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# Skid reMarks <br> DAN FISHKIND - AUTOCROSS CHAIR 



The Tax Relief Autocross was another great event if you don't count the weather. I think I must have angered the weather gods for some reason. It was $80^{\circ}$ a few days before the event and a beautiful day. The day before the event, during the course set-up it was a little colder and it was much, much colder the day of the event. When I pulled into Tobay Beach the morning of the event I think the temperature was $39^{\circ}$. Quite a difference from a few days before. But the show must go on.

Forty-eight drivers arrived to drive the course designed by Mark Valera. The course had some technical parts as well as some fast parts and did not favor the faster drivers over the more technical drivers. This evened up the playing field and made for better competition.

On a side note, there are some inexpensive things you can do to your car which will make it perform better. At the end of last season, I bought a 2006 Cayman S. The car was totally stock as delivered from the factory, and all that had been done to it was routine maintenance. It felt great the first time out and I didn't think it could get any better. Then, before the start of this season, I had an aggressive wheel alignment done which was geared toward autocross. What a difference that made. The car felt like it was on rails. But I was on all-season street tires. For the next event, I added some softer compound, 200 treadwear tires, and WOW! What a difference. The car stuck to the surface like glue. Both of these changes were great investments and made a huge difference in handling...and my times! Do you need these things to have fun? Absolutely not. Our cars perform incredibly well right out of the factory. However, as you improve and get more seat time, these additions will make you more competitive.

But I digress; now back to the results of the Metro NY PCA Tax Relief Autocross. Andre C started off the show in three driver S 04 with a first-place finish and Fastest Pax of the Day with a time of 49.339 seconds followed by Marty P in second place with a time of 54.419 seconds.

Vince R took the win in four driver S5P2 with a time of 52.706 seconds to beat out second-place Manny $G$ who drove the course in 54.421 seconds.

Matt $S$ followed up the rear in third place with a time of 55.171 seconds. Three driver S6P3P4 was dominated by Mitch H who took the win with a 48.288 second trip around the lot to beat out Michael K who drove the course in 48.965 seconds. S7P5, with two drivers, found John M in the lead with a 53.935 second run. Dan F took the win in five driver S8P6 with a time of 48.358 seconds while Mark H took the second place spot with a time of 48.559 seconds. Wow, that's close! Vaino N came in third with a 50.109 second run.

Anthony H took the win in S9P7 in 48.646 seconds and Marc $L$ took the win in P8 with a time of 62.983 seconds. S10 with three drivers found Michael C in the first place spot with a time of 49.449 seconds and David $Z$ came in second with a time of 54.886 seconds.

In our Improved class with two drivers, Todd R took the win with a blinding 47.535 second run. In twelve driver X1, Christine $P$ showed up and took the win and the Fastest Time of the Day with a time of 46.100 seconds. Congratulations Christine. Graham M took the second place spot with a respectable 47.915 second run around the lot and Richard W slid into third with a time of 48.077 seconds.

Eight drive X2 found John M in first place with a 46.476 second run around the lot and Paul B in second with a time of 48.294 seconds. Third place went to Barrington H with a time of 49.013 seconds. Lastly, X3 with seven drivers found Jess P in first with a 40.186 second run. Donald H navigated the course in 50.806 seconds for the second place spot and Demetrious $S$ took the third place spot in 50.911 seconds.

Now the Tax Relief Autocross is in the history books. Our next event was on April 23 at Tobay Beach, and you will hear about that in the next issue of the Porsche Post. May 7 will be the next autocross after this issue, and we will be moving to the Nassau Coliseum. Please see the Autocross Season flyer in this issue and plan on coming out. It is never too late to start to autocross so don't delay I hope to see you all out there.

