

Conducted on a short, coned-off course, typically set up in large parking lots or airport runways, autocross

challenges drivers to navigate tight turns and slaloms as quickly as possible.

- Looking Ahead: Always look ahead to the next cone or series of turns to plan your line.
- Brake Control: Mastering threshold braking maximizes grip and minimizes time spent slowing down.
- Throttle Management: Progressive and precise throttle application is crucial, especially in high-powered models like the 911


- 1. Register for an Event: Keep an eye on the club's calendar and register for upcoming autocross events. Early registration is often recommended due to limited slots.
- 2. Attend a Novice School: The club yearly hosts novice schools where experienced drivers offer instruction on the fundamentals of autocross. These sessions provide invaluable learning experiences and help newcomers feel more confident on the course.
- 3. Vehicle Preparation: Ensure your Porsche is in top condition. Basic checks include tire pressure, brake pads, and fluid levels. Consider consulting with fellow club members or a Porsche specialist for specific setup tips.
- 4. Gear Up: Bring your helmet, comfortable driving clothes, and plenty of water. A positive attitude and willingness to learn are just as important as any physical preparation.

#### **The Community Spirit**

One of the standout aspects of autocross within the Metro New York PCA is the community. Events are marked by camaraderie and a shared passion for driving. Experienced members are often eager to offer advice and tips, fostering an environment where everyone from novices to veterans feels welcome.





### **Track Ramblings**

#### FRED PACK - CO-CHIEF INSTRUCTOR



#### **BRAKING**

It goes without saying that braking is a critical part of track driving. You'd better slow down enough for the oncoming turn, but how you do it is what can keep you safe, and fast.

A performance car, such as a Porsche, has excellent brakes. In our normal street driving, we never come close to using them at their maximum potential, and

so we generally don't know how well they can work in a high-speed maximum-deceleration environment. Here is a method to find out:

If you are riding with an instructor, discuss this with your instructor before doing it. When you are on a long straight section of the track, and not very near the oncoming corner, first look in your rearview mirror and make sure no car is near you. Then, press the brake pedal with medium intensity, and after a moment press really hard on the brake pedal and hold it that way for another moment. This should give you an understanding of how powerful your car's brakes are. Use this knowledge going forward. ONLY DO THIS ON THE RACETRACK, AND MAKE SURE NO OTHER CAR IS NEARBY BEHIND YOU.

#### <u>Brake Initiation</u>

In regular street driving you press gently on the brake pedal to initiate slowing that car, and then you push harder/softer as/if needed to shorten/lengthen the braking distance. This method makes for the smoothest deceleration for the prevailing situation. For track driving, in contrast, we want to get the car slowed as quickly as possible to the maximum safe corner entry speed while being on the throttle as long as possible as we approach the oncoming corner.

For a corner that will require dropping speed quite a lot, the optimal solution is to stay on the throttle as long as possible and then brake to the maximum deceleration available, (which is called 'threshold braking') so that after an initial press – not jam – on the brake pedal we push the pedal hard to get maximum deceleration and maybe even engage the ABS. If we have gauged the right braking point we have slowed enough to safely negotiate the corner.

The trouble is that we aren't Max Verstappen or Lewis Hamilton with anything like their skill levels. We are, mostly, weekend warriors, and we very much don't want to crash our cars. The solution for us is to initiate the procedure from the preceding paragraph a moment earlier than what we feel is the last possible moment to start braking, in order to have a safety cushion. Then, as we approach the corner we have the option of releasing the brake pedal a little bit or continuing the hard braking, as needed.

#### Brake Release

At all times, cars appreciate smooth use of the controls. When we are finished slowing down for a corner we should not pop off the brake pedal. Doing so causes a large instantaneous weight shift from the front to the rear which can unbalance the car. Rather, we should reduce the brake pressure gently. This keeps the car in good balance.


