

Skid reMarks DAN FISHKIND - AUTOCROSS CHAIR

It happened! The event we have all been waiting for! Great weather, great turnout, great course...the May Flowers Autocross was everything Autocross supposed to be. was Rich Wayne miraculously designed a course that evaded all the major bumps and crevices that the Nassau Coliseum has to offer. Fifty-five drivers showed up in great weather to participate in the event.

We had a good amount of new people enter and the most exciting aspect of the day was we had twenty-nine Porsches participate. I know of about two other regulars who didn't show up for this event so we could have potentially had 31 P-cars for the day. As I mentioned in last month's article, that is enough to run a P-car-only event. It has been years since we had enough cars to do that and is a good sign that the Autocross program is growing. Anyway, each driver got ten runs, five in the morning and five in the afternoon and it was exciting to see how the times improved. Here is how everyone fared.

S4, with two drivers, found Andre C in first place with a time of 47.997 seconds. Four driver S5P2 found Thomas P in the lead with a time of 50.232 seconds to beat out Vince R who drove the course in 50.873 seconds.

I hear Vince is in the market for some Autocross accessories to help him on the course. Third place went to Bob E with a time of 51.342 seconds. Eight driver S6P3P4, yes, I said EIGHT, was dominated by Mitch H who drove the course in 47.347 seconds. Second place went to Michael K who was a half-second slower with a time of 47.893 seconds. Third place went to Jonathan P in 51.234 seconds. S7P5 was taken by John M in this twocar class with a 50.895 second trip around the course. Yours truly took the win in five car S8P6 with five drivers with a time of 46.961 seconds whole Derek came in a close second with a time of 47.664 seconds. Vaino N took the third police spot with a 47.745 second run. Anthony H took the win in two driver S9P7 with a time of 51.742 seconds and Brandon T took the win in P8 with a 45.071 second trip around the course. P9 found Joseph H in the first place spot with a 51.558 second lap.

In our Improved Class with three drivers, Todd R took the first place spot and had the Fastest Time of the day with a 44.801 second drive. Tom P came in second with a time of 52.159 seconds.


Nine driver X1 was dominated by course designer Rich W who drove his course in 46.347 seconds.

Second place went to Christine P who drove the course in 46.415 seconds and Graham M found his car in third place with a time of 46.467 seconds. Eleven driver X2 found Max S in first place with a time of 45.910 seconds to beat John R M who came in second with a time of 46.287 seconds. Anthony C's 46.719 second run puts him in the third place spot. Jose A took the win in six driver X3 with a time of 44.801 seconds. Don H came in second with a 48.535 second trip and Demetrios S took the third place spot in 50.309 seconds. So that's it for the May Flowers Autocross.

Speaking of the next events, the July 16th event will be at the Nassau Coliseum. August finds us at the Nassau Coliseum on the 20th and then you can find us at the Zone 1 Autocross in Ayer Massachusetts on August 26th and 27th. The Zone One Autocross is open to all members. For those of you who are not aware, the Metro NY Region is part of a larger region, Zone One, which spans from New York to Northern Canada. Autocrossers come from all over Zone 1 to compete for two days. Each day is a different high-speed course. This is the best event of the season as the surface is amazing and the courses are quite different than our local courses as they are set up on a decommissioned Army airfield runway. It is loads of fun, competitive and social, as when we are not autocrossing, we all hang out and have a great time together. This is also a Metro points event, so it does count toward the runoff however, it is fun for everyone. Alongside the competition there is also a team competition where all participants are broken up into teams and in addition to trophies being awarded per each class, trophies are also awarded to the team that comes in first.

This will be my 9th year as Zone 1 Autocross Chair, and I can assure you this is an event you will love attending. Please see the flyer on page 26 of this issue for details and links to register and the host hotel. Come out and be part of the Metro NY Team.

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



Track Ramblings FRED PACK - CO-CHIEF INSTRUCTOR



Your car wants to be on track. Your car needs to be on track. You need to be on track.

You have a great car. It's a Porsche which has been designed by the same people whose cars have won Le Mans more than any other make. It has track usage in its DNA. You've probably thought about taking it onto a racetrack. You should do it this season.

The Porsche Club has an excellent program called "High Performance Driver Education" ("HPDE", or just "DE") with you specifically in mind. This is a non-competition activity designed to provide a safe, fun, and educational way to get you proficient and happy about being on the track. I urge you to start by reading the article in the June 2023 PANORAMA co-written by me and Mia Walsh, the PCA National DE chairperson, in which we describe the program.

