





DAN FISHKIND - AUTOCROSS CHAIRMAN



So, the season is finally back, over. Looking must say this season was a success. Although attendance was down, compared to previous vears, we have had more Porsches participate then we have had in the past. It was great to watch all the newbies improve and get better from event to event.

As I mentioned in the previous issue, as of the

next reading of the Porsche Post, the 2021 Autocrosser of the Year will have been decided at the runoff. The way the runoff works is the top ten points earners from the whole season all compete against each other in the same car for the title of Autocrosser of the Year. What this does is evens out the playing field and makes the only variable the skill of the driver. Each participant got three runs and the top times were compared against each other and this is how they fared. Third place was taken by Dan Fishkind with the time of 45.875 seconds. This time was only .006 seconds faster that the fourth place time. Mitch Hackett earned the second place spot with a guicker time of 44.869 seconds.1.006 seconds faster than the third place time. And now I present to you Autocrosser of the year with the time of 44.162 seconds John Mingst. This is not John's first trip to the podium as Autocrosses of the Year, but it has been some time since he's been there. Welcome back and congratulations to the winners and all that made it into the runoff.

We then closed out the season with the Season Finale Autocross. Fifty-five drivers attended the event to drive a course designed by Don Hochheiser. The course was awesome, everybody had a great time and the weather was beautiful for a November day. Here are the results. In S2 Manny G came in first place with a time of 57.440 seconds. S3, with two drivers found Steven G in first place with a time of 51.486 seconds. S4, also with two drivers, found Edward D occupying the first place spot with a time of 53.819 seconds. Ken H took the first place spot in P5 with a time of 53.637 seconds. Yours truly came in first place in P6 with a time by 52.242 seconds and Henry H took the win in P7 with a time of 52.294 seconds Henry is new to autocross and is doing a great job. P8 found Ben O in first place with a time of 51.297 seconds and

I2 with three drivers found Tom P in second place with a time of 54.956 seconds and David C in first with a time 51.899 seconds. I3 was taken by Yanni K with a time of 48.956 seconds. M1 class with the father son team found son Noah V in first place with a time of 50.015 seconds. Sorry Dad!

Fourteen driver X1 was dominated by Richard W with a time of 50.082 seconds. Graham M came in a close second with a time of 50.732 seconds while his son Mieles M took the third place spot with a time of 51.230 seconds. X2 with eleven drivers found Anthony H in first place with a time of 51.901 seconds an Arvin S in second place with a time of 52.019 seconds Barrington H came in a close third with a time of 52.363 secoFnds. X3 was taken by Jose A with a time of 48.099 seconds. This was fast enough to earn Jose the fastest time of the day. Congratulations Jose. John M came in a close second with a time of 50.009 seconds and Jonathan W took the third place spot with a time of 50.913 seconds.

So, the season is finally over, and you can now give your cars a rest until March when we start up again. Some of you will take the path of improving/modifying/upgrading your cars which is always fun to do over the winter months. It's so nice to start the season with a refreshed car or even just a new set of tires. Please look at the 2022 Autocross Schedule and the Autocross Seminar/ Mini School Flyer in this issue of the Post. We start early March with the Seminar/Mini School on March 5th and the first Autocross on March 6. Plan accordingly. You can also find information on our website and Facebook group page. If you're not a member of our Facebook group, please search for the Metro New York Region PCA Official Facebook group and sign up. Most importantly I want to wish everyone a happy and healthy New Year and a great winter. I'll see you again when the season starts up in March. Stay well.

Formed in 1976, L.I. Against Domestic Violence is focused on prevention and assistance for victims of sexual and/ or domestic violence and abuse. Their holistic approach addresses all aspects of domestic violence victims' lives, regardless of race, creed, gender, sexual orientation, or socioeconomic background. Services include:

- 24 Hour Hotline: Answers over 4,000 calls annually, provides crisis intervention, safety planning, and support in over 120 languages through its language line. (Hotline Phone: 631-666-8833).
- Emergency Shelter: Safe Harbor for victims and their children who are fleeing their homes to escape abusers.
- Advocacy: Help with access to law enforcement and courts. LIADV place an advocate in all seven Suffolk County police precincts. Advocates provide information about options; assist with a safety plan, and link clients with LIADV court advocacy, shelter services and other community resources. Court advocates are available to accompany victims in courts to provide assistance in obtaining orders of protection.
- Counseling: Licensed counselors help survivors (Adults,

children and teens) of abusive relationships reduce the trauma of past events. Child and Teen counseling is for those who witnessed or experience domestic violence and may be done individually and/or in groups. The aim is to help overcome negative feelings and/or obstacles in their lives so they can find healthy ways to express themselves.

