

s our largest HPDE season to date draws to a close, I would like to take a moment to reflect. 2025 was my first full season as Track Chair... technically, I started in 2024, but I was still learning the ropes, with my fantastic DE Team providing valuable assistance along the way. This year, I took the reins and aimed to make a positive difference in our program.

Many may not realize that renting tracks and hosting DE events is incredibly costly, and honestly, it's frightening. If turnout isn't strong, it could jeopardize the future of our DE program and have serious financial impacts on the club. As track chair, it's my responsibility to craft the schedule, and I take that role very seriously.

During the "off season," I work hard to secure appealing dates by negotiating with tracks to get us the best possible slots. It's been more challenging than I expected, juggling requests for weekend versus weekday events, all while dealing with the hefty costs involved. Tracks typically charge almost twice as much on weekends, so we must decide how

to price events without knowing exactly how many attendees we will have. We rely on previous data for guidance, but every year brings different results.

This season, we introduced some exciting new offerings:

- **1.** A car control clinic at Lime Rock, helping drivers sharpen skills on the skid pad and autocross track
- **2.** Joint events with other PCA regions for more variety
- **3.** A "Twilight" evening event at Watkins Glen
- **4.** New tracks added to our lineup, like Palmer and VIR

The Challenge from For-Profit Organizations

There are several for-profit companies running DE programs, often emphasizing thrills and profits over safety and accountability. Our motto at Metro NY PCA's DE events is simple: "Winning DE means bringing you and your car home in one piece." Our goal is to foster a safe and welcoming

environment for everyone looking to improve their driving skills.

Why It's More Challenging for Metro NY PCA

Our region faces unique hurdles:

- 1. No dedicated home track. Unlike other PCA regions, we don't have a primary track we mostly use, so traveling to tracks is necessary
- **2.** Much to do nearby. With so many summer activities like beaches, boating, city trips, wineries, museums, festivals, and more, we're competing for your limited free time
- **3.** Short summer season. Our prime driving months are limited, and we're competing with numerous other leisure options
- **4.** Last-minute decision-making. We New Yorkers like to wait until the last minute to commit. I remember signing up for my first DE a week before the event, which I thought was plenty of time, but it's not. We need instructors for every student, and instructors don't grow on trees



Although the season is not over, this will be my last article for the year. I am pleased to report that our most recent event, Pumpkins and Pylons and Runoff Autocross, was a success. This event was attended by sixty drivers, the largest turnout we've had this season. The big draw was the freshly paved Tobay Beach parking lot, which was smooth like glass with great grip. Luckily, the weather was amazing as well, making for a perfect autocross day.


This event is special because it combines the regular Pumpkins and Pylons Autocross with the season runoff, which is also taking place while the autocross is running. If you're not aware of what the runoff is, all season, each driver earns points, and the top drivers at the end of the season all compete. The runoff pits the top drivers against each other, all in the same car. This levels the playing field since faster drivers don't always get the fastest

times because they might have slower cars. The skill here is to get into a car you have never driven before, learn how the car drives, adjust your driving to accommodate the characteristics of the car, navigate a course you have only just seen that morning, stay on course without hitting cones, and turn the fastest time in only three runs. So, as you can imagine, it takes a lot more than just driving to be successful. I know you are all on the edge of your seats waiting to hear the results of the runoff, so I will not make you wait any longer.

But first, we will pause for a word from our sponsor. Actually, we will pause so I can talk about our sponsor. I would like to thank Habberstad BMW and Mini for supplying the car for the runoff. Demitri Mirissis and Charlie Klee were instrumental in providing a 2022 Mini Cooper S for the event. It was a fun car to drive and did not disappoint. I must say it was one of the better cars that we have had in the past few years. Hab-

berstad BMW and Mini have been a big presence at our events this year and I want to thank all the guys for coming down. And now back to our regularly scheduled program.