Of course, you're nervous about taking your lovely Porsche (and yourself) onto an anxiety-provoking activity. (By the way, you don't have to take a Porsche. It can be any car.) The first thing you should know is that a qualified instructor will be sitting in the right seat while you're driving. If you don't have a 2-way communicator (and you should) one will be provided so you and the instructor can talk at all times. Additionally, each day you will attend classroom sessions to teach you the fundamentals before you venture onto the track. Between the classrooms and the instructor, you will be ready for this adventure. I have been instructing for more than 35 years, and have likely had 10 students per year, so I have taught at least 300 people over the years, and I have never had a track incident with a novice driver. The PCA program is excellent - it knows how to make the novice experience safe and fun.


Contrary to what you might think, track driving is a thought game, not a brute macho "Mine's bigger than yours" activity. The actual physical stuff is all familiar to you from your daily life. Steering, braking and accelerating your car – which you do every day without a thought. You are fully ready to try out this experience. As an aside, more women are getting hooked on the activity – and we have female instructors. Our Metro NY PCA region runs DE events throughout the season from April to November. This year's events are at tracks from Lime Rock in Connecticut, New Jersey Motorsports Park, Watkins Glen NY, and Summit Point in West Virginia. The full schedule is on the metronypca. org website.

I will be happy to talk to anyone with questions about the DE program. Contact me at fhp911@gmail.com before July 15. If there is much interest we can have a group Zoom meeting which would be especially useful and fun; otherwise, we can have individual phone calls.

I hope to see you at the track.







Rally for Fun RICH MOOERS - RALLY CHAIR



It's time for the Metro Porsche Vintage Rally. The date is Sunday, July 23rd starting at L.I.E Exit 58 Park and Ride. The closing festivities will take place at Osprey's Dominion Vineyards in Peconic. Bring a picnic lunch and join your fellow rally mates at this beautiful vineyard in our private reserved area. As we enjoy our picnic, wine tasting the bottle of wine

(included with your entry), or enjoying the tasting room, you can enter your car in the impromptu car show on these scenic grounds.

If you would like to simply tour with us to the vineyard, you may join us for a pleasant drive (using the route instructions) along the North Fork of Long Island. You may skip the competition and join us at the vineyard for the picnic and car show. You can register for the Vintage Rally at

Teams participating in a Rally format usually navigate the predetermined course one car at a time. When on a TSD (timed) rally, this allows the timing of your accuracy to maintain the prescribed travel speeds easier. The Vintage Rally is not a timed event. Teams will set their own speed. To find the clues, you may have to stop and then decide how to answer the question. A fair Rally Master (and I always try to be fair) will choose clues that are easy to see. The challenging part should not be finding the clues but answering the questions correctly.

Following the Route Instructions should be simple. I try to provide a definite sign, landmark, or road name at each turning instruction. There is also an approximate mileage for each instruction. Navigators (the person not driving the car) must help the driver execute the instructions. Drivers need to be reminded frequently of what they need to do next. Teams must work together. It is almost impossible to remember what must be done in the next instruction, what clue you are looking for, and drive the car all at the same time. So, relax, slow down and take your time. Most cars and cell phones have a map function or GPS. You are encouraged to use it. It will help you follow the course and verify you are on the correct road.

Helpful Hints:

• Check to see if the instructions are in numerical order. Is there any missing?







Driven for Speed BILL RUDTNER - CHIEF INSTRUCTOR



The PCA Club race weekend at The Glen is historically proceeded by our two-day Driver Education event. This event is nothing short of exciting. Our twoday DE this year was a fairly full event with 182 cars in total. One variable that you never control is the can weather. On our first DE day, the rain was off and on. There may

have been some dry track here and there but for the most part, it was a wet first day. The second day was better weather-wise as the sun was out and the track was dry.

At this event the Aqua group is a separate group session added to the schedule some years ago to keep the racers out of the normal, grouped by experience DE sessions. Each morning the Aqua group, some 68 drivers strong, was given a mandatory meeting to ensure all the race group drivers were fully aware that our event was a Driver Education. This event was not a race practice nor was it a "Test and Tune". DE procedures and rules were in effect and had to be followed.

All passing must be initiated with a "Point-By". If any driver violated these DE rules the possibility of them going home was real.

The Aqua meeting was conducted each morning and seemed to have sunk in. At the end of our event, Terry from Watkins Glen told me that their on-track behavior was the best she'd seen in years.

