

# Skid reMarks DAN FISHKIND - AUTOCROSS CHAIR



It feels like the end of the season, but it's not! A few days ago we had our first of three final events at Tobay Beach which consisted of the Pumpkins and Pylons Autocross as well as the Metro New York Region Autocross runoff. The weather was quite cooperative, and it seemed more like a cool spring day. One of the few Tobay events that did not require thermals. It seems as though the

weather has been shifting. The end of the season is warmer than it has been, and the beginning of the season starts off a lot colder. Rich Wayne designed the course for the event and as usual did a great job. Since it was the runoff, he had to design a course that was challenging enough for the guys in the runoff while still making it fun for the others. As usual, he did just that. I would like to also thank some guys who don't get enough recognition throughout the season. Jack Minot and Mark Velera have been regulars behind the scenes when things need to be done. Without these guys the program would suffer. These two are very involved in the setup of all the courses as well as the workings of each event. Thank you for all you do.

### Pumpkins and Pylons Results.

Manny G took the win in S5 with a time of 46.820 seconds. S7 was dominated by Steve B who drove the course in 44.752 seconds. Todd R, the previous Autocrosser of the Year, came back and took the win in P2 with a time of 40.343 seconds. P5 found newcomer to autocross Nick I in first place with a time of 41.067 seconds. Mark H took the win in class P6 with a time of 41.686 seconds while Jack M took the win in P7 with a 43.173 second trip around the lot. Ben O found himself in first place with a 39.063 second run. In our improved class, Ioannis K took the win with a 39.097 second run and in our modified class, Tim M took the win with a 38.909 second run.

Non-Porsche classes found Michael C at the helm in X1 with seven drivers, with a time of 38.544 seconds. This time was fast enough to earn him the Fastest Time of the Day. Nice job! Jeffrey B took the second place spot with a time of 39.734 seconds and Christine P came in

third with a 40.185 second run. In X2, with 9 drivers, Anthony C took the win with a time of 38.544 seconds to top Adil A's second place time of 38.593 seconds. Third place went to Danny G who drove the course in 38.702 seconds. X3, with eight drivers, was dominated by Paul V with a time of 38.525 seconds. Paul B took the second place spot in 39.513 seconds and Mark V came in a close third with a time of 40.325 seconds.

### The Runoff:

Eight drivers battled it out in the same car for the title of Autocrosser of the Year. This year the car was a 2024 BMW 430i convertible. Each driver got three runs to drive the course faster than the others. Keep in mind that none of these drivers have driven this car before, so in three runs they had to learn the car, learn the course and then improve on their times. All the drivers did a great job and the competition was tight. When the dust settled, Micheal Kane found himself in the Third Place spot with a time of 45.684 seconds. Yours truly, Dan Fishkind, took the Second Place spot with a 44.545 second trip around the lot and First Place, and the new Autocrosser of the Year, with a time of 44.511 seconds...Andre Cerqueira! Congratulation Andre, nice job! Here is how the rest fared in fourth to eighth order: Mitch Hackett (45.688), Michae Castelli (46.011), Jo Ann Fucci (46.801), Vaino Narma (46.918) and Tom Pacileo (48.704). Congratulations to all.

It's almost the end of the season and our last two Tobay Beach events, the first took place on November 3rd and another coming up on the 17th. The 2025 season is already in the works. The annual Autocross Seminar and Mini School will take place on March 8th, 2025. Registration is open and information for that event can be found in the flyer in this issue. Also look for the March and April 2025 schedule in this issue. If I don't see you before, have a safe winter, get your cars ready and I look forward to seeing you in March.







And just like that, the holiday season will be upon us before you know it. The autocross runoff is now history. I wonder who won? (I'm writing this before the event occurred). There are still two final autocrosses in November at the large lot at Tobay Beach off Ocean Parkway. We held the one on November 3rd and the last one is on the 17th. If you haven't tried an autocross day, this is your final

chance. Come out and have some fun in your Porsche before Mother Nature takes away our fall temperatures. Dan Fishkind runs a great program. Check it out!