Eight drivers participated in this year's runoff, and here's how it unfolded. After three runs, Michael Castelli secured the third-place spot, or second runner-up, with a time of 52.312 seconds. The first runner-up, or second-place spot, belonged to yours truly, with a time of 51.616 seconds. This was just .696 seconds ahead of Michael and .712 seconds from first place. Andre Cerqueira, who earned the title of Autocrosser of the Year for the second consecutive year, took the top spot with a time of 50.904 seconds. Congratulations to Andre on a job well done! Honorable mention goes to the other season finalists who made it into the runoff: Mitch Hackett, Jo Ann Fucci, Mark Hill, Corrine Lenoble, Michael Castelli, Nick Inzerilli, and Rich Wayne.

Manny G took the S2 win in his Boxster S with a time of 53.064 seconds. Thomas P placed first in S5 in his Cayman at 48.219 seconds, while John B secured the S6 win in his 718 Boxster S with a 51.105 second run around the course. In S8, Jeffrey G guided his GT4 to first place in 47.068 seconds.

The P Classes featured close competition and several notable performances. David L drove his 914 to the P1 victory in 55.755 seconds. In P2, Michael K captured the win in his 911 SC in 45.759 seconds, ahead of Corrine L in her Boxster at 51.762 seconds. Michael's time was good enough to earn him the fastest PAX of the day. Congratulations. Rich W earned the P3 win in his Boxster with a 45.389 second run, followed by Mieles M, who drove the course in 49.273 seconds. The largest Porsche field of the day, P4, saw Dan F take first place in his Cayman with 46.505 seconds, Anthony H came in second in his C2 in 47.187 seconds, and Louie A took third in his Cayman at 49.239 seconds. Graham M topped P5 in his 986 with 46.359 seconds, Michael C posted the day's fastest Porsche run at 44.664 seconds to win P6, and Michael W led P7 in his Macan GTS with 52.853 seconds. Jonathan S won the Improved class in his 996 C4S with 48.339 seconds, and Gary M took Modified class in his Cayman with 44.997 seconds.

The non-Porsche classes added variety and tight racing throughout the day. The X1 class produced a close three-way battle, with Greg S winning in his CRX at 46.351 seconds, Mark M finishing second in his Miata at 46.555 seconds, and Jeffrey B third at 47.180 seconds. In X2, Daniel S led the S2000 group with 44.951 seconds, followed by Anthony C at 45.305 seconds and Danny G at 45.937 seconds. The X3 class concluded the competition, with Evan T driving his STI to first at 44.560 seconds, Jonathan W placing second in his Mustang at 44.666 seconds, and Demetrios S finishing third at 46.367 seconds.

By the time you read this, the season will be over. Next year is in the works with the Autocross Seminar and Mini-School, scheduled for March 7. Please see the flyer in this issue, as well as a flyer with the season's first events.

I am looking forward to seeing you all next year. Have a great holiday season.





The Revarding Road update on Metro ny region pca 2025 CHARITY, GENERAL NEEDS LTD.

s we wind down 2025, I'd like to provide an update on our year-long activities with our 2025 supported charity, General Needs Ltd.

As reported at the beginning of 2025, this year, the Metro NY Region PCA is supporting General Needs LTD, a non-profit organization focused on serving Veterans. General Needs Ltd. (generalneeds. org) is an all-volunteer 501(C)(3) non-profit founded in 2008 that supports the New York tri-state area veterans housed in emergency and transitional housing facilities, many of whom suffer from PTSD, Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI), and other mental. psychological, physical, and addictive conditions. General Needs' Mission: To provide necessities that are missing in the everyday lives of our homeless veterans, veterans in need, and their families. This mission has now grown into assisting veterans in finding housing where needed, as well as programs focused on suicide awareness and prevention, mental health, and dental benefits.

Firstly, thank you to all members who generously donated to Metro's 2025 Charity Fund for General Needs. Many of you may have met Lonnie and/or Susan Sherman of General Needs at various Metro

events. (Club BBQ, Keels and Wheels, Vintage Rally, and others). When in attendance, they explain their mission, programs, and the important issues facing veterans.

