designer, Tim M took the win in our modified class in 45.807 seconds and Tom P drove the course in 48.219 seconds to win our improved class.

In our non-Porsche class X1, with 5 drivers, Graham M beat out both his sons for the first place spot. His 46.196 second run beat out his youngest son Mieles M who drove the course in a close 46.431 seconds. And Nolan M took the third place spot with a time of 47.055 seconds. Seven-driver X2 was dominated by Adil A who drove the course in 42.622 seconds while Tom C took the second place spot in 44.434 seconds. John R M found the third place spot with a time of 44.618 seconds. Ten-deriver X3 found Jose A on top with a time of 42.540 seconds.

This time was fast enough to earn Jose the Fastest Time of the Day. Paul V took the second place spot in 43.083 seconds, and Jules I came in third in 45.396 seconds.

Our drivers showed some excellent performance in our Stock classes. Yasaman D, who was new to the event, finished the course in 68.034 seconds and won the S1 class, while Pan C had the best time in S3 with 51.701 seconds. In the S4 class, where there were three drivers, Andre C came out on top with a time of 46.002 seconds, ahead of Domonick T's time of 49.179 seconds. Louie A, another newcomer who got hooked by the autocross, won the S5 class with two drivers with a time of 48,555 seconds. Mark V won the S6 class, which had the most Porsches with five drivers, with a time of 46.062 seconds. #### TREK REGISTRATION

The registration process starts by going to the website clubregistration.net. This will make the registration process a lot smoother when you are ready to register for the Trek or any other Metro PCA events. I will be giving detailed email instructions in the near future, on how to register for a Driver and how to register for a passenger. Each person attending the event must be registered and paid for separately.

When searching for the Trek events to register for, start with searching by event host- which

is Metro NY PCA, then also include the other search box by event type which is Tours. Then hit search. This will take you to the location to register for the event.



#### **Track Ramblings**

#### FRED PACK - CO-CHIEF INSTRUCTOR



Part 2 of Fred's multipart that are one or two years old. series on trying Drivers Education.

#### All are welcome

About 10% of our PCA DE drivers are women. The fun and thrill of track driving is equally appropriate for everyone, and you will come across female track enthusiasts and instructors wherever you choose to drive. Some regions also host female-only DE events

and clinics. Simply put, if you are female and love your Porsche, attend a DE event. We predict that you will get hooked immediately.

#### <u>Insurance</u>

DE events are very safe and take place in a controlled environment, but sometimes stuff does happen. Your regular auto insurance typical- ly will not cover damage incurred at a racetrack, even at a non-competition event like a DE. Fortunately, special DE insurance is available. Do a web search on "HPDE track insurance" (HPDE stands for High Performance Driver Education) to see a number of providers, some of which provide coverage for one-day events, weekends, multiple events, or an entire driving season. Shop around to see what works best for your car and your driving commitment. PCA is sponsored by Lockton Motorsports and Hagerty, and has information on the PCA website regarding their insurance programs.

#### What to bring

You will need a helmet. Your region may have loaners, so if you don't want to buy one yet, contact the DE/Track Chair, who can be found on the Region's website, before the event for details. Race suppliers, like OG Racing, also rent new helmets and will ship them directly to your home and provide a return address label.

Helmets must be "Snell ap- proved," meaning that the sticker inside the helmet says "Snell" and either "SA" or "M," and 2015 or 2020. (Note: some regions may require the "SA"-type helmet.) 2010 helmets are no longer permitted. We recom- mend the full-face type helmet, but this is not always required. Prices start at about \$250, and be sure to look online or in shops for sales on new helmets

Other than the helmet, you don't need anything special. You'll have to wear long pants and a long-sleeve shirt; allnatural fibers are recommended. Sometimes if it is hot, short sleeves are permitted, depending on the region. But always have a long-sleeved shirt available. Sunglasses, a folding chair, and a tarp or a plas- tic tub for your belongings are sug- gested as well.

Track events start early each day—usually 7 a.m.—so it may be quite cold. Depending upon the sea- son, it may get very hot or very cold, or even both. Be prepared for rain with suitable hats, coats, etc. Bring a towel, too, just

Most tracks have food stands. Others do not, but there should be lunch places in town nearby. Bring water. Nothing is more important than staying hydrated, even if it isn't hot. Your adrenaline will be through the roof, and you will need to replenish those fluids.

#### How the day unfolds

A few days before the event, you'll get a confirmation email from your region telling you important eventspecific information and what time the track gate opens. It's a good idea to be there when the gates open because there's quite a lot to do be- fore the event, and you'll want to be ready to go when it's your session on track or in the classroom. At the gate you'll have to sign the track's liability waiver.

After you have made your way to the paddock area, you must go to Registration, where you'll sign your region's liability waiver (yes, you must sign both of them) and be assigned to a "run group." Run groups are assigned based on your amount of track experience, and you'll be given a colored wristband corresponding to your group. As a beginner, you'll be in the novice group. You may be given a work assignment as well.