We have had a very full season of offerings for Metro members to enjoy. I hope you were able to partake in many during the season. Our volunteer chairs work hard to give you the best bang for the buck. I salute them all. The time is approaching when we must think about winter storage or winter preparations for our cars. I prefer to drive my Cayman year-round, although I store my MGB for the colder months. The Cayman gets a fresh oil change regardless of mileage. An oil analysis is also done

to check my engine's overall health. Blackstone Labs and other companies offer this service. They provide a container to take a sample of your oil. Halfway through the oil drain, fill the container, then ship the sample. Shipping labels are free. In a couple of weeks, you will get a detailed report on metal levels, contaminants, minerals, etc. It's worth the price. About \$35, I believe.

When storing my MGB I do certain steps. Clean the car. Change the oil. Fill with fresh gas and add a fuel stabilizer, such as Sta-Bil. Or use non-ethanol fuel. It's expensive, but stays fresher longer and won't absorb moisture like ethanol does. Overfill your tires to prevent flat spots. I put plastic sheeting or a tarp under my car to provide a vapor barrier and contain any leaks. (This is a British car, after all)! I put dryer sheets in the engine compartment, interior, and exhaust pipes. Rodents don't like the smell of the dryer sheets. Lastly, I cover my air cleaner inlets with plastic bags. Attach a battery tender, then cover the car. These steps are my personal preference. There are certainly others to evaluate. To each their own. My MG seems to like the attention I pay because she starts right up every spring!

That's enough chatter from me for 2024! I hope to see many of you at our holiday party in December. Have a great holiday season, with health and prosperity for us all!

# Track Ramblings

### FRED PACK - DE INSTRUCTOR



### End of Season Thoughts & Tips

During the 2024 season I've been collecting various thoughts about track driving. With Metro's season now finished, I'm presenting my End of Season Thoughts and Tips. Think about these points over the off-season and put them to use next year.

• Driving is more a mental activity than anything else.

The actual things you do are very simple – turn the steering wheel, press on the gas, brake, clutch pedals, and move the shift lever – and you don't even have to do that if you have PDK. Track driving is a mental game.

- Long ago I created the "2 rookie errors"
- 1) don't follow the car ahead of you; why should you duplicate his mistake? Stay on your correct line.
- 2) don't brake the instant the guy ahead of you gets on his brakes. (a) he's ahead of you, so you obviously don't have to brake yet. (b) you should brake at your braking point.
- Find your correct line and stick to it. You should "hit your marks" on every turn the turn-in point, apex, and trackout points, (See the 'Hit the paint' bullet-point below.)
- Be smooth with the controls: Turn the steering wheel, don't jerk it; Press the brake and gas pedals, don't jab them. If you don't have PDK be nice to your gearbox/clutch be smooth and match your revs on downshifts. They will reward you in the months/years to come.
- Be polite to your fellow track mates if a car catches up to you, give it the passing signal. Look in your mirrors, often!

Now onto some technique thoughts

• Since the whole idea is to get better laptimes, focus on getting on the gas earlier in the turn so you can accelerate away faster and sooner. This may mean adjusting the line you take in the turn. A later apex permits an earlier throttle application, but it also means a slower entry speed. You have to find the 'breakeven point'. Equally important is your 'Vmin'. This is your minimum velocity in the turn – you don't want to overslow your car by braking too much. Increasing your Vmin makes a big difference in laptimes.

- There are corners (decreasing radius turns) where the best technique is to add more steering as the corner progresses so you can hit the apex. Consider the left-hander at Lime Rock, or Watkins Glen Turn 9. (I often say to my students, "Keep turning; keep turning").
- 'Visualize' This is the act of seeing something that you can't actually see yet. Think of the apex at Watkins Glen Turn 6 (the downhill left hander before the Toe). You can't see the apex until you are almost there, but you can visualize it in your head before you actually see it and get the car to touch it based on that mental image.
- 'Hit the paint' drive your car slightly onto the painted 'FIA' curbing which exists at most turns' apexes and some turn-in and track-out points. (a) by doing so you've widened the radius of the turn a bit. (b) on righthand turns you can't see the apex at all, but the audio rumble you'll feel if you hit it confirms to you that you have indeed used up all the width of the track. [important side note: do not hit the paint in the wet!! It is amazingly slippery.]
- Speaking of rain which I'll write about in more detail in a future column (a) be particularly smooth with your use of all the controls on a wet track. Abrupt steering, braking and gas application can cause you to lose traction and have an instant spin. (b) 'Square off the turn' by taking the 'rain line'. Stay tuned for that future column.
- Check your fuel level before each run. I attended the Metro Lime Rock event in October. There was a driver who ran out of gas, which wasted about 5 minutes of everyone else's track time. What a Dumbo! Can you guess who it was? It was me. At least the driver had the good sense to get off line so there was no danger to anyone. Check your fuel level before each run. Make this a ritual.