General Needs distributes most of their giveaways to veterans through organized events, called Standdowns. I was fortunate when Lonnie invited me to attend one of their Stand-downs at the Hauppauge Dennison Building to see what they do. When I arrived, I was stunned to find a large group of veterans standing in organized lines, patiently waiting to receive food, produce, bags of pet food, boots, gloves, hats, and other essentials. Other charitable organizations donate some of the giveaways, such as Island Harvest, L.I. Cares, PSEG, and National Grid, I asked Lonnie how I could help. He put me to work helping these veterans, some of whom were elderly and/or needed canes to walk or were in wheelchairs, gather their giveaways, and assist them in carrying their goods to their cars. While helping them on these lines, I spoke with the vets about their service histories, some of whom had served as far back as the Korean War. Although struggling physically and/or financially, they were all proud of their service and thankful for the donations.

As I write this article, I know Lonnie and Susan are planning their big event of the year, the Veterans Day Boot Project. Their selfless hard work and dedication to veterans is amazing. Lonnie, Susan, and all the volunteers always thank the vets, saying (and it is a worthy reminder): "We are here because you served."

As is customary, our Club donation to General Needs will be presented at our 2025 Holiday party. I know they will put our donation to good use.

Finally, we are in the process of identifying a worthy charity to support in 2026. We prefer a relatively small charity that primarily provides benefits to the Metro NY area, and we welcome input from our membership. Please let me know if you have any suggestions.

We departed Fairbanks, beginning our trip south again, staying overnight at Whitehorse on the Alaska Highway. The next day, we ended up in Stewart, BC, next to Hyder (the southernmost part of Alaska, famous for bears actively catching Salmon along the river). We passed Bear Glacier, where it emptied into Strohn Lake (see picture). The last time I saw it (on the 2002 Alcan 5000), the glacier went all the way to the lake. What a difference now. It is so much smaller. We headed south, stopped near Kasan Village to see Totem poles, and spent the night in Smithers. It was an easy day (only 300 miles). We finally had time to meet with other competitors for dinner and parking lot stories. The last day included the most difficult competitive TSD (time, speed, distance) section of the event. Miles of unpaved roads traverse steep hills and feature tight hairpin turns. I fully maximized the 4x4 drive in the Ford Bronco. The event ended for me as we approached Williams Lake at 4 PM, after traveling 5,400 miles. After arriving at Williams Lake Regional Airport, I caught a 5 PM flight to Vancouver before transferring to a connecting flight headed to JFK for a family wedding in Virginia. Yes, another, less grueling road trip.

In summary, seventeen vehicles and ten motorcycles participated in the Alcan Rally. Fifteen cars and four motorcycles finished the competitive sections. The Porsche Cayenne retired due to a failed fuel pump. The 911 team, along with several motorcyclists, determined that traveling on unpaved roads was not optimal. Consequently, they opted for the touring route and joined us at the hotels.

The team of Schneider and Mooers took honors as First Team, First Unlimited (we used a rally Computer), and First Overall for the event. After ten days of competitive rallying and 100 timed checkpoints, our total cumulative error was 122.9 seconds.

A PERFECT WEEK OF HIGH-PERFORMANCE DRIVING AND VIP RACING AT THE 2025 IMSA SEASON FINALE

was fortunate enough to start my amazing week flying from New York to Austin. For motorsports enthusiasts, few experiences rival the thrill of high-performance driving at Circuit of the Americas (COTA) in Austin, Texas. As the only purpose-built Formula 1 track in the U.S., COTA offers a world-class venue where drivers can test their skills on the same tarmac that hosts legends from F1, MotoGP, NASCAR, and the World Endurance Championship. And guess what – I got to drive it! How, you ask? I'm fortunate to be part of the Just Hands Foundation, whose mission is simple: we get hand-control drivers on track.