## Concours Corner

## Greetings from Concours Corner！

With our first event next month，the Vintage Charity Concours at Pindar Vineyards，I thought it would be an opportune time to ＂scratch the surface＂ on basic preparation for our concours events for those thinking about participating for the first time．Ok，maybe＂scratch the surface＂isn＇t the right term to use here．．． how about a＂primer＂in prepping for concours？Here＇s the good news．If you are thinking about participating in the Pindar Charity event，it isn＇t a judge show．No team of judges swarming around your car reaching into its nether regions looking for dirt or blade of grass in its tires．We are kicking off with a lighthearted event for a great cause． None the less，you will want to have your car looking its ＂Sunday Best＂and this event can be used as a dry run for the Zone 1 event in June．So what does it take？Can you just run your car through the local car wash and put it out there on the lawn．Sure．But as my mother always said in response to why she never had a cleaning person clean her home，＂no one ever cleans it like it＇s their own！＂ So while as the Concours Chair I have seen folks do this and actually compete，it is not really what we are shooting for here．Heck，I find it therapeutic to get up early to clean and prepare my cars．In future columns I will go into specific products I use，but for this issue，as I said earlier，we are going to just＂scratch the surf－I mean give a primer for beginners．

Depending upon what you are starting with．．．．brand new car，older classic，barn find uncovered for the first time， your initial steps will likely vary．I like to start be using compressed air or a shop vac reversed to blow and lightly blast off any loose dirt from the car before breaking out the hose．This is a good first step in getting some of that initial grit from the car．After this I will wet the whole car down and prepare my car shampoo（soap）．Very important here，do not use dish soap from under the kitchen counter and do not use any of the dry powder car wash soaps（too gritty！）available at auto parts stores． Think of it this way，would you wash your hair with Dawn or with sand？You want gentle，high quality gel soaps
specifically made for cleaning our cars．Once your soap is prepared you are ready to lather up the car．I highly recommend using a wash mitt that is made to capture and pull away dirt from the surface．No sponges which grind dirt into the surface and make scratches and swirls in your paint．Give the car a good bath，starting at the roof（if you have one．Convertible tops we will touch on at a latter time）and working your way down wringing and shaking out you wash mitt in you bucket as you go．When you are done，give the car a full rinse and then attack the wheels and tires．You do not．．．I repeat．．．do not．．． want to use the same wash mitt and soap bucket to wash your wheels and tires．Have a dedicated set of cleaning mitts for the wheels and a tire brush，along with a PH neutral wheel and tire cleaner that will be gentle on your wheels so as not to strip or stain the surface．After you have given the wheels and tires their scrub．．．．given them a good rinse and move on to drying．

As l＇ve stated early on，gentle is key，even when it comes to drying and while it can be very tempting to use old towels to dry the car off，more often than not，they are going to be too rough and will scratch the surface．Invest in some top quality micro fiber towels for the drying． Additionally，I like to start by using compressed air the blow off much of the water and depending upon when the last time I waxed the car was，I will often use a spray on wax that accelerates the drying．

Once dried，I move on to the interior．As with most jobs we do，it is all about the tools．Small interior brushes， lint rollers and masking tape are just a few off the top of my head．Some of the bigger car detailing retailers offer some neat starter kits with a host of little cleaning tools and gadgets（they make great Father＇s Day and Mothers Day gifts！）A one time investment in some interior cleaning tools will last you a long time．When it comes to chemicals for cleaning the key once again is gentle．If you are using a carpet shampoo or say a leather cleaner， always try it in a small inconspicuous spot to make sure it will not stain or strip the color．The last thing you want to do is turn your black carpet blue（ask me how I learned that one！）Anyway，I hope this little primer will get you motivated if you are thinking about doing concours for the first time．In the coming weeks I am planning a concours workshop where you will be able to get some more tips， advice and even some hands－on experience if you like．

Hope to see everyone out on the lawn this season！

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# Track Ramblings <br> FRED PACK - CO-CHIEF INSTRUCTOR 



Just So You Know As a Driver Ed (DE) participant, you get your car ready, you pack your helmet and other necessary stuff into the car, you drive to the track and take all the stuff out of the car, go through registration and tech, and then you go on-track when your run group is called.
Behind the scenes, there is a great deal more that you aren't exposed to as a participant.