Next, go back to your car and empty out EVERYTHING from the cabin and trunk—you don't want anything flying around while you're on the track. Be sure your driv- erside floor mats are out as well—you don't want anything getting stuck in the pedals on track.

#### 2024 Werkes Reunion at Amelia Island

2024 Werks Reunion/ Amelia Island Concours was the best car event I have ever attended bold statement.

Amelia Island attracts the country's best automobiles along with the who's who of the car world. For our newer reader and members, the PCA Werks reunion is one of the largest gatherings of Porsche enthusiast

in the country second to only the PCA parade. Along with the Werks Reunion is the Amelia Island concours D' Elegance brough to us by Hagerty Insurance, Broad Arrow Auction, The Hanger car show, and much more. This year saw hundreds of Porsche's with motorsport and historic significance between all of the events. I cannot recommend this event enough!

The showstopper at the reunion was a newly restored Porsche Pre A 356 Continental. The 356 Continental or later in production 356 European is one of the rarest of the 356 generation with only 860 and 69 cabriolets produced for 1955. The owner, who name eludes me, has had the car in her family for decades, and decided it was time to bring the car back to its former glory. The pre-A Porsche 356 Continental which was later badged European once Ford suggested it infringed on the Lincoln Continental name, was the brainchild of Max Hoffman. Typical of the American car market, Max thought a gimmick like naming the car would attract clientele. Additionally moving more chassis and having yet another North America exclusive model, Porsche made only a handful of these cars. Sporting the top-of-the-line 1500cc motor, Continental badging on the front fender (ok wing), chrome accents, gear ratios more suitable for the U.S. consumer, upgraded suspension components, and interior accents, makes this one of the more unique 356's. The final 40-50 cars were badged European after the Ford demands given Reutter has already punched the holes in the fenders.

The example pictured here had a nut and bolt restoration and is finished in Meissen Blue exudes class and style and would be best pictured in 1955 in front of the Beverly Hills hotel with its owner adorning a tweed suit and lady with white gloves. The bent windshield, rather larger center radio, and wheels which resemble a turbine are just a few of the special features this car has. There are beautiful examples of the 356 generation out on the market such as the gorgeous Emory Special variants (my all-time favorite 356 and maybe even Porsche), US specific American Roadster, and so on. But bang for the buck a Continental fit the bill in 1955 and it holds true today. As an investment or for your visual enjoyment, I recommend keeping a credit line open should one hit the market in the color of your choice.

## Driver's Education BRANDON TASSO - DE CHAIR



Hello and welcome back to the DE section of the Post! This month I figured I would talk about... Why DE? Is it safe? What are the benefits? If I don't have a Porsche, can I attend a PCA DE Event? Annnnd...can my Porsche handle it? These are a lot of the questions I hear from people who have never tried DE.

Is it Safe? VERY... Metro

NY's HPDE program is built around safety. We require tech inspections by an approved shop prior to attending a DE event to ensure your vehicle is ready for the track. We require Snell 2010 helmets or newer and as a beginner, you will have a certified instructor with you in the car at all times. All this information and more can be found at Metronypca.org/de-guidelines-and-safety.

#### Benefits?

Big Vision, a term I learned from our Club President, Bill Rudtner. What is Big Vision? The ability to be aware of everything that's going on around you while driving at speed. Beginners tend to have tunnel vision when they get on the track, I know I did. One of our fantastic instructors will be sitting right next to you, pointing out flag stations, runoff areas and reminding you to check your mirrors... among other things. All these things seem easy when you're doing 55 mph but at 130+ things happen fast and it's very easy to ignore our surroundings.

"If I don't have a Porsche, can I attend a PCA DE Event?" Absolutely! We allow all cars (except EVs) on the track at our events.





one of the most prolific car restorers in the northeast. Following that, we hope to continue the Porsche and Pancakes breakfasts across the region.





Take your car, helmet, and pre-event in- spection tech form to the Tech Line, whose location will be announced on the PA, where your car will get a quick safety check. Some regions require you to go through the Tech Line BEFORE you go to registra- tion, so be sure to pay attention to the details in the long emails you will be receiving from the region. Since COVID-19, many regions hold pre-event Zoom/Microsoft Teams calls to review the protocols, which may soon make the long emails a thing of the past.

If you've been told the name of your instructor, try to find him/her and introduce yourself. If not, your instructor will find you after the mandatory drivers meeting. Many regions are now providing the in- structor/student pairings to the in- structors in advance, so you may get an email or phone call from your in- structor before you arrive on track.

# **Drivers** meeting

Every day of every DE event starts with a drivers meeting. It is conducted by the PCA Region's Chief Instructor and Track Chair. Topics include track-specific infor- mation, the flags in use at the event, reminders of standard track rules and etiquette, and more. Attendance is mandatory, so be on time.