- Legal Services: Assist clients with representation in family court for issues with child custody, visitation, and support orders. For eligible clients, legal representation may be pro bono.
- Education and Prevention: Youth education and community education programs. For over 30 years, LIADV have provided age specific education for youths and young adults on Long Island to help reduce incidents of violence that may occur during dating or in family life. There are elementary school programs that focus on healthy relationships, anti-bullying and anti-violent behavior and peaceful resolutions. High School programs focus on gender roles and healthy dating. Community Education involves In-Service training to civic organizations, health care workers, and law enforcement on prevention and intervention strategies. In addition, LIADV provide training to schoolteachers and administrators to recognize early warning signs that children may be affected by domestic violence.
- Vocational Training and Financial Literacy: Help survivors learn the necessary skills to gain economic independence so they can live a life free from abuse.
- LIADV recently added a service to provide shelter to pets of an abused person to facilitate getting the abused victim out of a hostile home environment.

As with past years, the Club will be allocating portions of our event fees to the charity account. Representatives from LIADV have agreed to attend some of our events where appropriate to meet members and explain their non-profit's mission and work. Our first major event for 2022 will be the 66th Snowflake Rally on February 6. LIADV has marked their calendar and will join us during the registration meeting/breakfast at the Hauppauge Palace Diner to introduce their charity.



Eastern Region Update

Hi folks. This time of year there isn't much to report on in terms of new events on the island. Porsches are snuggled in the garage hopefully, and the appropriate maintenance has been done. If not, at least change your engine oil as the car sits during the winter.

Or, if you still drive during the winter as I do, perform

a good exterior cleaning of the finish, and wax or coat the car with your preferred sealant, wax, ceramic, etc. If parking in a garage, put plastic sheeting under the car to act as a vapor barrier. Concrete will exude moisture from the bottom up unless a vapor barrier has been used beneath the concrete. If not, plastic sheeting under the parked car will help keep it drier over the winter. This is especially true for older cars that didn't benefit from current rust preventative techniques. Cover the car too so dust and contaminants don't attach to your finish. Don't randomly start the car unless you intend to drive 20 minutes or more to burn off any moisture in the exhaust system. A battery tender is a cheap way to keep the battery up to snuff while the car sits. Over-inflate the tires

so they don't flat-spot from sitting in cold temps.

We finished the year with two great events for members to enjoy. We had a wonderful tour of the Wetanson collection of fine automobiles in November, followed by another gathering at the Nettescheim museum in December. Both were "over the top" events, as described by attendees.

Remember to always check the Metro website and Facebook page regularly for updates, as some of the events I and others host, are done on relatively short notice. The restrictions for Covid constantly change, and we adapt accordingly to keep our members safe.

The coming year should be great for Metro members in terms of activities. So many people who have not attended past events, but finally do, almost always say they had a great time, met great people, and come back for more. I will continue to do "Where's Metro Wednesday" during the season, and pop-up events on weekends as weather permits.

Track Ramblings

RESULTS OF THE CHALLENGE

Before I get to the results of the challenge from last month, I want to issue an alert:

My next two monthly columns will be aimed at Metro members who are interested in getting their car on the racetrack but have not yet done so.

You own a Porsche; you owe it to yourself to drive it on track at a Metro's Driver Education (DE) event. It can be a life-changing experience, tons of fun and a great opportunity to meet wonderful people.

DE events are non-competition. As a novice you will have a certified instructor in your car with you at all times.

These two columns will explain what you have to know before getting on track. (It turns out there is a lot you have to know.)

The challenge that I issued to myself in last month's column was to try to not over-brake before turns and to not coast at all before braking, and I committed that I would report honestly this month how successful I was at Metro's November season-ending event at the Summit Point Main track.


The most important thing to remember is what Yoda told Luke: "No! Try not. Do, or do not. There is no try." So I should have worded the sentence above as, "The challenge that I issued to myself in last month's column was to not over-brake before turns." After all, "There is no try."

I'll start by reminding people how important "purposeful practice" is when trying to improve. The concept is that we can only improve in specific increments. We can't "just do better." We can work on "not coasting before braking," and then after that's been cemented in place we can move on to "not over-braking before turns".

Consequently, I focused on those specific two goals. Summit Point has only two serious braking zones – going into Turns 1 and 10. The others need only a small amount

of speed reduction. I found it pretty easy to stop coasting going into Turn 1. I would remind myself each lap while heading down the main straightaway, "DO NOT COAST. KEEP YOUR FOOT PLANTED ON THE GAS PEDAL UNTIL YOU WANT TO BRAKE," and to my delighted surprise, it worked! It was harder for me to do this on Turns 3 and 10 for some reason, but I did make progress. As for over-braking - meaning braking more than is necessary for the turn to be taken safely -- the first step is to determine where your Start of Braking Point should be. Most tracks have 'feet before the turn' signs at turns requiring serious braking, and Summit Point has these signs as you approach Turn 1, but nowhere else. So, as you approach Turn 1 it is easy for you to consistently apply the brakes at a given spot. At other turns, such as 4 and 10 you have to locate and remember other markers, such as a specific tree or irregularity in the track surface, etc. You can use these markers and signs as a means to apply the brakes a bit later each lap until you've reached a point where you feel you might enter the turn too fast and be unable to safely keep the car on the pavement. Think about these points while waiting for the start of the 2022 track season. And remember, No! Try not. Do, or do not. There is no try.