Months earlier much thought has been given by the Metro track team to creating the forthcoming year's schedule. Then, contracts have been made with the tracks that will host that season's events. Next, since each track has different operating and lunch hours, schedules have to be developed for each day. This is not a trivial process: each run group (Green, Blue, etc.) needs to have a fair amount of track time. The groups getting classroom instruction need to have their track time coordinated against their classroom sessions. Instructor track sessions have to be aligned with student sessions so that everyone has enough time off-track. There are many other intricacies in the process.

This process is coordinated by the Metro DE Team, consisting of the Registrar, Adam Fox, who creates the schedules along with input from the other team members-- the Chief Instructor Bill Rudtner (who is also the Metro President) and Co-Chief Instructor Fred Pack [me], the Track Chair Marvin Rosen and the Safety Chair Mat Gluckson.

## The Convevor Belt

Looked at from a higher level, the DE program can be seen as a living organism with inter-dependent parts: Novices arrive in the DE program and they learn the necessary techniques to be safe and consistent (and have fun) on track from instructors.

These instructors themselves were novices at some previous time. They tend to be among the older set of drivers, and they occasionally "retire" from instructing. This means that for the system to continue functioning, new instructors must always be created from the White
and Black group drivers, and of course, those White/ Black people had themselves been Green, Yellow, and Blue drivers earlier. There must be enough instructors at every event so that each Green and Yellow driver has an instructor. The system can be seen as a conveyor belt that moves drivers along from Green all the way to Red [instructors]. Of course, there are people who simply love track driving and are content to stay in one of the intermediate groups; some people fall off the conveyor belt - they move out of our region, decide to take up golf instead of track driving, etc. But there always must be enough instructors to handle the number of novices at each event.

In my own case, it took me about 10 years from my first event until I was an instructor. I deeply, very deeply love instructing DE participants. I get great satisfaction from seeing the joy of a student as $s /$ he improves. Track driving is a difficult skill to master, as quickly becomes apparent to most Green students, which makes the joy even greater as the student's skill set increases. Feeling the car's happiness as the line through a turn is perfected, or as the throttle is successfully applied earlier and earlier in the turn and, so much more-gives great joy to the sensitive driver and to the instructor who has made it possible

## A few words of caution:

We are all coming off the long winter break. We have surely lost some of our "track sense" since the end of last season. Take it easy for a while when you hit the track for the first time this year. Metro has a long 2023 season. See you on the track.

# Rally for Fun <br> RICH MOOERS - RALLY CHAIR 



I am often asked, what is the difference between a Rally, Trek or scenic drives? At a Rally there is always something to do in addition to just enjoying the drive and the scenery. There is an opportunity to join other teams in a competition if you wish.

The Vintage Rally on July 23 rd will be a Question-and-Answer Rally. When you participate in a Rally you are given instructions directing you to follow a pre-determined route, just like any organized driving event. At the Vintage Rally, as you follow the route, you will be asked questions about things along the way. To make it interesting you must decide whether you are allowed to see the things noted in the questions. At the finish of the Rally, each team submits their answers to the questions. The teams with the most correct answers are the winners.

In addition to the Route Instructions (Rl's), you will receive a set of General Instructions (Gls). The Gl's are the rules you must follow to determine the correct answer to each question. It is VERY important to read and understand the Gl's. When I participate in a Rally I highlight anything that seems important. For example, where are the things in the questions allowed to be? Usually, they will be on the right or straight ahead (but not always). Is the thing you are looking for a sign or a landmark? This will be spelled out in the Gl's and must be adhered to exactly. The spelling on a sign must be the same as in the question. The order of the words on a sign will be defined by the Gl's, can words be omitted?

I hope you get the idea of how important it is to understand all the rules included in the Gl's. Rallies are often described as what was called "Parlor Games" which you participate in as you drive in your car.

If you are interested in learning more about Rallies email me and I will set up a few Rally schools and give "handson" in-depth examples of how to understand Rally Gl's.

# Turn in, Track Out <br> MARVIN ROSEN - DE CHAIR 



We had an awesome day at Lime Rock Park in Connecticut with perfect weather for an unmuffled event with plenty of track time. Our next event was at NJMP (Lightning) on April 17th and 18th and was open to drivers including Green group drivers with an instructor. I will report more on this in our May issue.