### **Sessions**

You likely will be on track four or five times each day in the Green run group, and each run group session lasts between 20 and 30 minutes. As a novice, you will attend one or more mandatory classroom periods when you are not on track, during which a high-performance driving instructor will explain the basics of track driving. These sessions are very informative and worthwhile. Even experienced drivers and in-structors sometimes drop in on them to pick up useful tidbits.







# **Porsche Market Update**

Even with sales from the Florida auctions being split between February and March this year, March 2024's dollar volume topped 2023's by nearly \$10m with a total of \$52,660,172 off of 608 Porsches on offer. March 2024's sellthrough rate (STR), on the other hand, was less than 2023's 76% coming in at 71%. But even at 71%, I'd say

the market is looking up as we haven't had an STR over 70% in a while.

At the top of the market, we had a number of million-dollar sales with top honors going to a 959 Komfort modified by Canepa at \$2.8m. Other notable \$1m+ sales include another 959 Komfort, this one unmodified, at \$1,795,000, a 2005 Carrera GT that sold for \$1,560,000, and a 1966 906 Carrera 6 that hammered at \$2,000,000, which was a nice surprise as many vintage race cars have struggled to sell over the last twelve months.

Unfortunately, the top end of the market had more no-sales than sales with two Spyders failing to sell at \$3,100,000 and \$3,200,000. We also saw a 911 reimagined by Singer go unsold at \$1,225,000, a 2005 Carrera GT at \$1,125,000, a 1957 356A 1500 Carrera Speedster GS/GT at \$1,000,000, and my favorite car of the month, a 1971 914/6 GT with Monte Carlo rally history at \$1,100,000. Had I won the lottery, that 914/6 would have been sold.

The other nice surprise from March was a number of 2023 911 Sport Classics coming to market, as prior to this month, the highly sought after Porsche had been fairly quiet on the auction circuit. The first car to sell was a Gentian Blue example with 52 miles that brought \$472,500 followed by a launch-spec car at \$445,000. The top-selling Sport Classic, though, was a Paint to Sample Underberg Green car with 10 miles hammering for \$478,000.

Along with the GS/GT Carrera Speedster mentioned above, we saw several interesting 356s hit the market

this month. We had a 1956 356A European Coupe distributed through Hoffman Motor Company sell for \$239,000. Finished in a beautiful shade of Aquamarine Blue Metallic, this example sported a replacement 1.9-liter engine and bested its previous 2021 sale of \$190,000 by quite the margin. Gooding & Co. sold a rare one-year-only 1955 Continental Coupe for \$218,400 and a matching-numbers 1958 356A Speedster in Fjord Green sold for \$380,000.

993s had a strong showing this month with 71% of the 24 cars on offer bringing in close to \$4,000,000. At the top of the pack was a 1996 911 modified by Gunther Werks. This heavily modified 993 Coupe was the first of 25 "Sport Touring" examples commissioned by the company and sold for \$1,022,500 at RM Sotheby's Miami auction. We also saw an exceedingly rare 1995 911 Turbo Cabriolet at Broad Arrow's Amelia sale which, unfortunately, went unsold at a final bid of \$600,000. Other notable 993 sales include a 1998 911 Carrera 4S at \$301,000, a 1998 911 Carrera S at \$202,000, and a stunning 1997 911 Turbo S at \$490,000.

By all means, March was an impressive month. To reach such a dollar volume with the Amelia sales being split between two months and to have such a high number of cars speaks volume to the state of the market. While the winter months were a little soft, I think it's safe to say that Spring has sprung for the collector Porsche market. Next month we'll see if this continues as we have another all-Porsche auction from Broad Arrow to look forward to at the end of April.

To finish off the production classes, Brandon T took first place in P10 with a time of 43.263 seconds. Brandon was the fastest Porsche at the event. Tim M, who designed the course, took the win in our modified class in 45.807 seconds and Tom P drove the course in 48.219 seconds to win our improved class. In our non-Porsche class X1, with 5 drivers, Graham M beat both his sons for the first place spot. His 46.196 second run was faster than Mieles M's run, who drove the course in 46.431 seconds. And Nolan M took the third place spot with a time of 47.055 seconds. Adil A dominated the X2 class, which had seven drivers, driving the course in 42.622 seconds, while Tom C took the second place spot in 44.434 seconds. John R M was third with a time of 44.618 seconds. Jose A was on top of the X3 class,

which had ten drivers, with a time of 42.540 seconds. This time was fast enough to earn Jose the Fastest Time of the Day. Paul V was second with a time of 43.083 seconds and Jules I was third in 45.396 seconds.

By the time you read this the last Tobay Autocross will be in the record books. We then head over to the Nassau Coliseum for events on May 5th, June 30th, July 21st, and August 18th. Please check the schedule online or in issues of the Porsche post for up-to-date information. Like I said earlier I am seeing many new people come out and are having a great time. 


