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

It's always about the weather. Our last event was on June 30th and we lucked out. It rained throughout the night and then the next morning, but by the time people were showing up, the weather cleared, and we were able to get the entire event in, totally dry. Thanks to everybody who showed up, as when the weather looks inclement, people tend to stay away. But they didn't this time, and they were rewarded. We

were in the smaller Lot 2 of the Nassau Coliseum and were surprised to find big, blue Ford barricades all over the lot. Fortunately, they were easily moved, and Rich Wayne worked his magic and set up an incredible, fun, and interesting course. It included an added feature of a loop around said barricades, which made for some excitement as you were unable to see where you were going until you got there. It was a great event and here are the results.

So, fifty-two drivers came out to enjoy the course at the School's Out Autocross. Here is how they fared.

Class S3, with one driver, found Massimiliano V in first place with a time of 47.181 seconds. S4, with four drivers was dominated by Andre C with a 42.378 second run to beat out second place Mark V who ran the course in 44.729 seconds. Corrine L came in a close third with a 45.453 second run. Thomas P took the win in S5 with a time of 44.189 seconds while Mitch H took the win in S6, with two drivers, with a time of 43.020 seconds. Vaino N came in first in S8 with a time of 42.661 seconds while S10 was taken by Ray C with a time of 42.319 seconds.

In three driver P3, Michael K took the win with 41.482 seconds to beat Jonathan R whose time of 47.284 seconds was good enough for second place. Michael drove fast enough to earn the Fastest Pax of the Day. Congrats! Dominick T took the win in P4 with a 44.207 second time while course designer Richard W took the win in P5, with two drivers, with a time of 40.781 seconds. P6, with four drivers dominated by Michael C with a time of 41.740 seconds to beat out Dan F, who took the second-place spot, with a time of 41.856 seconds. Third place went to Mark H with a time of 41.983 seconds. It

is notable that the time between first and third was .23 seconds. Wow! That's 23 hundredths of a second. P7 was dominated by Jack M with a time of 44.077 seconds with two drivers while Ed C took the win in P8 with a time of 42.189 seconds. Ben O came back to take the P9 spot with a time of 39.896 seconds. P10 was dominated by Roland L with a time of 48.606 seconds. In our improved class, Tom P took the win with a time of 44.777 seconds.


Our three-driver class of X1 was dominated by Michael C with a time of 42.787 seconds to beat out Marissa K's second-place time of 48.921 seconds. Our largest group, X2, with 11 drivers, found Danny G in first place with a time of 40.160 seconds. Sean M took the second-place spot with a 41.530 second run and Nick S took the third-place spot with a time of 42.846 second run. X3, with 10 drivers, found Jose in first place with a 39.568 second run. This was good enough to earn Jose the fastest time of the day. Congratulations Jose. Paul came in second with a time of 41.509 seconds and Jake took the third-place spot with a time of 43.261 seconds.

That's all for this event. Our next event will be July 28 and then we're back on August 18th. Remember our September 7th event was cancelled. Also, the November 10th event will most likely be changed or cancelled. Please stay tuned for further details.

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






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Eastern Region Update

Track Ramblings

MENTAL IMAGERY

As I recall, it was the winter of 1997 around 2 am, and I was asleep. Then, all of a sudden, I was awakened by an urgent thought: DO NOT DOWNSHIFT FOR TURN 6 AT WATKINS GLEN.

My car at that time was an '84 911 with many mods, including full roll cage, track seats/belts, engine stuff raising power from 200 to 215hp, and a rear

diff change which raised the normal revs at any speed by about 10%. My sleep-awakening Eureka moment revealed to me that I didn't have to shift down from 4th to 3rd gear as I approached Turn 6. I could leave it in 4th, avoid the time delay and potential jerkiness associated with a downshift, and smoothly accelerate towards the toe of the boot (Turn 7).

I came to this realization during a night's sleep!! HOW? Apparently, I was dreaming about being at Watkins Glen that winter's night and my mind was working on a problem: How to drive Turn 6 best.