The way we learn to drive is by seat time at a High Performance DE track. Metro PCA offers this opportunity to its members and to people who want to drive their car on a track even if they don't own a Porsche. DE, is an activity focused on driver training designed to show you how to safely navigate a track and get the most out of your car in a controlled HPDE environment. We teach the protocols of track driving and the techniques of good driving. Track protocol includes: knowledge of the flags with which marshals communicate to drivers, their meanings, and the correct response to each; emergency procedures for the unlikely event that one needs to use them; passing procedures including when and how to give and take a point by, which is the signal used by a driver to allow another driver to pass them on track; how to leave and enter the track from the pit lane. At our events, we have instructors for Green and Yellow students when available. The Cl (Chief Instructor) is Bill Rudtner who gives our students a very knowledgeable guide in driving HPDE on a track in a mandatory classroom. Please remember this is a fun day with a great group of people who have the desire to drive better each time they are on the track. Your instructor will help you achieve this goal with you at the wheel.

To participate in a Metro NY PCA DE you must be at least 18 years of age and possess a valid driver's license. We have six run groups through which one may progress as skill and experience increase. The run groups are denoted by colors. These are: Green: Beginner Student Yellow: Advanced Student Blue: Beginner Solo White: Intermediate Solo Black: Advanced Solo Red: Instructor

Green and Yellow are instructed run groups, meaning you will have an instructor riding with you in the passenger seat whenever you are on track. If you need more info please contact Adam Fox, our Registrar for more details. Our events are usually two full days of driving and will require your car to be in top condition to drive. What that means is a brake fluid flush an oil change, pads on brakes are thick, no leaks from under your car and you checked out the car with an approved tech shop to get a signed tech inspection form. Pre-event tech inspections are performed by PCA Region approved tech sites. The list of our local approved sites is here: https://metronypca.org/ approved-tech-sites. Metro NY PCA will accept inspection completed using our form by any inspection site approved by any PCA Region. If you need more info please contact Bob Schutenbach or Mat Gluckson.

Going to an HPDE event is very exciting and requires you to prepare for the weather, and have plenty of water or some cool drinks, to keep you hydrated. We drive in rain or shine so clothes should be ready for all weather conditions. You will make friends that will be on the track with you for many years. 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# Let's Get Technical <br> MATTHEW KAMMET - TECH CHAIR 



Tales of a 968

I'm not sure how many people have actually noticed but the automotive industry has been a very strange entity for the last few years.

When the pandemic first hit we saw everything instantly tank. Anybody that had some extra money lying around may have gotten in on some amazing opportunities. Most of us though were extra mindful of the uncertainty and kept our funds safe to be used in a responsible manner of just getting by.

Then just as suddenly the used car market spiked when we became unsure of when new cars would be delivered again. People were asking prices previously unheard of and getting them.

This was another great opportunity for people if they happened to have extra vehicles around that weren't really used. Then there was everyone in the middle. Many of this group had older cars that they hadn't had the chance or need to fix them up and this looked like a good chance to get some extra money on hand. Unfortunately (as most Porsche owners know) the longer you let them sit the more expensive the repairs become. This is where the 968 comes in.

I had one such customer this year contact me to have his 968 looked over because he was no longer able to store it indoors. It was the inexpensive project car that got put on the back burner and never worked on. It also had not run in over four years. The goal was to have it towed to me so I could go over it and get it running so it could be turned around and sold. Seems simple right? Well not exactly.
The vehicle arrived on a flatbed without issue and as described did not start or run. I got the usual "What do you think it could be?" The answer to this of course is always "It could be many things and I need the time for a proper diagnosis". I had it starting within a couple of hours but it would not stay running and would require
additional diagnoses. It also needs some serious TLC. So it came down to budget. Even if I had gotten it running there was still too much that needed to be done just to make it appealing enough to sell. This customer would likely have been chasing down a break-even number so I made a fair offer. He was happy to part ways with it since now he wouldn't have to deal with the hassle of repairing and then finding the right buyer.

