Snowflake 65

JEFF GOLDBERG - RALLY CHAIR

On January 31, 2021, Metro NY PCA will continue a tradition of the longest continuously run event hosted by any car club in the USA – THE SNOWFLAKE RALLY. This year's event marks the 65th year of the Snowflake. The event is dedicated to Ted Ohland who was not only one of the founding members of Metro but a Nationally recognized Rally Master who traveled across America creating rallies for car clubs.

A rally is an event where participants are given very detailed directions to follow with not only where to turn but also with speed changes. To really make it interesting the instructions MAY state "Turn right 3 miles after seeing the barn in photo A".

Don't be intimidated. The instructions usually include the cumulative mileage so you will have a good idea where the right turn is even if you do not see the barn. It is important that each car not only has a driver (very important) but a navigator to read the instructions. A driver cannot read, drive and look for clues safely. Teams should consist of two people who get along really well.

Rallyies spend very few miles on parkways and major roads. You will drive mainly on scenic and interesting back roads. Just following the route instructions will allow you to spend a day driving around the East end of Long Island enjoying our picturesque homeland.

To really enjoy the event, follow the instructions including speed changes to pass the hidden check points at the specific time the Rally Master planned. Points are awarded for every second plus or minus of the exact time you pass the check point. The lowest score wins.

For 64 years registration was held at a location where you could have breakfast and the end at a restaurant for lunch or dinner. Due to Covid (as of this writing) we are in the early planning stages of having both meeting places in a safe environment allowing for safe social distancing. Details will be included when registration opens. (Registration information on page 9).

The season is over. Actually, the abbreviated season is over. We managed to get a few good events in safely while adhering to Covid-19 guidelines. Every year I reflect back on the season to evaluate and see what could have been done better. Despite the virus looming over all of us, I think we did a pretty good job. Proper precautions

were taken to ensure the safety of all participants and everybody was cooperative. People stepped up to help and make sure events ran smoothly and took on added responsibilities and jobs. Flags and radios needed to be sanitized between groups as well as the computer. Our porta-potty needed to be sprayed down every so often during the events. People were aware and considerate of others and wore masks and distanced from each other. Although this was not a normal year, we got through it.

Some positives have come out of this year. For one thing, I have been reluctant to change to preregistration despite the urging of the autocross committee, as I felt it would make the onsite registration procedure more chaotic. I am happy to say that I was wrong. It worked great and streamlined the whole registration process. It is a little more work behind the scenes. However, it is worth it, as there are no huge lines anymore which means participants get to walk the course and tend to their cars for a longer period of time.

The Season Finale Autocross was one of the best of the year. The weather was perfect, and I got to put on a pair of shorts again. Can you believe the weather was nice enough in November to wear shorts? The course, designed by Rich Wayne, was his usual awesome, flowing, fun course. It was a great way to end this roller coaster of a season. What were the results you ask? Read on.

John M. took the win in his one-car class of S01 with a time of 38.453 seconds. Three-driver class S02, found Robert N. in first place with a time of 39.383 seconds and Manny G. trailing in second place with a time of 44.970 seconds. Terrence D. took the win in two-car S03 with a time of 43.398 seconds and Marcel Y. came in first place in S05 with a time of 44.905 seconds.

P02 found Nolan M. dominating his mother Terri with a 41.388 second trip around the lot in the two-car class of P02. Two-car class P03, found Martin P. in first place with a time of 43.285 seconds. Michael K. took the win in P05 with a 41.735 second trip around the parking lot. In the four-car class of P06, Dan F. took the win with a 38.644 second trip around the lot to overtake second place Mitch H. who drove the course in 39.530 seconds. Third place went to Brian P. with a 43.195 second run. Spencer M. took the win in the four-car class of P08 with a time of 35.934. This earned him Fastest Time of the Day and Fastest Pax of the Day. Nice driving, Spencer. Bill R. came in a close second with a time of 38.869 seconds while Sebastian O. crossed the finish line in 40.442 seconds.