This takes us to a subject called Mental Imagery, which is living through an action entirely in the mind. Top-level race drivers do this often as part of their regular routines, and it has a very great benefit: You can crash all day long at no expense or injury, and not bend anything. It costs nothing to enter, and you can practice it anywhere and anytime.

Position yourself in a comfortable chair, close your eyes, and imagine you are on a track you've driven before. Now 'visualize' that you are in your track car heading towards Turn 1. Try to populate your imagination with actual landmarks such as trees, fencing, trackside signs, etc. Now decide where your turn-in, apex and track-out points, as well as throttle and braking actions, will be, and start 'driving'. You may soon recognize that your points aren't ideal — maybe you apexed too early and your car is aiming off the track. Conversely, you may have apexed too late and over-slowed (and never got to any track-out point.)

We all daydream – this Mental Imagery is just putting it to practical use. An authority on this is Ross Bentley, who has a long and distinguished career as both a racing driver and track coach/expert. Ross has a large range of books, podcasts, and articles. His free ebook aimed at novices, http://hpde-1st-timer.com is an excellent introduction to track driving, and he has much more material on his Speedsecrets.com website. He is an enormous believer in Mental Imagery as a means to learn how to go faster, safely.

Give it a try! And consider his books and other material; we all do want to improve, yes?

A specific and very useful visualization that I strongly encourage everyone to work on is the 'Power Oversteer on Corner 'exit' problem. This situation occurs typically on a slower-speed corner's exit and is provoked by being too abrupt on the throttle - the rear tires' grip is overwhelmed by the sudden power increase, and the rear 'steps out' in an oversteering moment. The electronic nannies generally kick on and restore normalcy to the moment, but you shouldn't rely on them! Program yourself to instantly move your hands ("fast hands") on the steering wheel a bit to the left, assuming it is a righthand turn. This will reduce the cornering force on the tires and restore stability. Practice this over and over, via Mental Imagery and you'll be prepared to handle this problem when you encounter it on the track. (Oh - and don't lift off the throttle [which is a very difficult habit to break]; getting off the throttle reduces the weight on the rear tires and their grip, which can add to the likelihood of a spin.)

I've mentioned in previous articles about when Derek Bell, a 5-time Le Mans winner, was at a Lime Rock PCA event, and you could buy ½ hour sessions with him in your car. He drove a few laps in my '84 911. One lap on the downhill the car lost rear traction — and 1984 cars had no nannies at all — the car's rear swung to the left and in what seemed LESS than an instant he reduced the amount of steering, the car righted itself and we sped towards Turn 1. It was, at well over 100mph, "poetry in motion", for sure.

Rally for Fun RICH MOOERS - RALLY CHAIR



The annual Vintage Rally was on Sunday July 14th this year. Historically the date of the Vintage Rally has been on the weekend closest to Bastille Day. Bastille Day is France's National Day and is always celebrated on July 14th each year the same day we held the Rally. This should answer the question Do I have to have a Vintage car to enter the Rally? Vintage Rally

refers to vintage wine not cars. This is the reason the rally finishes at the Osprey's Dominion winery and vineyard.

37 Teams started from Exit 58 of the L.I.E. heading east toward the North Fork of Long Island. Creating a Rally I try to include roads seldom traveled by visitors. Many

of the roads are too much fun to drive on and must be included. This year I used a few new roads which were fun to drive traveling through the scenic areas of Long Islands East End.

The Vintage Rally is a "Gimmick" Rally. Like a Tour or a Trek participants follow a specific set of directions taking them from the start to the finish. The difference is that as you are driving each team is asked to answer questions about things along the route. This is not mandatory, but it adds something fun and challenging as you drive. Questions can be easy observations or may require understanding of a set of rules given to answer them correctly.

The competition is not with other teams, it is each team answering the questions the way the Rally Master decides is correct. There are always teams that enjoy looking for easy clues but enjoy driving more than the distraction of answering questions. The most important thing is to have fun. We try to accomplish that with every event.