### Some Pre-event stuff:

- o Check your brake pads and oil before each event and also at the track. Ps: bring pads and oil to the track! And have appropriate tools with you.
- o You must have a tow hook installed on your car at the event

### For Instructors:

o Look at the right-side mirror often. Your student is likely overwhelmed and doesn't have the mental bandwidth available to check the mirrors. It is on you to make sure that the student gives passing signals as and when needed.

# Rally for Fun RICH MOOERS - RALLY CHAIR



On Sunday, February 2, 2025, Metro Region of the Porsche Club of America will present the 69th Annual Ted Ohland Snowflake Road Rally. It is reported to be the oldest continuously run event in PCA. I have served as Rally Master for the Metro Region since 2014 and have used the knowledge Ted imparted to me continue the tradition. Last year

we had a perfect weather day. Ninety enthusiastic participants joined the rally course on the scenic roads on the South Fork of Long Island. The best time to enjoy the Hamptons is in the winter minus the traffic.

The Snowflake will be a TSD (time speed distance) rally. Each team starts with a set of route instructions. It is easy to follow the route because the instructions have two ways to verify the correct way to go. For example, Right at TL (abbreviation for Traffic Light) to take Main Road. The navigator (the person not driving) is encouraged to use GPS with maps to assist in confirming that you are taking the correct road. Snowflake was known and revered as one of the most challenging rallies to compete in in the past. But a well-designed rally never intended a competitor to get lost. Snowflake today is presented as a fun drive with a chance to compete (on not) by trying to maintain speeds as you follow the route.

How do you maintain the speeds? The rally route instructions are divided into sections. Each section has a start and end. When you start a section, the speed you are asked to maintain as you proceed is specified in the instructions, usually 30 MPH. While traveling at 30 MPH it will take 2 minutes to complete one mile. So, if you have traveled 3.5 miles it should have taken 7 minutes to complete it. Expert competitors calculate the time they should pass each milage in the route instructions. Most competitors use the SOP ("Seat of Pants") method. They just try to maintain the 30 MPH speed as they travel. But you have to remember that if you must slow down for a stop sign or are given extra time at a TL you need to adjust your speed to account for these time adjustments.


As each Competitor travels the route, we can track your progress using the Richta Rally phone App. It records when you start each section and when you pass a Checkpoint. A Checkpoint is a place along the route where the APP records the exact time you pass and compares it to the calculated time you should pass. The difference between the times is the score of how accurately you maintained the speed.

If anyone is interested in the methods teams can use to calculate how to know exactly what time they pass each point please contact me. I will be happy to set up a class to explain the most effective methods.

The bottom line is that to have an enjoyable time on the Snowflake (or any) Rally you just have to decide if you want to worry about the whole "time-speed-distance" thing or not. It is all about a day enjoying a fun drive and reaching the finish to have a nice lunch with old and new friends.

# **Driver's Education**

**BRANDON TASSO - DE CHAIR** 



Tires, Tires, Tires!

Coming from an autocross background, I learned early on that your tires are one of the most important your components of vehicle. We've had a Prius put down the fastest time of the day at an Autocross by putting slicks on the car. Tires are the only component of your car that actually connects you to the track surface...Let's dive in!

I run 19" wheels on my 997.2 GTS so my tire options are limited. As far as tires I have used on the track... here is the list. (Don't tell my wife LOL). Michelin Pilot Sport 4S, Michelin Pilot Sport Cup 2, Falken Azenis RT660, Goodyear Eagle F1 Supercar 3R, Hoosier R7, and A7. Here are my thoughts on each of those ON THE TRACK. Pilot Sport 4S: These are the OEM tires for my car. They offer good traction for beginners but once you start pushing them in the dry, they overheat very quickly. I use these as my rain tires as they move quite a bit of water and have kept me out of the wall when I spun at Mid-Ohio. Search LastPlaceAgainn on YouTube for a video of that.