In our Improved class, I02, Jeff G. took the win with a time of 42.981 seconds while Tom P. was the victor in I03 with a time of 40.685 seconds. Randy P. took the win in M03 with a time of 37.287 seconds.

I want to thank all who helped out this year by giving up their free time to assist behind the scenes. If you are unaware of what happens, people volunteer to design the course the day before the event. This takes a few hours and there is usually a lot of standing around and cone lugging. Then people are needed the morning of the event to set the course again, and to set up the equipment. Then after the event, cones must be collected and stored, and everything needs to be dismantled. This is all above and beyond assigned work assignments for the event. That being said, I want to thank the following people who are always available to help out: Jack Minot, Mitch Hackett, Derek McKane, Rich Wayne, Mark Valera, Michael Kane and Tom Patrizio Please forgive me if I have forgotten you. Without this group of people, and any I may have neglected to mention, events would not be possible and would not run as smoothly as they do.

Now that the season is over, next year's schedule is already in the works. Please look for the 2021 schedule in the next issue of the Porsche post, on our website and social media, and in our mail blasts. I wish everyone a happy, holiday season. Stay well and I'll see you next year.



I recently realized that I am an addict. It came to me in a flash. Of course I knew that I was very drawn to this activity, but it was only when I thought deeply about it that I acknowledged how profound the magnetism was.

Websters defines an addict as "one exhibiting a compulsive, chronic,

physiological or psychological need for a habit-forming substance, behavior, or activity."

By that definition I am clearly addicted to track driving. Here are some of the symptoms: When my wife and I discuss activities or trips we may take I always hope her plans won't mean me missing a track event. As the day of an event gets near my mind is filled with all the preparations to the exclusion of just about everything else.

Even during the winter when I'm in Vail I often find myself thinking about track activities. One winter I got an invitation to drive at Sebring so I arranged to rent a track car, flew from Denver to Orlando, got an Avis and drove 2 hours to the track, had the 1-day event and flew back to Denver and then to Vail. Hmmm. Maybe I'm an addict.

Probably the proof comes from this: about 30 years ago one time when I was at Watkins Glen I made a solemn oath to myself – if I ever get injured due to this activity, I'll quit. As the years went by I reminded myself of this oath – but I never had to look it in the face because I had no track injuries until October 2019 when I had a crash, wrecked my car and needed surgery to get patched up. At that point I re-worded the solemn oath a bit. The "if I ever get injured" modified itself into "if I ever get seriously injured." Hmmm. That sounds like something an addict would do, doesn't it?

So, I have to conclude that I Am An Addict, which in turn leads to the question, "Why? What is there about

track driving that did this to me?"

As a boy I had no interest at all in cars until I went to boarding school 3 miles from Lime Rock. Many of the kids would go there to watch the races, so after a while I went over and got interested. The USA main headquarters for Lotus was located nearby and I would spend time there instead of studying. The Lotus Elan was as quick as the Corvette at Lime Rock since it has a short and somewhat twisty layout. This appealed to me – the little guy taking on the big American iron. On vacation I would go to 54th street and 11th Avenue in New York City and hangout at the Ferrari dealership. I knew so much about the cars that I would sometimes be mistaken for a junior salesperson. In 1965 for Spring Break I took the train from Penn Station to Sebring in order to watch the 12 Hour race. I had become friends with John Fitch, a legendary race driver and WW2 fighter pilot ace whom I had met at Lime Rock. He was driving a 904 for the Porsche factory team and he invited me to watch from the Porsche pit. Now, that was an experience! (I went back again in 1966 and '67.) It sounds like maybe the addiction was setting in.