A tip: Sometimes we find that we have entered a corner at too high a speed. Now what do we do? A good solution is to continue toward the corner but to not aim for the apex; rather, initiate a less sharp turn – this will let you continue braking longer since you aren't cornering as sharply as usual, and it also increases the width of the pavement ahead of you, since you aren't aiming straight across the track. More often than not, you can regain control of the car and proceed. You've messed up the turn and you haven't come anywhere near the apex, but you're still on the pavement instead of being on the grass or hitting the wall.

#### Trail Braking

If you do all your braking before the turn-in point, there is an amount of time when your tires are not using their maximum amount of grip. After all, it takes some time for the cornering forces to build up from no-cornering to maximum-cornering, and during that period the car is going slower than its maximum potential. Trail braking – let's call it 'TB' - is what allows us to "reclaim" that lost potential.

With TB, you start your braking a bit later than usual (which means you are on the gas longer than without TB), and as you approach the turn-in point you begin reducing the braking effort, but you still are doing some braking as you begin to turn – meaning that you are cornering AND braking at the same time, allowing you to be using more of the tires' grip potential and thereby going faster than in the 'brake, then corner' mode.

# Still a Porsche 911

We knew at the unveiling of the 991.1 platform that a hybrid 911 was inevitable. Porsche AG had already made architectural arrangements for the tech behind the dash. No one denied it, because alternative or additional power sources would become the standard amongst sportscars in the coming years, or so they believe. There is a natural order that

demands progression even if it is not fundamental and ultimately beneficial to the greater good; them being the Porsche 911 enthusiast=us. But so be it! Embrace it! The 911 must keep pace in its class or it will wither and die! Propaganda at best. 458, Murcielago, DBS, Carrera GT, we are no longer building performers like these, that had virtually no real regulation outside of some flimsy crash test metric. There are a great deal of alternative-powered cars built by Koenigsegg, Rimac, and a list that changes with every ¼ earnings report from their parent company. They do what they do best, build the fastest cars they can, and without any genetic predisposition from their lineage. Cooler, faster, and a much bigger wing.

I am unsure the 911 platform will be successful in this arena due to heritage, past performance from Porsche with Hybrid/Electric, and the marketplace for 911's being people that want a 911. The one thing we 911 fans have

going for us, is the brand was, is, and always will be reliant upon those three digits-911. Without them, I am confident all the Macan sales they think they will have will in fact wither and die. Watches, tee shirts, Cup Cars, you name it go the way of Long John Silvers. I urge Porsche to keep pace but not deviate too far from the nest. Surely, they''' bring back the "718 Cayman/Boxster" platform in all of its combustion glory carrying a badge to substantiate whatever price they come up with. And don't call me Shirly. Petrol runs the global economy, and 911's run on petrol. With that logic the 911 controls the global economy. Rrrriiigghhtt. It goes without saying, that I will surely drive, enjoy, and ultimately grow to accept different 911 variations. We must hope and pray that only the purist of 911 remains the flagship.





# West Region Report DUANE WILSON - WEST REGION DIRECTOR






PCA has 20 registries for those super enthusiastic about their Porsche model





## **Porsche Market Update**

May 2024 had a sellthrough rate of 71% out of 608 Porsches offered at auction for a total dollar volume of \$32,092,618 compared to 70%, 585, and \$31,309,017 the previous year. And while May's metrics all beat May of 2023's, this month was all about "what could have been," especially at the top end of the

For cars that could have potentially crested the million-dollar mark, only one of the nine \$1m cars sold, and it sold at a final bid of \$925,000, which was not quite on the money. That car was a 1992 911 Carrera 2 Coupe Reimagined by Singer. Known as the "San Diego" commission, the car was finished in Blue with Pale Blue stripes and Red Porsche script on the side and featured a beautiful Red leather interior. Out back, this Singer had a 3.8-liter Cosworth developed engine, which was the culprit, as recently it takes a 4.0-liter engine to get Singers up past the million-dollar mark.