Pilot Sport Cup 2: A great step up from the 4S in dry weather performance and ability to withstand quite a bit of heat. In my opinion, they are actually OK in the wet as long as there aren't substantial amounts of standing water. That is why these get my vote for attending a track day without a trailer.

Falken Azenis RT660: While these are predominantly autocross tires, they are marketed as track day tires. I have had the displeasure of using these twice on the track. There is a seam that goes across these tires from inside to outside. The first time that seam came apart on me was at Summit Point when they were BRAND NEW! A chunk the size of a quarter came off exposing the inner wall of the tire to all sorts of potential hazards—the 2nd time I was forced to run these when I unexpectedly corded a set of tires. After 3 sessions on the RT660's, I started feeling a bad wobble in the wheel. I thought it was just some pickup (discarded rubber on the track) on the tire, but after two laps the wobble was still there. I went into

the pits and looked at the tires. Lo and behold a HUGE blister on the inside of the rear tire!! No impact, no off-roading. The tire simply got too hot and self-destructed. I DO NOT RECOMMEND these for track use.

Goodyear's F1 Supercar 3R: When taking into consideration cost, grip, and durability, this is my preferred tire choice for dry weather. They have incredible grip, are about \$700 cheaper per set than Cup 2's (in my size), and hold up almost as well in terms of heat cycles.

Hoosier A7 and R7: Both of these tires offer outstanding dry-weather performance! Nothing grips like a slick! They will undoubtedly take 1-2 seconds off your lap times in the right conditions. I find the A7s heat up quickly but overheat quickly as well. The R7s take a few laps to come up to temp but after that, they are fantastic. I've run R7s for over 20 heat cycles at maximum attack— while on track the tire failed but in the nicest way. I heard a slight "Pop" sound and watched my TPMs slowly drop 1 PSI at a time. I limped it back to the pits with zero issues. The side wall is so strong the rim never even got close to the asphalt. I would highly recommend the R7s for anyone looking to run slicks.

Pressures: On most tires, my goal is 33 PSI hot. I typically go up 8-10 PSI the first session of the day so I will usually start my tires around 24 PSI back left, 25 front left and back right, and 26 front right (on a clockwise track layout). Rotate: As most of the tracks in our region are clockwise, it is imperative to the longevity of your tires that you rotate! I usually rotate my tires after every track day to ensure equal abuse. Lol.

# Driver's Education TOMMY RENDANO - METRO TREASURER



On a recent trip to Florida, my wife and I decided to stop at the RUF North America Facility in Opa Locka, Florida. It was a bit of a challenge entering the facility since it is located inside The Concours Club, which is privately owned and operated and requires a membership ID to enter through the closed gates. However, as we plotted our entrance, we spotted a new

911 Turbo S driving along

the outer perimeter of the Club and decided to tag along (not recommended). As it turned out, there was a back entrance to the Club/Track so I followed the Turbo into the facility. He also directed me to the RUF Auto Loft location.

Since it was a Monday, it was very quiet inside The Concours Club grounds. We parked outside RUF's Auto Loft Garage and found the door was locked. We rang the bell and were greeted by Esteban Larranaga, the Account Executive for North America.

I introduced myself and my wife and explained we were Porsche folks interested in visiting the facility. Esteban invited us in and gave us a private tour of all the RUF cars on display, explaining in detail the specs of the cars on hand along with the history and evolution of the various models.

His knowledge and expertise were superb. One of my favorites was a 1987 Black on Green CTR1 - wide body (also known as the Yellow Bird) which was one of two made in widebody variant, all the other 29 icons were narrowbody. Another model that stood out was an Ultraviolet color RUF SCR, a carbon fiber-built body attached to a proprietary RUF-developed carbon monocoque frame. The car weighs in at around 2,700 pounds with 510 hp. The mechanics and engineering of this RUF-designed vehicle are mind-boggling.

While the era of body-in-white RUF VIN stamped chassis is no longer in existence, the future of the brand's rearengine models will be on this carbon fiber monocoque chassis. This design makes RUF the only manufacturer

with a rear-engine, carbon tub, manual vehicle (CGT was mid-engine and 918 is mid-engine, hybrid, and PDK) with dual-wishbone pushrod suspension in the front and the rear. These are the only two of the 10 magnificent RUF cars in their meticulously well-kept garage.