My college friend owned a 1964 Alfa Giulia. We took it to Bridgehampton a few times and I did my first track driving there. A different era: no instruction at all. Just hop in and hit the track. But I read every book I could get my hands on. The best was Piero Taruffi's "The Technique of Motor Racing". I also read many books by Stirling Moss. I spent the summer of 1966 in Europe. I got to the British, Dutch and German Grand Prix races. I met Colin Chapman and Jimmy Clark! I "drove" Jimmy Clark's Formula 1 car at the Nürburgring!!!! (I wrote about this experience years ago and I'll tell the story again in next month's column.) Sounds like the addiction is hardening, doesn't it?

I got a 1967 Alfa GTV with dual Webers and 129hp. Later I installed a turbo into my 1973 Datsun 510. I went to Lime Rock a lot. Still no instruction at all. A simpler, but obviously more dangerous, era. Then work and baby intervened and I went trackless for about 10 years, which ended when I bought a gorgeous 1985 Porsche 944 and joined PCA. I finally got instruction and worked my way up from Green, through Yellow, Blue, White, and Black run groups into Red. I'm on my 9th Porsche now and am as committed

New Member Perspective

This fall I completed one year of Porsche ownership and PCA membership. As I was reflecting on the past year it occurred to me that I should share my experience because its been better than I could have expected, it's a way to say thank you to everyone I met over the past year, everyone who worked on putting together events and everyone who shows up with a friendly attitude.

Earlier I was a BMW guy I owned various daily drivers, an e30 convertible, E30 M3 and a '73 2002. In 2009 my career put me on a plane to another country, not knowing when I was coming back I decided to sell everything. Ten years later I was back home in NY and things had settled down. Although as enthusiasts we never truly stop looking, now I had real intent to purchase not just time to daydream.

This was the summer of '18 when my 40th birthday was fast approaching. I started the search by going back to what I knew, BMWs. I almost purchased a '05 330ci ZHP which would have been a reincarnation of my first car the E30 325ic, red on black, five speed. The deal fell through, oh well. Meanwhile, I had been driving past the Roslyn Porsche dealership and was slowly being imprinted upon. Porsches would be arriving for servicing so I would find myself behind them often. Looking at a 911 from the rear is still one of those moments when I get lost in the visual, like looking at art.

One of the searches I had was for the 996, I had a filter and alert set up so any add with "IMS" in it would be emailed to my inbox. I chose the 996 because ticked all the boxes for me, gorgeous car to look at, enough power to get into trouble and a great price point to enter the 911 brotherhood. After a nationwide search I ended up finding my 996 in Minnesota. It's a '99 C4 cabrio with all the right upgrades. My wife and I flew to Minnesota and drove it home, during the trip home I found myself staring at the hip of the car in the rear view, mesmorized by what I saw, did you have the same feeling the first time you drove a 911?

The car has exceeded my expectations. This is a weekend car used for early morning breakfast runs,

PCA events, going out for dinner and as demanded by my kids; driving them to swim class and soccer when weather permits. I have put about 5,500 miles on it which includes the 1,300 driving it from Minnesota back to NY. The smiles per miles ratio is very high, the car has a bunch of nice modifications and maintenance done to it; yes, the IMS, RMS and AOS were done, it also has Fabspeed exhaust, headers, EVO EMS intake and stage two tune, an IPD Plenum, H&R Sport shocks and sway bars to name the most impactful stuff. Maintenance-wise, it's what I expected for a 20 year old car. I got the oil changed right after getting it home, had a leak from the water drain few weeks later; it ended up being the connector hose behind a rear speaker and I changed the headlight switch shortly after. Planned work was new Bilstein B8s on all four corners, along with new shock mounts, and associated hardware and inner and outer tire rod ends. For good measure I also had the shop install a B&M short shifter. I also purchased a set of all-season tires since the car came with summers.

Although I think there should an easier way, I enjoy the hunt for parts and deals. I learned a lot about the car putting together the parts list. The PCA Mart was helpful and discounts at retailers came in handy. This winter I am going to do fluid changes, chase down squishy brakes and what I feel is a lose front end. I can see why they say 60% of all Porsches made are still on the road. There is something about this car, a connection formed which makes you want to keep them in tip top shape. Perhaps it's the feel of all the engineering that goes into these cars and realizing that you would not be doing them justice if you didn't, it almost feels like responsibility you carry.