The advantage of being a mechanic or a do-it-yourselfer is you get to fix it for almost half price. If all goes well it's just some of your time. If they don't go well, well then it's a lot of your time and that's why there are professionals. So to start, it is likely that my new to me 968 needs an idle control valve. They have a tendency to stick and this car has been sitting so it won't surprise me when it runs after replacement. The question is if there is anything else. There is an old mouse nest in the engine bay so they could have damaged any number of things in there. The radiator leaks and the brakes and tires are old and worn. Hoses and belts are cracking. The list goes on. I plan to have it moving and roadworthy sooner than later but you never know if you will run into more issues while trying to fix others.

Hopefully, there will be another chapter to share in this saga next month and it will be moving by then. It would be great to be able to participate in some of our nontrack related events with a "streetable" Porsche. I bet it will make for a lot of fun on one of our Treks or Rallies. Maybe I will see some of you on one later this year.

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# Meet Our Advertisers <br> ED REINER - EDITOR 

Did you ever walk into a garage or storage facility and immediately realize you are someplace special? I had the opportunity to meet up with Nick Soprano, owner of Motor Classic and Competition, one of Metro's new advertisers. Nick is a car collector, restorer, builder, and racer with a rich history, especially in Ferraris. Nick's location in Bedford Hills (literally back to back to Hagerty's Garage + Social in Bedford Hills) is a somewhat non-descript building on an industrial street. When you walk inside, you are greeted by some of the most unique cars ever manufactured including Ferrari, Porsche, Ford (GT 40), as well as other exotic brands. In the front of the garage is his "Sensuale'", a Ferrari derivative (V-12 motor) in a car he designed and built himself. (See photo) On the lower level is the shop where cars are serviced, restored, and even improved.

Nick epitomizes the concept of the "inspirational driver", meaning the love of engineering, design, sound, and performance cars which "car fanaticism" is all about. From his experience at the Skip Barber Racing School years ago, Nick began a journey of racing (Maserati's and Ferrari's) on the track. He claims that Watkins Glen is his favorite track but he tells stories of Laguna Seca where he had his best success.

Starting with an Alpha Romeo Spyder at 15 years old, Nick indulged his love of cars which resulted in him racing the Mille Miglia in Italy FOUR TIMES (in a Maserati). The office is covered with photos of him with famous racers and many with Enzo Ferrari. His wall photos of him behind the wheel of various Italian race cars are an impressive resume of his skills.

Recently, Nick opened up his service bays to the outside world and can handle normal service to complex repairs. His service team is well-equipped to handle most service requests and is embarking on a couple of Porsche restorations. Nick is always happy to discuss your service needs and schedule time to meet and greet each customer. Located down the street from Ralph Lauren's personal car collection and behind Hagerty's in Bedford Hills, Nick is a most knowledgeable car enthusiast with a "been there, done that" collection of stories that match the collection of rare cars in his garage. Most of us keep our cars in our garages. This means a concrete floor with some stains.. I recently sat down with Tony Quinn of Floor Shield to discuss the process of fixing and improving our garage floors. If we spend a fair amount of money buying an expensive car, shouldn't it be parked on a top-quality surface? Tony can provide a quote to redo your garage floor and generally can rehabilitate your floor with a new coating in about 1 day. This means repairing cracked concrete and pouring a new floor over the concrete with a variety of finishes. Please see Tony's ad on page 40 and photos of his work on page 46 . He applies a polyaspatic coating system over the concrete to create a hard shell finish that can be installed indoors or outside (on desks and other surfaces). The material is durable and lasts many years. Tony's contact information is in his ad.

The folks at RUF took the 993 even further, first with their Turbo R then, nearly two decades later, the Turbo $R$ Limited (the green example on the right is one of only seven produced). Boasting an eye-popping 620HP in a lightweight chassis, RUF again delivered a car that could exceed 200 mph .

The Speed Yellow car in the center of this trio is a completely different take on the 993: the TechArt CT3 featuring a supercharger delivering 462-HP to the rear wheels. While any CT3 is rare on these shores, this
one is particularly so as it's production number 000.