Be On Time

JEFF GOLDBERG - RALLY CHAIR



Happy New Year. I hope everyone and your families are healthy and doing well.

Registration is now open for "Snowflake Rally 66" scheduled for February 6, 2022.

The Snowflake Rally is a Time-Speed-Distance (TSD) rally. This means that the goal of the competitors is to reach a specific location

at an exact time. Of course the teams will not know this location until they pass it. This location is called a checkpoint. Points are given for every second the team is either early or late. Like golf the lowest score wins.

Each team must consist of a Driver and a Navigator. The driver has the easier job of driving safely while looking for clues. The navigator's job is designed for someone who likes to multitask. The navigator needs to read the route instructions to the driver while for looking clues, in addition to calculating the time it will take to reach the next checkpoint and making sure the driver in on course.

If the navigator has done three or less TSD rallies I suggest you enjoy the day by following the "Seat of Pants" method. This means; follow the directions exactly as written and forget about calculations. As the speed changes in the instructions, tell your driver to speed up or slow down accordingly. Your team will enjoy the drive and may have more fun than the teams with calculators. I must confess that I threw my clipboard and calculator into the back of the car in frustration on more than one

occasion while learning how to rally. A passenger in the backseat is frowned upon for safety reasons unless they are wearing a full face helmet. \odot

For those brave enough to challenge the Rally Master there are a number of very good sources on the web to explain how to calculate TSD rallies. Simply Google "how to calculate a TSD rally". Space and copyright laws prohibit us from providing them.

Remember to bring along the follow items:

- Tape to affix your car number to the passenger side of the car. Checkpoint workers need to be able to identify rally cars. Car numbers will be provided in your packets.
- A simple calculator. The only calculations required are simple arithmetic: adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing.
- · Pens or pencils.
- · Clipboard with paper is recommended.
- A highlighter for making notes on the General Instructions. Both the driver and navigator should read the General Instructions before leaving. Check in early so your team has plenty of time to prepare.

Additional details will be provided to all registered participants via email as you register.







Happy New Year, fellow Metro NY Region PCA'ers!

This is the season in which our Sim Racing gear. high hits have social driving Sim every events in Tuesday and Thursday at 8PM, rain, snow, or shine. regardless temperature. Our Winter 2021-22 Sim Racing Season began

December 14th, 2021 and will run until early March 2022. When you received this issue we had completed three of the twelve races. You could still join us and be competitive since everyone's three worst results will be dropped from calculation of the championship points. That means races at Sonoma, VIR, and Watkins Glen have been run already, but the Nurburgring (24 Hour Course, with Nordschleife), Red Bull Ring, Silverstone, Daytona Road Course, Mount Panorama, Oulton Park, Road Atlanta, Circuit Gilles Villeneuve, and Zandvoort remain. Our races will continue to be thoroughly unaffected by actions of a Race Director, since we don't have one! If you got a Sim rig or upgrades for the holidays and want to run with other Porschephiles whose sports cars are hibernating, now is the time.

At the spectacularly good and enjoyable Metro Holiday Party on December 5th, awards were given out for the best novice and most enthusiastic participant in a variety of driving activities the club provides. Sim Racing was included, and the trophies were real rather than virtual. Our Season Two champion, Adam Girling, added to his winnings by being named Sim Racing Enthusiast of 2021. Neil Erbesh, who has participated in almost every DE, practice, and race session we've had in Sim, was named Sim Racing Novice of 2021. Both deserve hearty congratulations and thanks; both are superb and everimproving drivers in Sim and on the track and make the club a more enjoyable entity.

iRacing gave us all a very nice gift of sorts late in 2021. A newly rescanned version of the track we all know and love at Watkins Glen (WGI) was introduced, and the Porsche Experience Center (PEC) track at Hockenheim was also provided.

The WGI rescan is superb. Those of us who drive the course in real life have always enjoyed the Sim version, and it is now accurate to the current condition of the track. It looks and feels exactly right. The curbing is red and yellow and far more forgiving, the very much improved surface laid down five or six years ago is now faithfully replicated in Sim, and the paved runoff areas exist virtually as well as in Upstate New York. Go Bowling and Corning Glass hoardings are everywhere to be seen, enhancing the verisimilitude or sense of déjà vu, depending on your preference. Even the marshals look a bit more lifelike.

The PEC is a very interesting addition to the circuits in iRacing. It has multiple configurations, all of them extremely tight and narrow, with unusual and challenging cambers. It is, in a sense, a very sophisticated Autocross track, suitable for time trials, training, and setup. In some senses such a track is long overdue since the closest equivalent so far has been the enormous skid pad built into the system. The PEC is a good deal more fun while at least equally instructive. It also seems to underscore iRacing and Porsche's mutual commitment to each other and Sim racing.

May 2022 be a fun and rewarding drive for you and yours, and may any incidents be simulated!







Hello to all in Metro from Metro's southern outpost down here in Delaware! After almost 50 years why should or would we change from Metro?