We are all big F1

fans and while researching dates we realized the British Grand Prix is in the beginning of July!! Our favorite driver is 8-time world champion Lewis Hamilton. Yea, I said 8!! The British Grand Prix is his home race and it's always been a dream of ours to see it. So, it was settled... we're going to England, and the British Grand Prix!! Little did we know this race would go down as one of the most exciting races we have ever seen.

July 3rd, we leave home at around 4 AM for JFK. Take a 7-hour flight from JFK to London Heathrow Airport and head to my friend Kevin and his wife Laura's house in Soham, UK for the night.

July 6th Practice 3 and Qualifying Day!! Wet conditions to start Practice 3. 




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Social Events

Porsche Market Update

DAVID K. WHITLOCK, RIESENTOTER REGION



June's Porsche market looked to strengthen as head into the Summer auction season and it brought our highest sell-through rate thus far this year with 72% of the 590 Porsches on offer selling. And unlike last month. where the top of the market failed to produce results, all three million-dollar cars sold thanks to

RM Sotheby's Dare to Dream collection running at no reserve.

Taking home top honors last month was the 3,500km (~2k miles) 2015 918 Spyder offered in the Dare to Dream collection. This Canadian-market example was finished in Liquid Metal Silver over an Onyx Black leather interior and featured a host of options, and although it was not equipped with the Weissach Package, the extended carbon fiber rear diffuser from the package was fitted to the vehicle using correct factory parts. It sold at a final bid of \$1,700,000 which was on par with comps without-Weissach.

Other notable sales from the collection included an 11,600km (~7k miles) 2004 Carrera GT that brought a winning bid of \$1,175,000 and a 1987 959 Komfort that hammered at \$1,525,000. The 959 was the buy of the sale to me as it was on the lower end of comps yet had been cosmetically restored and upgraded by Canepa to "Phase II" specifications at a cost of \$285,000.

While the 959 represented one of the best buys of the month, the 1965 356 Cabriolet Emory Special was probably my favorite car to cross the online auction block. This recently completed build was finished in a stunning Tropical Green Metallic paint over a Vine Green leather interior and featured a lowered removable hardtop, increased windshield rake, deleted bumpers, rolled rocker panels, and a louvered decklid. Out back, the Rothsport-built 2.6-liter flat-four was good for 260 horsepower, which is a ton for a little 356. It sold at a final bid of \$755,000, which was on par with a few Emory Specials as of late.

Speaking of 356s, the 20 cars on offer had a strong showing with a sell-through rate of 75% and a dollar volume of just over \$4m. Aside from the Emory Special, we had a number of other heavy-hitters sell with a 1959 356A Carrera 1600 GS GT bringing \$575,000, a 1957 356A 1600 Speedster hammering at \$450,000, a 1960 356B Coupe Emory Outlaw at \$385,000, and a 1958 356A 1600S Speedster selling for \$380,000 to round out the top five 356 sales of June.

On the newer side of the market, 992 GT3s appear to have had a rebirth as a number of Tourings found their way above the \$300,000 mark while winged cars continued to hold steady. 992 GT3 RS vehicles continued to be bid at just over \$400k with two out of three examples selling and 992 Dakar remained steady with both units on offer selling around \$350,000.

Other notable cars to cross the block last month included a 1981 924 Carrera GT that failed to sell at a final bid of \$81,500, a modified 1993 911 RS America that hammered at \$155,000 along with another RSA at \$181,500, and a 1995 911 Carrera RS at \$370,000. Overall, a very good month for Porsches at auction.

We'll see what July has to offer as we build up to the big month that is always August. We'll have two sales from Mecum next month along with all of our regular online sales so let's hope that the trend continues after the sluggish start to the year. Until next month.

A final (non-visualization) thought from one of your Co-Chief Instructors who wants to keep you safe and happy: If it's raining on a Track Day, always keep the stability control system ON – in the rain when traction is lost a violent spin usually happens an instant later. Let the electronics earn their pay. They react more quickly than you can, and they can make the car do crash-prevention tricks that you can't, such as individual wheel braking.

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


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




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
