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



So, here we are at the start of the 2025 Autocross season. While it's still a bit early to share the Nassau Coliseum events, you'll find a flyer in this issue with the opening schedule for Tobay Beach.

We'll kick off the season on March 8th with an Autocross seminar and mini driving school. The event will be held in the Community Room of the Bethpage Community

Park's roller-skating rink. Afterward, we'll head to Tobay Beach, where we'll set up mini driving school. During this session, you'll get to drive a real autocross course with your own instructor. Beforehand, you'll be treated to a course walk, where the course will be dissected, and you'll learn how to read the driving line.







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Track Ramblings FRED PACK - DE INSTRUCTOR



More End of Season Thoughts

Metro's end of season track event was held at Summit Point, West Virginia on November 1-2. The weather was glorious both days – a little cold in the morning but lovely in the afternoon. It was an excellent event. 'West Virginia' seems like it must be very far from NYC, but it is less than you might think – it's about 5 hours

from Manhattan to the track.

Your Car

Getting down to business: The first thing that should be on your mind about the end of track season is getting your car ready for the 2025 season, which means having it serviced stem to stern by a high-quality Porsche specialist organization. My view is that you should work with a Porsche-oriented, track-focused shop rather than a Porsche dealership, where they aren't usually involved in track activities. (Also, dealerships won't let you bring in parts that you have bought elsewhere, so you can end up paying much more.) Many of these indie shops advertise in the Metro POST magazine, and you can get advice from fellow PCA members on what shop(s) to use. It is essential to get a full engine oil change and brake fluid flush. If you are even semi-serious about your DE involvement, you should have track brake pads installed and use track brake fluid - these are designed to work well at the very high temperatures encountered in track use. Also, you should consider having more negative camber dialed into the suspension. Not only will it prolong the life of the tires, it will provide better handling. Don't overlook the car's various filters. They have probably picked up a lot of dirt and should be cleaned.

<u>You</u>

It is worthwhile to use the winter months thinking about your driving technique. Over the years I have mentioned what I call The Two Main Rookie Errors: these are (1) Don't follow the line of the car right ahead of you. He may well be in a bad line and have no more experience than you! Drive YOUR line, the one you've been working on. You don't want to follow the other guy off into the weeds, do you? (2) Don't start braking when you see the brake

lights of car ahead of you come on. For one thing, he is ahead of you, so you very likely haven't reached your Start of Braking Point; you should start braking at YOUR correct point.

I recently added a 3rd Main Rookie (and non-rookie) Error to my list: If you have to increase the amount of steering once you are past a turn's apex, you have made an error — it would mean that at the moment you want to be adding power to accelerate, that in reality you are adding to the sharpness of the turn and thus reducing your speed potential. Find a line through the turn that lets you keep or even reduce the amount of steering after the apex! I've often mentioned Ross Bentley. He is a distinguished writer/thinker about track driving and he publishes articles and books all the time about it — some of them are free. I really encourage my readers to take a look at his website, speedsecrets.com.

Braking

Modern cars, particularly Porsches, have excellent brakes which can bring a car down very quickly even from high speeds. We all have a 'fear instinct' which makes us want to start braking early in spite of our knowledge about our car's excellent brakes. The way to begin to surmount that instinct is to determine an initial braking point for each turn and then to brake a moment later on successive laps until you feel you can't brake any later and still have adequate control over the car. Also, you have to experiment with the brakes to get a sense of how effective they are. The term often used is "threshold braking." The "threshold" is that amount of braking which is the maximum your car can provide. (Before the era of ABS - computer-controlled braking - the threshold was between maximum braking with the wheels still rotating, and 'lockup' when the tires aren't rotating and are simply sliding across the track, not only giving much less braking but also scraping off much of the tires' surface.) I always encourage my students to perform a certain experiment on a long straightaway: First discuss the plan with your instructor if you have one onboard; then look in your rearview mirror to be sure no other car is anywhere near you. Then Press - don't jab - the brake pedal HARD for maybe a second. I think you will be amazed at how effective your brakes are. Use this knowledge to gain confidence on how to use the brakes effectively on the track.

Cornering:

The key to being able to corner at maximum speed is to follow the correct line through the turn, which means (1) to utilize the entire width of the track, and (2) to have the widest possible arc linking the three points which every turn has - the Turn-in, Apex and Track-out points. Two things to consider - (1) use the cones (if there are any) as your guide to the location of those 3 points; (2) drive over the striped painted 'FIA' curbing area which tracks typically have on most turns. You will feel a slight rumble when you do this, and this will confirm that you have truly used up the full width of the track. The majority of turns on most tracks are righthand, which means that you cannot see the apex as it approaches. Consequently, that rumble is useful. [note: do not drive on the painted area if the track is wet. It is amazing how bad the grip is on the painted area!!]