This summer, I attended the premiere of "Just Hands: For the Love of Racing," a four-part documentary series on Amazon Prime featuring our co-founder, Torsten Gross, a quadriplegic race car driver pushing through unimaginable physical limits to compete in GT motorsport. (PS—it's a must-watch.) At the premiere, I had the chance to meet C. Sean Yuksel, owner of DSC Racing, based

in Austin. His team organizes motorsports vacations, driver development, and track car storage at COTA. Beyond his deep motorsports knowledge and coaching skills (he's the best!), Sean is also an award-winning creative with a firm specializing in film, marketing, design, press, and high-stakes event production. Sean saved the day by organizing the entire race team, car, and additional drivers for Torsten's last race (again, watch it, especially episode 4!).

Sean seamlessly set me up for my ultimate North American bucket-list track day in a Porsche Cayman S (though there were plenty of options, including a GT3 RS). I arrived a day early, Ubered straight from the airport with my oversized suitcase, and spent the day learning the track lines as a ride-along passenger, prepping for my drive the next day, and meeting new friends. One thing's clear: wherever you go, the HPDE (High Performance Driver Education) community embraces newcomers and welcomes you into the camaraderie.

Now, let's talk track. COTA's 3.4-mile layout features 20 challenging turns (YES – 20!), dramatic elevation changes, and a signature climb into Turn 1 that demands precision and guts. The mix of technical corners and high-speed straights pushes both your car and your nerves to the limit (and probably your coach's nerves). Inspired by legendary circuits like Silverstone and Hockenheim, COTA delivers a masterclass in control, speed, and strategy with every lap.

Off the track, COTA is a great place to hang out. You can escape the heat in the grandstands, grab a civilized lunch, and explore the grounds. I happened to visit while they were prepping for the F1 race — building out the infrastructure that transforms the venue into a mini-city, complete with a karting track and rollercoaster.

Austin is just a short ride away and the perfect place to stay. We unwound with legendary BBQ and live music after long days at the track. Compared to the usual track accommodations (if you've ever stayed at Seneca Lodge with swampy AC and woke up gasping for air, you know what I mean), this was a total upgrade.

COTA, I think I love you.

On Friday, I boarded a plane from Austin to Atlanta, ready to kick off the second half of an unforgettable week. As a longtime IMSA fan, being invited to experience the behind-the-scenes magic of the Motul Petit Le Mans and Fox Factory 120 was a true highlight. The day began in the pits, where I watched the NBC commentator hold the winner's Rolex and soaked in the energy as teams prepped their cars. The sounds, the movement, the mayhem – it was electric. The backstage buzz never fails to inspire.

I spent the day with the IMSA team, reconnecting with familiar faces and enjoying every moment – from lunch and coffee breaks to shopping and simply taking in the race. It was my first day-to-night race, and watching the track transform under the lights was something special. One of the coolest moments? Stepping onto the bridge where flagging happens. I waited all day to see a meatball flag – and finally, one flew!

I also spent time at the Atlanta PCA tent, where the grassy Porsche parking was a sight to behold. The Atlanta crew was as welcoming as ever, creating a relaxed space to escape the sun, watch the race, and grab a drink. Their hospitality added a layer of comfort and community to the excitement.





Heading into the final race of the IMSA season, Porsche Penske Motorsport was leading the championship and ready to defend their position. After a season of fierce competition, the 10-hour endurance test at Road Atlanta was the ultimate challenge. And they delivered – Roger Penske's team clinched the IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship. Drivers Matt Campbell and Mathieu Jaminet secured the title, marking Team Penske's 48th championship win.

The absolute highlight? Being in the pits with the Porsche Penske team as they celebrated their victory. Fireworks lit up the sky, and I found myself just two feet away from Roger Penske as he was interviewed about his incredible win. Even though I wasn't behind the wheel this time (next year!), watching these incredible drivers in action was nearly just as thrilling.

Reflecting on the start of this adventure, I remember the moment of panic as I boarded my flight – wondering if my shoulder bag, packed with my helmet and HANS device, would fit in the overhead bin. Spoiler: it does. So really, all you need to drive the COTA legendary track is a few great connections, your helmet (yes, it travels well!), and a sense of adventure.