Upstairs was a beautifully appointed lounge area overlooking a two-and-a-half-mile track. Alongside the lounge was an outside viewing area with seating where you could observe Club Members' race. As we approached the end of our visit, Esteban suggested we visit on a Wednesday through Saturday schedule so we would be able to watch the racing and other activities inside The Club. With that, we thanked our gracious host for the time he spent with us and we were on our way.



o The instructor must never stick a hand outside the window. Only the driver should do that. You can always tell the student to give a passing signal when appropriate. • Lastly, an interesting - and useful - fun fact: All tires have their date of manufacture on them. It is generally accepted that tires which are 7 or more years old should be discarded. The rubber is no good anymore. (Track tires get worn out from use long before then.) The date is shown on the tire in a way to confuse everyone! Firstly, it is not labeled in any way and is inside a kind of oval. Look for a 4-digit number standing by itself. You might expect it would be MMYY, or maybe YYMM. Nope! It is WWYY, where WW is the Week Number within the

year, so '0224' would mean the second week of 2024. My rack tires say '0324', ie, the 3rd week of 2024, meaning January 2024. The tires on my Boxster say '2424', ie, the 24th week of 2024, meaning June 2024.

I'll see you next year at the track. Use the offseason wisely - read material which will help you learn more, and think about how to drive on the track. I suggest checking out Ross Bentley's SpeedSecrets.com material. He knows a lot and he communicates it very well.

Date codes: If you don't already know this, your tire tells you when it was manufactured. On the side wall you will see the letters DOT followed by 3 groups of letters/ numbers. The last group will be all numbers and that is the date code. The first 2 numbers are the week and the last 2 are the year. For example, 3119 would mean they were made the 31st week of 2019. Which brings me to my final point. These are too old. This is the date code on

one tire I recently received from Tire rack. All others were 2023 or newer. That 2019 tire was corded while there was still plenty of tread left on the other tires. So, make sure you check your date codes!! Thank you for reading my nonsense this year.

#### **Porsche Market Update**

After a stellar August, the Porsche market a rough patch September, with only 63% of the 651 offered Porsches finding buyers, totaling \$29,632,420. This 63% sell-through rate is the lowest since I began tracking the market in 2022, with some days dipping into the 30% range.

However. not all models followed this trend. Several cars exceeded recent averages, and a few even set new twelve-month highs. Notably, a 53,000-mile 1988 911 Carrera Targa M491 fetched a final bid of \$170,000. This Black-on-Black Turbo-body Targa last sold in August 2022 for \$92,500—quite a return for just two years of ownership.

Short-wheelbase 912s have seen a resurgence over the past few months, jumping from an average of \$34,000 in April to nearly \$52,000 today. That's impressive, but pales in comparison to the \$72,000 an Ivory White 1968 912 Coupe brought in after being bought as a project just a few years ago.

In the modern market, 992 GT3s struggled, with most selling well below the \$233,000 average. A 4,100-mile example set a new low, hammering at \$212,000. While no manual winged cars sold this month, several 6-speed Tourings crossed the block, and these proved to be highly spec-dependent. A PTS car in China Grey with 2,300 miles brought \$327,000, while another PTS in Superior Red, with fewer miles, sold for just \$260,000.

993 Turbos also softened, with every example falling below the \$274,000 average we had going into September. The best deal came from a Polar Silver over Black 1996 911 Turbo with 28,000 miles. Despite questions around the mileage, the car presented well and sold for a final bid of \$198,000—far below average.

The weakest-performing model line, however, was the 356 market. Of the 19 cars on offer, only 26% found buyers. Those that did sell were offered at softer prices, with some great deals to be had. A 1960 356A Super

90 Roadster, for example, went for \$169,000. The car lacked its original engine but had recently undergone restoration. Even without the numbers-matching engine, this price was an absolute steal.

October has so far mirrored September's trends, but several big auctions, including Bonhams' Audrain Concours sale and Broad Arrow's Chattanooga Auction, are still on the horizon. We'll see if these events can help turn the tide as August's did. Until then, we wait.