Other million-dollar-potential sales included not one, but four Carrera GTs, all of which failed to sell. Coming off a very successful Carrera GT sale last month at over \$1.7m all-in, one would think that success would carry through the market. Bids ranged from \$1.1m to \$1.35m on one Black, two GT Silver, and one Seal Grey example. The \$1.1m car was finished in Seal Grey Metallic and showed just over 13,000 miles on the odometer. But internet sleuths recognized the car as having once belonged to a YouTuber who isn't known for being "easy" on their cars. History aside, \$1.1m was probably all the money given the miles.

Another notable no-sale was a 1959 718 RSK, chassis 718028. This rare Spyder was one of a handful of RSKs produced in a center seat configuration, and it failed to sell at a final bid of \$3,400,000. If you think you've read that sentence before, it's because you most likely have as this is now the fifth time the car has gone unsold at auction since 2019, with bids consistently in that range. I hate to use the phrase "the market has spoken," but in

this case, I think it has.

Early Porsches, those sold in the '50s and '60s, fared a little better than the uber-expensive cars with a sell-through rate of 59%. The most notable cars being a 1967 911S Soft-Window Targa that hammered at \$265,000 and a 1957 356A Speedster at \$305,000. The Soft-Window Targa was a very nice example finished in Polo Red over Black leatherette with patterned seat inserts. It sold at a final bid of \$265,000, which was good enough to be the second highest price paid for the model in the last twelve months. The 356A Speedster, on the other hand, sold at a below-average price of \$305,000. Although the Green over Tan color combination looked great, the fact that it wasn't finished in its original combo and a non-numbers matching engine meant this one was sold about right.


Other notable sales this month included a 2012 Cayman R 6-speed that sold for a strong \$76,500, a GT3 RS 4.0 at \$762,777, and a number of 996 Turbo Cabriolets, all with the X50 package, and all selling in the low \$60s. The Turbo Cabs. were quite interesting as they represented a bit of a rise in 996 Turbo pricing, even when you factor in the rare X50 package.

Overall, May was a pretty solid month, unless you were trying to sell a Carrera GT. June kicks off with a number of million-dollar-plus Porsches at RM Sotheby's Dare to Dream sale. Let's hope they fare better. Until then!

A further advantage of TB is that it puts more weight [and thus more grip] on the front tires – since the braking causes a weight shift to the front – allowing more cornering force, and therefore more speed than if you are not braking while turning.

You might ask, "Why is it called Trail Braking"? The answer is that 'Trail' can have a meaning as, "as the train went down the tracks, its noise trailed off in the distance." [It got more and more quiet.] Trail braking is the reduction of braking effort as the cornering effort increases, keeping the tires producing their maximum grip the entire way around the turn, and permitting the highest speed possible.

#### Final Thoughts

Track braking wears out brake pads much more quickly than street use does. Inspect the pads often and have another set on hand whenever you attend a track event. Travel with the few tools you'll need to swap them out, including a torque wrench, because 2013 and newer P-cars require you to remove the caliper in order to access the pads. Lastly, if you are going to be tracking the car much at all, you should

flush out the current brake fluid and fill up the system with track-oriented fluid. And you must change the brake fluid, stock or track-oriented, at least once a year. Always have a container of brake fluid on hand.

#### **POSTSCRIPT**

I was at Watkins Glen a few days ago with Metro PCA. My student had no track experience, but he was a very quick learner. He was consistently staying on the proper lines through the corners and applying the brakes smoothly and at the right times. Except that one time he didn't – he didn't leave a safety cushion as described above. The result was that we couldn't stay on the pavement and we caromed off the barrier at the corner exit. Fortunately, there was no mechanical damage to the car – or to us – and he was able to drive home. Unfortunately, there was considerable body damage. Also, he had not bought track insurance, so he will have a hefty repair bill. Get track insurance.

Each mentor worked with a group of students to put the basics together to capture unique images. Ultimately, the best photographs will be selected by the students to be displayed in the museum.

Training the eye to see differently requires practice and direction and it was incredibly gratifying to make suggestions that the students just took in ways that I didn't expect. The students were extremely polite and well mannered, and as the day wore on became bolder in how they executed each assignment. Who knows, maybe this publication will be showing off their efforts in the future! 