I had no idea just how much joy this experience would bring. I'm incredibly grateful to be exactly where I am.

attended Metro's October 7th Lime Rock Park (LRP) DE. This was a "solo only" event, running from noon until 5 pm, with 30-minute sessions alternating between the "fast" and the "faster" groups. The day was perfect – sunny with intermittent cool breezes. The many Metro members who didn't attend missed a really good experience.

TRACK RAMBLINGS


Over the years, I have pointed out two frequent rookie mistakes that drivers should avoid:

- **1.** Do not blindly follow the line of the driver ahead of you. There is no guarantee that the person in front knows what they're doing, so it's important to stick to your own line.
- 2. Do not brake immediately when you see the brake lights of the car ahead. The car in front is ahead of you, so you likely have not reached your Beginning of Braking (BoB) point yet, so wait until you get there.

Based on an error I made at Lime Rock, I am awarding myself the JOTD [Jerk Of The Day] award -- adding a new number one mistake to everyone's list: Always check your fuel level after every session. During this event, I ran out of gas on the track during the last lap of a session. Thankfully, it was only a minor inconvenience for the other drivers. This mistake is not limited to rookies; it can happen to drivers of all skill levels. Back in the pits, I received some good-natured teasing, and everyone took it in stride, but I genuinely felt like a fool. The lesson is clear — check your fuel before each session, giving yourself enough time to get a fill-up. Trackside gas is expensive, so be sure to start the day with a full tank purchased at a gas station near the track

For those who haven't been to LRP, here is a primer: the track is a short 1.5-mile lap with seven turns, of which only Turn 3, leading into the "esses", is a left-hander. The rest are all right-handers.

The Tricky Turns 3-4 Section

While the Uphill and the Downhill are tricky in their own ways, the Esses are the set of turns that are the most complex at LRP, and which contribute greatly to safety and laptimes – for better or worse. The key to a quick and safe path through the 3-4 section is to pick a line for the entry to the left-hand Turn 3, which

keeps you on the left side of the track, so that you are set up for the right-hand Turn 4, which leads onto the No Name straight.

If you treat the Lefthander (#3) as if it is a "regular" turn, you will track-out to the right, and because the interval before the Righthander (#4) is very short, you will not be able to get to the left side of the track in time to make a proper line through #4 – and taking #4 at the highest possible speed is important since the "No Name" straight following #4 is reasonably long. (As an aside, the 'No Name' straight is being retired -- I saw that the edge of the right side of the track after the (#4) is now painted "Paul Newman Straight".) I once saw Paul Newman race at LRP in a Datsun 510, which was a giant-killer car in its heyday from 1968 to 1973. I had a 1973 model, which I bought new for about \$3000, into which I put a turbocharger, raising its power from 95 to 140hp, which was quite a lot for those days. By contrast, the 1973 Porsche 911T cost about \$10,000 and had 130hp.



I saw Paul Newman again at the 2003 24 Hours of Daytona. I had a business relationship with Chip Ganassi Racing and was in their pits at 3 am, when Newman, whose pit was next to ours, came in for a pit stop. He had finished a 2-hour stint driving a 500+hp prototype. When he took off his helmet, he looked completely drained – and why not? He was 78 years old at the time.

Getting back to Lime Rock, the No Name (aka Paul Newman) straight takes you to the "Uphill" turn, which is a very short, steep right-hander. Since it is uphill, it provides a great deal of grip, permitting much less braking into it than you might think, BUT ... as you crest to the top of hill, you LOSE a lot of grip, so it is critical to have the car going straight when you reach the top of the hill – and it is a good idea to have a small safety cushion of track to your left. I have seen too many drivers lose control at the top of that hill!

Fascinating LRP Uphill incident: In 1988, John Morton was practicing for the upcoming IMSA race in an 800+horsepower Nissan GTP ZX-Turbo prototype. When he crested the hill, the car went fully airborne and flipped over backward in mid-air, crashing to the ground with its rear end pointing backward. He suffered minor burns but was back on the track within a few weeks. In response to this incident, Lime Rock installed the chicane at the Uphill, which slows down the cars for

safety, and is used for high-speed races. DE days are conducted using the traditional Uphill track.