<u>Mistakes</u>: Everyone makes them, even Hamilton. Don't be hard on yourself. The instant one happens you should go into 'how do I get out of here safely?' mode. Adjust


your line, use the brakes. In a manual transmission car, remember the adage "in a spin, both feet in." And don't fight the car – that usually just makes the situation worse. If it's going off the pavement, let it go off the pavement. Hopefully there is enough run-off room. The inside guardrails at Watkins Glen Turn 10 and Lightning Turn 1 testify to the result of fighting to get the car back on the track. Usually, your best bet is to let the car slow down in the straightest line possible.

Final thoughts:

Over the off-season, think about the tracks you experienced in 2024 and "daydream" about them. Close your eyes, "drive" a few laps and "visualize." Think about how good (or not) your laps are. Verstappen and Norris are doing this very often.

I'll see you in the Spring.





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

We expect to see General Needs personnel attend select 2025 events. As is customary, our Club donation will be presented at the 2025 Holiday party.











Porsche Market Update

The final month of 2024 capped off a dynamic year in the Porsche market, with December achieving solid 70% sellthrough rate, marking a slight uptick from November's 69%. A total of 462 cars crossed the auction block, generating dollar volume of \$30,340,029. While this represents a dip from the \$36,536,798

seen in November, it underscores strong demand for Porsche vehicles as the year wound down. Notable highlights included a 2005 Carrera GT claiming the top sale at \$1,395,000, alongside a noticeable resurgence in the 356 market, which finally saw some deals close. As we transition into 2025, these results reflect a resilient and evolving market, with specific segments showing renewed strength.

The 356 market ended the year on a high note, with a strong 75% sell-through rate and a total dollar volume of \$955,000 across 12 units. Among the standout sales was a 1957 356A Coupe, restored in 2011 and finished in stunning Sahara Beige with a Burgundy interior. The restoration featured paintwork by the Paterek Brothers and included a 1,720cc replacement engine. This exceptional example achieved \$136,000, surpassing the \$133,000 average. Another notable result was a 1960 356B 1600S Roadster, a single-family-owned gem for 62 years. Though it failed to close in October at \$126,500, it found a new home this month for \$136,000. Refinished in Red with a Grey interior, this driver-quality example sold at the lower end of the market, below the \$190,000 average. These results highlight the continued appeal of well-maintained and unique 356 models, with both highend restorations and solid drivers finding eager buyers. The 911 Carrera 3.2 market closed out the year with an impressive performance, boasting an 86% sell-through rate and generating \$1,587,770 from 21 units. Among the notable results was a 1989 911 Speedster finished in Triple Black, though the interior had been changed to Black during its life. With only 8,000 miles on the odometer, questions about the mileage history didn't deter bidders, as it achieved \$220,000. This result sits above the \$214,000 average and lands in the middle of comparable sales for similar mileage. Another standout was a 1989 911 Carrera 3.2 Coupe, also in Triple Black, with a 5-speed manual transmission and just 27,000 miles. This pristine example commanded \$138,000, significantly outperforming the twelve-month average of \$80,600. Not only was it a top-five sale in the last year, but it also led comps in terms of mileage. These results underscore the strength of late-production 3.2 Carreras, particularly low-mileage examples in desirable specifications.

The 718 market showcased some divergent trends as 2024 concluded. The 718 Spyder RS saw renewed interest, with a 2024 model featuring Porsche's Weissach Package, finished in Shark Blue with Satin Magnesium wheels and just 479 miles, achieving \$225,000. This marks the highest price for the Spyder RS since the first example hit the market in July, signaling a potential upturn for this exclusive variant. In contrast, the 718 Cayman GT4 RS market faced continued softness. A 2024 model with 1,500 miles closed at \$207,000, pulling the average further down from \$270,000 at the beginning of the year to \$209,000 this month. Selling below the current average, this result highlights the cooling demand for what was once a hotly pursued model.

Meanwhile, the GTS 4.0 Boxsters and Caymans, the only non-GT 718s equipped with a naturally aspirated engine, continued to draw steady interest around the \$80,000 mark. A 2021 Cayman GTS 4.0 sold for \$79,000, a 2021 Boxster GTS 4.0 fetched \$80,500, while another Cayman GTS 4.0 failed to sell at \$78,718. These results suggest a stable market for these enthusiast favorites, offering accessible entry points for Porsche purists.

As the final numbers rolled in, 2024 proved to be a robust year for the Porsche market, closing with a total sell-through rate of 68%, \$493,350,995 in dollar volume, and 7,235 units sold. This marks a significant increase in units over 2023, which saw 6,707 units sold at a slightly higher 70% sell-through rate and a total dollar volume of \$479,107,514. While the year started on a slower note, December's strong sell-through rate capped it off with momentum, setting an optimistic tone for 2025. The new year kicks off with plenty of action, including Mecum's

Kissimmee sale and Arizona Car Week, which are sure to set the stage for what promises to be another exciting year in the Porsche market.