# PCA Octoberfest 2024 Stephen Landau - GUEST CONTRIBUTOR

The morning was brisk. I emerged from the garage as Adam Schaefer pulled into my driveway in his light-yellow Porsche 911. As he stepped out of the car, he was dressed head to toe in the traditional German dance garb of his troop, GTEV Die Gemuetlichen Enzianer. Claudia Schaefer emerges from the car like we've woken her from a deep slumber. We are on our way to Metro PCA's annual Oktoberfest an event filled with familiar faces, fun cars, food, and some judging (of cars, I promise). We wait for Thomas Moehringer to arrive in his equally blinding lime green 911. The pair are affectionately known as skittles. It's my second year attending this event. Last year was a bit of a rainy affair but it was still enjoyable mostly due to the company.

The drive to the Vanderbilt Museum is a short one. It's befitting that this beautiful residence has been the backdrop to PCA's concours for more than 40 years. William K. Vanderbilt II was himself, a motor racing enthusiast. In 1904 he set a land speed record in a German-built Mercedes 90. With his in-line 4-cylinder Mercedes, pushing 90 Hp, Willie beat out Henry Ford, reaching 92mph. That same year he started the Vanderbilt Cup, which led to the development of the Long Island Motor Parkway. The world's first expressway and a road entirely built to combat the dangers of spectator injury and to allow for safe motor racing by replacing intersections with bridges and only open to motor vehicles to avoid all the horse sh\*t of the times. Quite literally.

We arrive at the staging area. I instantly notice Bob DeMotta. If you don't know Bob, you haven't been to a Metro event. Bob is handing out the paperwork for full concours judging. Which my car is not going into. So, I found Paul Celentano, who directed me to the street entry forms. With forms filled and pleasantries handed out, we start to line up to the concours lawn. The parking lot narrows to an old cobblestone pathway just wide enough for a modern vehicle. The path leads up a small hill and as we make the descent the view is stunning. The grass on the hill empties into the Northport Bay. Houses on the narrow stretch of Asharoken are in view and in the distance, past the Long Island sound, is Connecticut. It's no wonder the Vanderbilt's chose this location for their

Everyone is directed to park their cars. There's a loose design to it. Water-cooled with water-cooled, early cars together. A grouping of the flat 4, 356's by the dining tent. After all the staging, everyone mingles and is encouraged

to stand near their car and wait for the judges. Paul Celentano, VP of Metro PCA, had the idea of turning the concours into an Oktoberfest event. "The other important change he made was to allow folks to do "display only" rather than competing in the full or street competition. The reason was twofold, one get more cars on the lawn and two get these members to see the judging so that they might compete the next time they come." I watch as the judges scrutinize the vehicles and I wonder about who decides to judge, so I ask Paul again "Several senior members, like Charlie Mckeel who has judged nationally, Mike Allegra, and Tommy Rendano have always stepped up. What we have been doing is slowly bringing in young blood as they grow interested, to initially shadow these senior experienced judges and then be part of the team."

In the distance, you can hear the sounds of Die Spitzbuam band starting up and people began to trickle into the dining tent soon after the traditional Bavarian dance club starts to perform. GTEV Die Gemuetlichen Enzianer was founded in 1931. A traditional Bavarian clothing and dance club with about 180 members, spanning four generations. The third most decorated club in competitions taking place since 1967. The dancing members of the day were Adam Schaefer, Christian Schaefer, Jack Kemperle, Michele Payne-Nixon, Sabine Doedee, and Evelyn Mutarelli. It's enjoyable to watch them twirl and hop. It's not often you get the chance to see traditional dancing.

The band plays on and food is served. Bratwurst, sauerkraut, pretzel buns and loads of veggies. We take our plates and find a comfortable spot on the lawn we couldn't have asked for a nicer day. The sounds of laughter, music, and chit-chat fade into the background as the view of the sound and over a hundred Porsches fill the landscape. I bid my farewell as judging started since I had my son's soccer game to watch. But I learned of the results and was happy to hear that my buddy, Thomas Moehringer won second place thanks to all the time Claudia and I spent helping him clean it up. So, it's a win for all.



While every Porsche is special, some tend to be a bit more so. For the 993, the Turbo/Turbo S were the ultimate expressions of the air-cooled, road-going 911, delivering blistering acceleration on a level that is impressive even by today's standards. 