The 2025 Track season is winding down, with one more Metro event – a joint DE with NNJR at VIR October 24-26. VIR is a *must do* track for any serious track person; Unfortunately, as you read this, it will be too late, but as the Mets say, "there's always next year".

Instead of a cover, I use a portable leaf blower, which I will now refer to as a Porsche dust blower. I would recommend the Ryobi One+, available at Home Depot for \$149, which has been tested at 90 decibels. I've seen this blower used by one of our members, and I was very impressed. I mentioned Ted Ohland's name earlier; if you didn't know, he was one of the early founders of Metro NY and a four-time parade rallymaster. He authored a column called "Rumblings," and it covered all things about everything.

Let me try now, in a minor way. Where did the word concours come from? The word concours is a French term that entered the English language in the 20th century, primarily to mean a public contest or competition, especially one related to the display and judging of vehicles, as in a Concours d'élégance.

When and where did they hold the first concours? Hint: it was not on Long Island. In these early gatherings, French aristocrats, in the 17th century, would parade their elaborate horse-drawn carriages to be judged on their appearance and elegance. The first auto event was September 4th, 1921, the event was held in Dinard, on France's west coast, known as the Concours d'élégance de Dinard.

What is your opinion of the renovated Porsche Post, outstanding, exactly what I thought. Did you know that Metro NY's own history page says the club began publishing The Porsche Post in 1953 and joined PCA as the Metro New York Region in 1958.

I hope you took advantage of and enjoyed the activities presented by the volunteers in 2025, and I wish you a safe and peaceful 2026.





Porsche Gold Coast

s announced in the October issue of *Porsche Post*, Metro partnered with Porsche Gold Coast for a free technical session on October 18th, focusing on the Porsche Classic Technical Certificate.

Several members reached out to me in the weeks prior, offering their classic Porsche as the subject of the certification. Since Gold Coast generously offered to perform the inspection and issue the certificate at no cost, to be fair to all, Metro organized a lottery to choose the car. We received 22 entries, qualified 14, and randomly selected a beautiful 1993 RS America belonging to Metro member John Kuitwaard. A car is eligible for the Porsche Technical Certificate if it's a model that has been out of standard production for at least 10 years.

The event was well-attended, with approximately 50 members joining us at Gold Coast's impressive facility in Jericho, NY, showcasing their classic Porsches. Members assembled in the parking lot, admiring the cars that gathered, spanning seven decades: 356, 911, 912, 951, and a Carrera GT among them, while reconnecting with old friends and making new ones.

We soon migrated to Gold Coast's subterranean (and immaculate) workshop, where introductions were made and an overview of the process was given by several members of Gold Coast's staff. Their specially trained Porsche Classic Certified technicians immediately went to work inspecting the subject vehicle while leadership answered the many questions posed by attendees.


We later moved to an upper floor, where we enjoyed a complimentary breakfast and a tour of Gold Coast's impressive 360° photo studio, featuring a gorgeous 911 with a long hood. Cars that undergo the certification are photographed in the booth, and those images are ultimately used in the final certificate.

The process takes nearly a full day, and the inspection is rigorous. The car is subjected to scrutiny both inside and outside, as well as underneath. The inspection includes a thorough examination of all equipment and its condition, as well as an assessment of its originality. If something is amiss, the client is typically notified and given the opportunity to correct the discrepancy before the report is finalized.

Findings and photos are transmitted to the mothership where the report is evaluated and compared with factory documentation regarding as-built specification. The final certificate is issued by Porsche, transmitted to the Porsche Classic Certified Partner, where it is ultimately presented to the client. It bears mentioning that Porsche Gold Coast is New York's sole Porsche Classic Certified Partner.

This is not a one-pager like the prior Certificate of Authenticity (aka COA, which later evolved into the Porsche Product Specification); rather, a high-quality folio that makes for an impressive presentation, enhancing your collectible and boosting its value. It also attests to the original engine and transmission numbers, lending a higher level of credibility and provenance that is no longer available in the COA and the PPS that replaced it.