The greatness about our club is that there are always people willing to volunteer. So here is the big thank you shout out to the major players. As a DE committee member and President, I cannot thank these people enough for stepping up to make our Driver Education program one of the best. Our Track chair Marvin Rosen, our Safety chair Mat Gluckson, our Tech coordinator Bob Schutzenbach, and last but not least our Registrar Adam Fox. We also had invaluable help from Christine Tuite Staibb as as well as Jennifer Clarke, John Aragona, and Vince Rappa. Heading up most of the classroom was our new Co-CI Fred Pack. Thank you all so very much for making this

e event at Watkins Glen fantastic!

Late afternoon on the second day of our event the National PCA Club racing staff started to funnel in. After 5 it's time to get your race head on as race registration and race tech gets set up. Come Friday morning the 13/13 rule is in effect. This weekend for the WGI race we had a fabulous crew with us including our friend Eduardo Galan as well as Otis Holman, Brandon Fiala, and crew leader Brian McGrath. Racing with us under the Rudtner Banner were Billy Riehl, Mike Stenko, Gavin Mitchell, and Todd Roth. There were quite a few other Metro NY members racing as well. I saw Eugene Basha, Jason Nikic, Joe Doria, Eric Liu, Artemus Tsang, Nico Masseroli and, and Richard Glickel just to name a few. On Friday the weather was again "off and on". It was mostly rain with one dry session mid-morning. I can't speak for anyone else but at the track, I am always thinking about EVERYTHING. Car set-up, fuel load per session, tires, tire pressure, wheels torqued? Etc. etc. As we approached qualifying it started to rain again. I thought, come on, if it's going to rain, let it rain. And it did. As I lined up on grid it was raining. Then I thought "shoot, I don't have a rain light". This of course as I watched the race scrutineers walking around the back of each car. A rain light is a bright flashing light set up at the rear of the car which is highly visible and flashes constantly when switched on.

All our other team cars had one. I did not. As I sat on grid Brian came on the radio. "I think we may get a pass for this race". Well, we didn't. Two scrutineers came over to me. "You can't run without a rain light". At first, I was pissed. Without a qualifying lap-time I'd be starting at the back of the pack. Once off grid and back at the motor home, I fired up the laptop and read the latest edition of the club racing rules. There it was, in black and white. "All cars are required to have an FIA approved rain light installed". Well, I cooled down, regained my composure and fell into a weird happiness about my subsequent starting position. Saturday started out a bit better as the sun was out. Our morning warm-up was a good clean session. There were quite a few fellow racers who also had non-working rain lights that were called out the day before so I started in 50th position, not quite last but close to it, for this next race.

The race went off and I had a fabulous start gaining a few positions.

A fellow racer crashed hard in lap one going down "The laces" into turn 6 and the race was immediately under double yellow. This double yellow lasted quite a while as they cleaned up the wreckage. On the restart I again was doing really well, soon looking at a pack of 5 SPBs that I was gaining on. I figured I had these guys. As I entered the "Toe" I came up on our new racer Gavin Mitchell. Unfortunately, midway through the "Toe" (turn 7) Gavin spun the car just in front of me.

It was a miracle there wasn't any contact but I had almost come to a complete stop avoiding Gavin. This put any hopes of catching that pack of 5 SPB cars a dream gone by. I finished 19th in class. 38th overall moving up only 12 spots from my starting spot at number 50.

The next race was another shipwreck to which National will get a nice letter from me. Again, at the start I gained good positions. Not one lap in and the session was Red flagged. We never found out why. But ... What do you do when you see a Red flag? First, look in your mirror, then you bring your car to a safe controlled stop IN VIEW OF A FLAG STATION !!! What don't these racers know? While in Driver Education you learn all the fundamental information and skills that should carry with you throughout your track driving career. This includes racing. In this situation the first four lead cars stopped safely but they did not stop in view of a flag station. When the Red flag was finally taken in a double yellow flag was displayed these first 4 cars did not move as they could not see the flag change. The other cars did which led to a position debacle that National royally screwed up. They black flagged us then let us back out with black flags still showing. We then came into the hot pit again only to sit there for an inordinate amount of time while National tried unsuccessfully to correctly reposition the cars. National placed at least four cars which I had behind me from the start of the race in front of me for the restart. I was so disgusted I just came in. A few others including my friend Todd did the same. The second class race had a similar problem running a very short race. This was truly one of the worst PCA Club races I had experienced since my start in the program back in 1999. These feelings ran true throughout the paddock. What a weekend!

Needless to say, I'll be there in New Jersey to race again. Hopefully, the event will be better run. Fingers crossed. (Photos below and on page 46)