At the time of writing this, I am about to pick up a OEM Carrera fixed wing spoiler and working out how to get hardback seats from Florida to New York at a decent price. I'm sliding down that slippery slope fast!







Heavy Metal and Restoration

If you have been following the progress on the restoration of my 1986 Carrera, I am pleased to report that we are out of paint and into reassembly. With two coats of paint and 5 coats of clear, we were waiting for the car to cure before beginning reassembly. We are starting to dive into the boxes of parts I have ordered (from Sierra Madre and Pelican Parts) including rubber seals for the doors, fenders, sunroof, hood and rear lid as well as bits to reattach the front and rear valance, headlight rings and door sills.

With the fenders attached, we checked gaps and fit while Anthony Macchia (in the background, top right) of Elmsford Autobody checked the door fit. The doors have been totally disassembled and now we are reinstalling the window motors, window tracks and glass, and electric door locks. Chris DiFrisco at Rennwerke (shop foreman) has taken on the role of restoring the doors, door cards and switches so I expect that once the door are rehung, it will look finished, even if we have another few weeks of putting the car back together. I hope to see it by the end of the year.

I elected to go for a new windshield since the old one (36 years old) was a bit pitted and chipped, but the rest of the glass should go in sometime in late November. I have not had too much of an issue finding parts for this car but some of the OEM Porsche parts are very expensive. Fortunately, aside from some rubber and some metal brackets, it was a relatively short list of new parts.

The assembly sequence includes reassembly and installation of the doors, the sunroof, then wiring, install the tail light buckets, valances and bumpers and then the interior (seats, carpeting) and then a new roof liner. The collaboration between Elmsford Autobody and Rennwerke Porsche had reduced my stress considerably. The knowledge base and talent pool is fully operational.

Based on this progress, I am thinking about a "launch party" sometime around the holidays. More information will follow as the car comes together.





North Region Update

The north region of Metro has witnessed a slow decent into fall with a number of cold and wet weekends which have reduced driving days. With storage on our minds, we have compiled a list of available storage

facilities locally and regionally. If you want some references, please let me know. Home winter storage is all about the planning, so I will repeat some of my recommendations.

- 1) Trickle charge or remove the battery- purists recommend a battery tender on the battery with the battery connected.
- 2) Add 3 or 4 PSI to the tires. Try to park on soft or padded floor tiles (available at Home Depot or Lowes) so the tires do not sit on a hard surface and "flat spot"
- 3) Add Sta-Bil to the gas to reduce fuel "spoilage"
- 4) Put dryer sheets into or over the exhaust tips. Remember to remove when starting the car. (Mice hate these). Fling a couple of sheets into the front trunk.
- 5) Use mouse glue traps near the tires. Also, try to find an ultrasonic device on Amazon. Mice won't nest in the car
- 6) Lastly, cover it. I keep the windows open an inch or so to keep the airflow moving.

- 2) Squantz Pond near Danbury/New Fairfield, Connecticut. The scenary is breathtaking, parking is easy, and the trip up 684/84 makes this a breeze. The last few miles are an adventure.
- 3) If you want to look for it, <u>The Village Blend</u> in Sloatsburg, NY on the edge of Harriman State Park in Rockland County. It is across from the Metro North Train Station in Sloatsburg and a very cool breakfast place.
- 4) Breakast at Countryside Kitchen on Rt. 6 in Mahopac if you don't want to go too far. Taconic or Rt. 684 will get you there.

And lastly, please keep an eye on the thermometer. Summer tires really should not be driven on when the temperature drops below 45 degrees. Either go "all season" or stay home. I have experienced first hand the complete loss of traction on a frozen roadway when the rear end of a 911 decides not to adhere to the pavement while on a turn.