I entered the event thinking that the certification was merely an inspection that results in a report outlining the vehicle's condition and an inventory of original equipment, but I learned that the Porsche Classic Technical Certificate (CTC) is more than that. It's a

document that establishes and certifies a level of originality that is a standard to be attained. At about \$500, it's a bargain.

Market

Porsche Market Update

fter last September marked the slowest month of 2024 with the lowest sell-through rate and dollar volume of the year, this September was anything but sluggish. With 75% of the 656 Porsches offered finding new homes for a total of \$44,012,507, the market posted its second-highest sell-through rate of 2025 and an above-average dollar volume to match. Compared to 63% and \$29.6 million last year – and even up from 72% and \$39.3 million in August – September showed real momentum across

nearly every segment. We also saw a record-setting month for GT2 RS, a headline-grabbing 356 Speedster sale, a few surprises from the '60s race car crowd, and plenty more worth unpacking below.

The GT2 RS market was small in quantity but mighty in performance this month, with just two examples crossing the block – both on the same day. The first was a wingless example that landed right within expectations

at \$479,111, proving that even the less traditional specs continue to find solid footing. The real headline, though, came from the second car, a Miami Blue example equipped with the Weissach Package that set a new twelve-month high at \$625,000. With 647 miles on the odometer and no Paint-to-Sample pedigree to boost its value, this result underscores continued strength at the very top of the modern GT market and shows that well-specified cars still bring the money.

The 356 market continued to show signs of softness this month with a 47% sell-through rate, but two stand-out Speedsters proved that the best examples still bring exceptional money. The first, a single-family-owned


1957 356A Speedster refinished in its original Ivory over Black, featured its numbers-matching engine and an older refurbishment, ultimately sold for a strong \$342,000. The real star, however, came from the Gruppe P Collection - a 1958 356A Speedster restored in the mid-2010s and finished in Silver Metallic over Red leatherette. Already a decorated concours winner, with honors including Best Porsche at the 2017 Hilton Head Island Concours, Best in

Class at the 2018 Concours d'Elegance of Texas, and a Podium Award from the 2025 La Jolla Concours, it added another trophy to its shelf: a \$400,000 final bid and a new twelve-month high for a Speedster online.

Interestingly, two 1960s race cars crossed the online block in September - a 1968 910 and a 1964 904 Carrera GTS. The 910 followed the trend we've seen with most period race cars lately and failed to sell at a final bid of \$1,050,000. The 904, on the other hand, was a different story. Originally delivered through Brumos Porsche and boasting an impressive period competition history that includes the 1964 Bahamas Speed Week and entries at Daytona and Sebring, this Signal Red example has long been regarded as one of the better-documented 904s in private hands. Restored by Kevin Jeanette in the late 1980s and accompanied by its original Type 587/3 four-cam engine - currently serving double duty as a coffee table - it sold for a final bid of \$2,375,000. That marks a healthy uptick from the \$2.2 million result earlier this year and reinforces that while most vintage Porsche racers continue to remain unsold, 904s remain a stronghold in the market.

But the biggest surprise of the month came not from a 911 or 356, but from the Cayenne camp. Yes, a manual Cayenne is rare, and the Jet Green Metallic over Black leather example certainly looked the part, but this was just a standard model showing 64,600 miles. Aside from a set of 20-inch RS Spyder wheels and Porsche wood interior trim, it was mostly your run-of-the-mill Cayenne. We last saw this very SUV sell in 2021 for a strong \$51,000, and with the market having cooled since then, you'd expect a result somewhere in that range or a tad below. Not this time. Two determined bidders pushed it past the \$100,000 mark, with the hammer finally falling at an astonishing \$125,500. An unreal number for a Cayenne, and one that makes you

wonder what one of the three 6-speed Transsyberias would bring if one ever came to market.

It was a September to remember, a strong showing for what's typically the "quiet" month following Monterey. The mix of record-setting results, surprise sales, and continued strength in key segments made it one of the more impressive months of the year. And as I write this, October is already off to a stunning start, with several new highs and some truly special cars we've never seen cross the block before. Watch this space next month.


